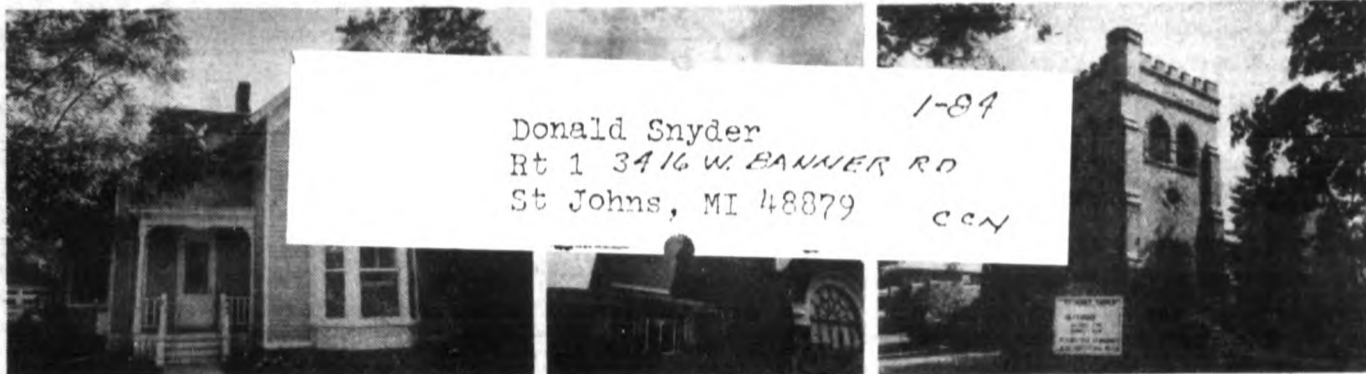

## Friends assist cancer victim

Fowler resident Bruce Rowell, 14, has some friends indeed.

They've organized a benefit at Fowler Conservation Club from 1 to 5 p.m. Sunday, Sept. 12 to help Bruce and his family pay medical bills resulting from the Fowler High School freshman's continuing cancer treatment.

"It started out as just a neighborhood thing, and now it's grown into an entire town thing," said Jonie Schmitt. Mrs. Schmitt, who lives next door to the Rowells along with her husband, Don, and six children, including Bruce Schmitt, a classmate of Rowell's, began organizing the event because it just seemed to be the neighborly thing to do, she said.

"We just felt there was a need and we felt that this would be a nice thing to do for the family," she said. "But this isn't just our doing. This is the whole neighborhood and the entire town's doing."

All proceeds from the affair will go to the Rowell family, she said. "Bruce has had two surgeries and a lot of tests. He had a brain tumor and he had

## Taxicab driver accused of rape

A St. Johns man who operates the only taxicab service in Clinton County was arrested by the St. Johns Police Department Sept. 3 and charged with three counts of sexual misconduct, police said.

David Leonard Husted, 38, of 709 N. Mead in St. Johns, appeared in Clinton County District Court Sept. 3 and was freed on \$6,000 bond and personal recognizance, the court said. Husted was charged with one count of first degree criminal sexual conduct (CSC), one count of third degree CSC and one count of gross indecency, police said.

Husted operates the Community Cab Company in St. Johns, and until he quit driving a short time ago, he was the company's only driver.

According to the complaint which was filed in the case, the first degree CSC charge stems from an incident which allegedly occurred in Aug. of 1978. The complaint stated that a girl, age 13 to 16, was coerced into having sexual relations with Husted. The complaint also said that the girl suffered physical injury in the assault.

The third degree CSC charge involved the same girl, and allegedly took place between Sept. and Nov. of 1981. In this case, the complaint stated, Husted had sexual intercourse with the girl, but no force was used.

In the gross indecency incident, Husted was allegedly involved with a 17-year-old male, the complaint said. That incident supposedly occurred between Nov. 1980 and Jan. 1981, the complaint said.

The names of the two complainants are not being released because both are minors, according to district court.

The preliminary hearing date for all three charges was set for Nov. 15 at 2 p.m., the court said.

The maximum sentence for the first degree CSC charge is life imprisonment, according to Det. John Richmond of the Clinton County Detective Bureau. "And the CSC third degree charge could have a maximum of 15 years," Richmond said. "The gross indecency one is also a felony, and that carries a five-year sentence."

## Hynes' job is labor of love

Lyle Hynes often refers to himself in the second person, as in, "They had Lyle build the choir loft, too." Maybe that's because he has more energy than just one person can contain. Harnessed to a generator, his power could light-up all of Detroit and still have enough spark left over to play the "Star Spangled Banner" on an electric organ.

For the last 15 years, though, Lyle's hustle has been harnessed mainly to the tiny Lowe United Methodist Church on Lowe Road northwest of St. Johns. The results are impressive.

Since Lyle inherited the church handyman's job from Lloyd Youngs, he has rewired, paneled, wallpapered, hung ceilings, built cabinets, installed appliances, refinished counters, built tables and painted. And that's just in the basement.

He also still farms 80 acres down the road, but since his retirement from Motor Wheel after 35 years, he says he's had more "spare" time to devote to the 82-year-old church.

"People always asked me, 'Where do you find the time to do all that when you've got two jobs?' Well, I find the time," he says. It's hard to look anywhere in the church and not lay eyes on something Lyle has "found the time" to do. He's put in a new pulpit, installed new lights, restored railings and refinished woodwork, installed windows, planted trees and hauled gravel. Oh yes, don't forget the choir loft.

"They decided to get Lyle to build a choir loft, and I just happened to have some materials lying around. But it's solid, I'll tell you. It has to be, a lot of people get up there every Sunday. But it's heavy, too. Those young fellows really snort when they have to carry it out once or twice a year," he said.

Lyle also "just happened to have materials lying around" for the church's new pulpit. It's a stage he originally built for East Essex Elementary School. "I built a stage and stored it in my barn. We'd put it

up for Christmas each year so the kids could have a play," he said. So, when the school had a new stage installed, Lyle moved his right across the road from the school to the church.

Indeed, after taking a look at his handiwork, it seems the only thing Lyle hasn't done yet is rebuild the church from the ground up. Now he's done that too.

It's his latest project, and the one he says has attracted most comment: a miniature replica of the entire church, exact down to the last stained-glass window.

"Mary MacGregor (the church's Sunday school teacher) told me, 'When I was a little girl I used to put my Sunday school money in a little church,' and asked me if I would build her one for the kids. Well, I told her if I was going to build a church, I'd like to build a scale model of our church itself," he explained.

Three months later, the project was finished. Constructed partly of actual pieces of the real

church discarded during remodeling, it looks just like the real thing — except for a little coin slot on the back for donations and a flip-top roof to get the money out. And it sits on a custom-built table made, naturally, by Lyle.

Lyle got a little assistance from his wife, Marbeth, a church member for 35 years. "She wanted the stained glass window to be just right, so she came down and drew them, then painted them in for me," he said.

Asked just how many hours he put into the project, he replied cheerfully, "Oh my word, I never keep track of hours. I just love to do this kind of thing. I love to build things."

Later, as he pointed out new siding and landscaping around the real church, he interrupted his breathlessly-enthusiastic description of past and future projects just long enough to explain why he is so proud of his church.

"It's a labor of love," he said. "There's nothing I wouldn't do for this congregation."

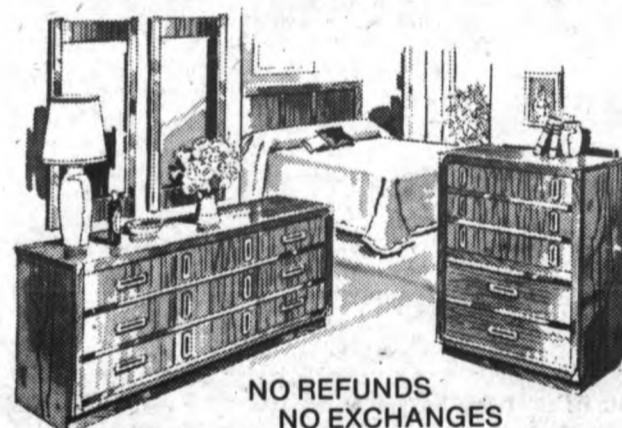

# Tighter zoning won't affect Granger, Nelson says

Tougher language in Clinton County's zoning code will probably not slow renewal of a special use permit for Granger Land Development, Zoning Administrator Jack Nelson says.

Granger's special use permit for operation of a landfill in Watertown Township in southern Clinton County expires Sept. 11, and Granger will be in Clinton County Circuit Court Friday, Sept. 10 to ask for permission to keep operating while their request for a new permit is considered by the county's planning commission, Nelson said.

Granger has not requested a permit renewal yet, Nelson said, but will "probably not wait" for resolution of litigation before proceeding to renew their permit. Granger has been sued by the People's Action League (PAL) in an attempt to block expansion of the landfill for use as a hazardous waste disposal site.

At their monthly meeting Tuesday, Aug. 31, Clinton County Commissioners approved a change in the county's zoning code which affects special use permits. The change was suggested by a committee asked to consider regulating gravel pits and mining operations in the county and replaces "unenforceable and in some cases unconstitutional" sections of the old code, Nelson said.

The old language says special use permits should be granted only to projects which are "designed, constructed, operated and maintained in a manner harmonious with the character of adjacent property and the surrounding use."

"The old terms were very general and could be argued either way, Nelson said. "Harmonious, for example, is a very hard term for the planning commission to nail down."

The old code also said projects "shall not be hazardous to adjacent property, or involve uses, activities,

materials or equipment which will be detrimental to the health, safety or welfare of persons or property."

The new language is more definite, Nelson said. It says: "The proposed use, activities, processes, materials, equipment and conditions of operation will not be detrimental to the public welfare, persons or pro-

## Clinton touts new plan

Large investors may be able to earn higher interest with less risk, thanks to a new program launched by Clinton Bank and Trust, reports say.

According to Bank President Brandon White, the program allows investors with a \$20,000 minimum balance to earn interest rates almost as high as money market rates. The bank has launched promotional efforts to gain a share of protected short term investment account monies, reports said.

perty by reason of excessive noise, fumes, dust, glare, traffic or objectionable odors."

It further states permits should not be granted to projects which, "have a substantial adverse impact on the natural resources of the county," including, "prime farmland ... wetlands, lakes, rivers, streams, county drains, major forests, water recharge areas and major mineral deposits."

"From an odor standpoint, there is not an extreme odor problem there, in my opinion, because they cap it every day," Nelson said of Granger's landfill.


Also, he said, those opposed to permit renewal would have to prove the landfill is an environmental hazard. PAL has tried, claiming nearby streams and groundwater has been contaminated, but state tests have so far failed to substantiate their claims.

Granger's request for expansion was okayed by the planning commission and the county board, but was overturned by the zoning appeals board following protests by PAL. Granger has challenged the decision in court in another lawsuit which is still being argued before circuit Judge Randy Tahvonen.

Asked if the new language would give PAL more ammunition in an attempt to get Granger's permits denied, Nelson said: "I don't foresee that it would." Granger's next special use permit could be written with provisions included to fit their case, he said.

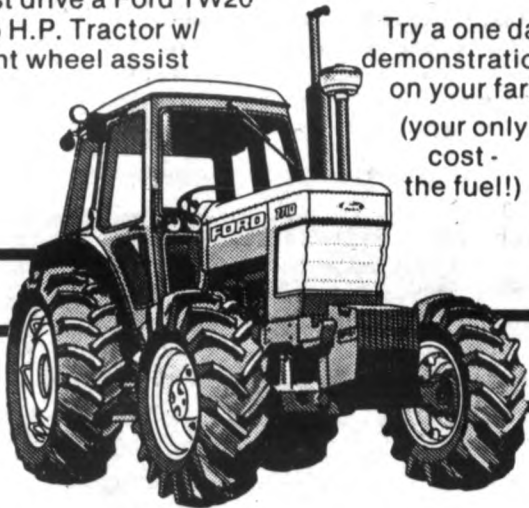

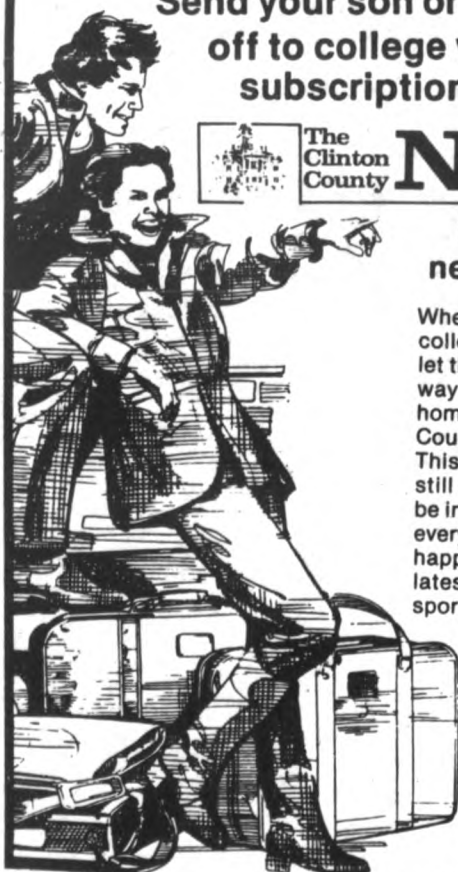

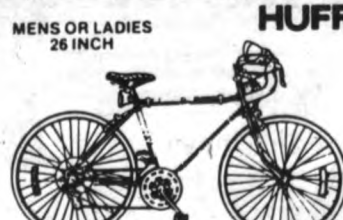

## Car lot closed

Carson City's only car dealership closed its doors Friday, Sept. 3, and one owner says stand-offish local residents are one of the reasons his business failed in less than a year.

"To people in this area, we're outsiders. That's one of the reasons we're closing," Bill Klopff said.

Klopff said high interest rates and a poor economy also helped force Frontier Chevrolet out of business. But the business could have survived, he said, if people would have been more friendly.

"Everything we did we researched and we cannot find anything we did wrong. People just don't seem to have any money. I don't believe the town ever really accepted us. We didn't move here right away, thank God, or we'd be in real trouble."

Klopff, of St. Charles, was in the tool business before opening the Carson City dealership. He said the closing will mean the loss of six jobs to local residents — including two mechanics, two bodymen and a cleanup person — plus the loss of his and his partner Jim Fischer's jobs.

"That's a total of eight people out of a job," he said.

During 11 months in business, the dealership at 10428 Carson City Rd. sold 123 used cars and 57 new Chevrolets, he said, a total of 170 cars.

"There's just a lack of business in this area and cars aren't selling," he said.

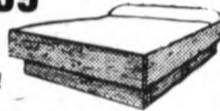

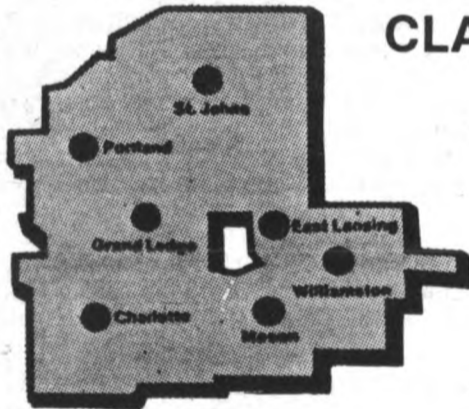

# New code opens door to narrower mobile homes

Zoning regulations affecting mobile homes and gravel pits occupied county commissioners during their Aug. 31 meeting.

Commissioners approved changes in the county's zoning code which will loosen regulations for placement of double-wide mobile homes.

They voted to reduce the minimum width of mobile homes in residential neighborhoods from 24 to 20 feet and to allow mobile homes to be built to standards other than those applied to conventional homes.

The width change allows construction of a popular solar design, and most double-wide mobile homes are less than 24 feet wide and do not conform to the ordinance as written, Zoning Administrator Jack Nelson told commissioners. "All of the double-wide mobile homes we have measured are 23 feet, six inches," he said.

Once restricted in residential areas by county and local zoning codes, mobile homes are now permitted, thanks to a Supreme Court decision which said mobile homes are now comparable to conventional homes in appearance and construction. The decision struck down zoning codes which discriminate against mobile homes.

Nelson said the county has received only about a half-dozen mobile home permit requests since the ruling and resulting

change in the county ordinance, and none have been for residential areas. "I thought we'd see an extreme amount of activity, but we have not," he said. "We'll probably see more though if we ever get the interest rates down. I think 90 percent of the people are just priced out of the market."

The changes have not gone far enough to liberalize zoning for mobile homes as far as some commissioners are concerned, however.

"We're amending the zoning ordinance to allow one person to build an underground solar home and on the other hand we consistently refuse to allow hundreds of people to live in a (single-wide) mobile home except in a mobile home park or under medical hardship," Richard DePond said. DePond was joined by Glen Webster, Walter Nobis and Harold Martin in opposition to the proposal, but the measure was passed, 7-4.

A measure to set standards for all gravel extraction operations in the county was defeated, however. Nelson called the proposal a "relatively meagre effort to control" the 100 gravel pits which are not regulated by special use permits.

Only 32 gravel pits in the county have special use permits, and the remainder should have standards for their operations, he argued.

"But this could put a lot of the pits out of operation that are just a one man operation," Webster replied. DePond, a member of the planning commission which

recommended the measure, said the proposal was designed "to pour a little oil on the water" and limit public complaints about some gravel operations. "The other 100 do just as they please," he said of non-permitted gravel pits.

Complaints have centered around truck

speed, dust and noise, he said. But the county is powerless to regulate speed, and other provisions of the proposal would be practically unenforceable, Nelson admitted. "There's no question it would be difficult to enforce," he said.

The measure was defeated 8-3.

## Hoop squads ready for '82

Fall might mean touchdowns and kickoffs to many sports enthusiasts, but to the female basketball players in Clinton County, it's a time for layups and free throws.

Several of the girls basketball teams in the county have already begun their 1982 seasons, which will culminate with the state tournament in December. Here's a look at what to expect from the six squads in the county this season:

**ST. JOHNS:** When you start talking about the Redwings, the discussion has to begin with Sue Pearsall. The 5-10 senior has been a starter on coach Beth Swears' team since her freshman year, and last year she was All-State, All-League, All-County, All-You Name It.

"A lot of colleges have already started looking at Sue," Swears said. "Hopefully, she'll be able to hold us all together this year. She's our captain, and we'll be depending on a lot from her."

Besides Pearsall, who will be playing a guard spot, since that's what she'll play in college, there are three other seniors who are back from last year. Lisa Maz-zolini, Sandy Peck and Lisa Smith didn't start last season, but they will most likely see a great deal of action this year, Swears said.

Juniors who will be playing include Janine Scott, who has been hampered by a knee problem, Susie Casler and Kim Heyer.

Swears is also counting on a sophomore, 5-10 Pam Sehlke, and a freshman, 5-11, 200-pound Brenda Eiseler, to give the Redwings some added size. "Brenda is a big player, but she's really quick, too," Swears said. "She gets down the court faster than soe of my guards."

The strongest part of the St. Johns squad in 1982, Swears thinks, will be that quickness. "We are relatively quick, even for our size," she said. "We should be able to run a lot of fast breaks this year."

But the thing the Redwings need is more scoring punch. "It would be nice to find some other shooters, besides Sue," Swears said. "But we have a lot of athletic ability, so we should be better than we were last year."

**DEWITT:** Coach Frank Deak was counting heavily on 5-7 guard Tami Noyce to lead the Panthers this season. But after an injury put Noyce on crutches for at least three weeks, Deak's enthusiasm wore off a little bit.

"It was looking pretty promising for us until Tami got hurt," Deak said. "She's the catalyst on our team. We really need her quickness."

But until Noyce returns to the lineup, Deak will be depending on six other returnees to carry DeWitt. Sophomore Sheila Milner was an All-League selection as a freshman last year, and the 5-9 forward was also the team's leading rebounder.

Forward Lana Becher (5-9) is "very aggressive," according to Deak, and that should help the Panthers. Traci Davis (5-11) returns at center, joining forward Lisa Richards, guard Kris Leonard and Kris Brown, who was injured all of last year.

Others who should contribute include Debbie Birgy and Diane Lotre, both juniors.

**FOWLER:** The Eagles finished at 14-6 last year and only graduated one starter, so one would think that there is cause for enthusiasm around Fowler these days.

There is, but not too much enthusiasm, according to coach Dennis Smith. That's because three players — Julie Pung, Darce Schmitt and Michelle Snyder — are all sidelined with injuries.

"Even without them, we should be OK," Smith said. "But we're going to have a real problem with depth. We won't have a deep bench at all."

Leading the healthy starters is 5-5 guard Becky Klein, an All-County selection last year. Lana Hafner, a 5-10 center, is Fowler's other returning starter.

"They're our one-two punch," Smith said. "We're really going to be counting on them this year."

Senior forward Charlene Feldpausch (5-7), junior guard Peggy Thelen (5-7) and sophomore forward Judy George (5-5) should round out the starting unit.

Coming off the bench for Fowler will be juniors Vicky Feldpausch and Patty Weibér.

"We're going to be a very disciplined ballclub this year," Smith said. "We'll run the fast break, but it will be disciplined. And our defense should be very fine, also. That will no doubt be our strongest suit."

**PEWAMO-WESTPHALIA:** With nine letterwinners returning from last year's 17-4 squad, hopes are indeed high around P-W these days.

"I'm definitely excited about the season," coach Carol Bogard said. "We have a lot of leadership on this team."

Leading the way for the Pirates will be senior co-

and DeWitt's Sheila Milner (right) look on. All four will be back to play for their teams this year. (Photo by David Olds)

captains Shawn Thelen and Ann Pung. Thelen, a 5-6 guard, was an honorable mention All-League choice last year. Pung, a 6-0 center, also saw a great deal of playing time last season.

Junior Patty Theis (5-11) reaped numerous honors for her play last season, among them a spot on the Detroit News' fifth-team All-State squad.

Seniors Donna Lenneman (5-11), Lisa Schafer (5-8), Lisa Simon (5-7) and Linda Smith (5-7) return to Bogard's squad, while juniors Jackie Bauer (5-10) and Patty Smith (5-4) will also see a great deal of action this year.

"Our height is a definite advantage," Bogard said. "It should be a good year."

It will be hard to top last season's performance, in which P-W made it all the way to the state quarterfinals — the best performance by any basketball team from P-W — before being eliminated.

**BATH:** The Bees got a jump on the rest of the county teams this season by opening their season Sept. 2 at the Waverly Tip-Off Tournament. Bath took third place in the four-team field, losing to Waverly, 54-25, but beating Howell, 30-22.

"We're going to need to get some more scoring this season," coach Patty Terres said. "Our defense is really, really good, but we need to score more points."

The starting five for Bath will consist of Therese Nugent (5-9), Wendy Foote (5-5), Camie Hagy (5-6), Betsy Marshall (5-9) and Glenna Morrill.

Also seeing a great deal of playing time will be Laurie Luoama (a 5-10 freshman), Janet Ashbridge (5-6) and Mary Risch (5-7.)

"We're really going to be inexperienced," Terres said. "But we are a lot quicker than we've been in the

past. And attitude-wise, this is one of the best teams I've ever had."

Terres is hoping her team's attitude will help it improve on last season's 10-9 record, which saw the Bees make the district finals for the first time in the school's history.

**OVID-ELSIE:** Ask Ovid-Elsie coach Mary Hudecek who her starting five players will be and she'll only give you three names.

"We have three starters back, but after that, I don't know who will start," Hudecek said. "We have about five players who are really even."

The three starters who are back from last year are Shawn Barclay (a 5-5 guard), Lisa Clark (5-8 center) and sophomore Mary Perrien, a 5-6 guard who was an honorable mention All-State selection last year.

After that, it's pretty much anybody's guess who will start for the Marauders. One likely candidate, Hudecek said, is sophomore Terry Woodbury, a 5-4 guard with a good outside shot.

Others who will be vying for a spot include seniors Gayle McAllister and Vicki Foreback, juniors Kelly McCue (who played quite a bit last year), Kristi Hudecek, Connie Hettinger, Leann Perrien, Ellen Jeffreys and Trudy Kaufman and sophomores Lori Ross and Paula Coleman.

Ovid-Elsie will not be a tall team in 1982, but that doesn't bother the coach. "We've never had height in the past," Hudecek said, "and it's never bothered us before."

She will be counting on the team's quickness and defense to carry it in 1982. "We're a lot quicker this year than we were last year," Hudecek said. "That should help."

### COMMISSION ORDER BOBCAT HARVEST REGULATIONS

The Natural Resources Commission at its meeting on June 12, 1982, under the authority of Secs. 1, 2, and 3, of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, Secs. 38 and 39a, Chapter IV, and Sec. 1, Chapter V, Act 286, P.A. 1929, as amended, established rules for the taking of bobcats, during winter and spring.

**1. Seasons:**

- Zone 1 - Hunting and trapping, October 25 of one year through February 28 of the following year.
- Zone 2 - Hunting only, January 1 through February.
- Zone 3 - Closed to hunting and trapping.

**2. Shooting Hours:**

7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. local time

**3. Areas:**

- Zone 1 - The Upper Peninsula, except Bois Blanc Island and Drummond Island, which will be under Zone 2 regulations.
- Zone 2 - Cheboygan, Emmett, Presque Isle, Oscoda, Otsego, Montmorency, Alcona, and Alpena counties; also Bois Blanc Island and Drummond Island.

**4. Registration:**

Any person killing a bobcat shall present the whole animal at a Department of Natural Resources district office or other designated field office within 72 hours of the kill. There, a confirming seal shall be attached and information obtained from the licensee as to date, place, and manner of kill and other pertinent information deemed appropriate. No taxidermist or fur buyer shall accept, possess, or process in any fashion, a bobcat or bobcat pelt without the confirming seal attached. Sealing of pelts will qualify the fur for foreign export under regulations enforced by the Endangered Species Scientific Authority. Registration hours will be during regular working hours or where offices are open for some other purpose after hours.

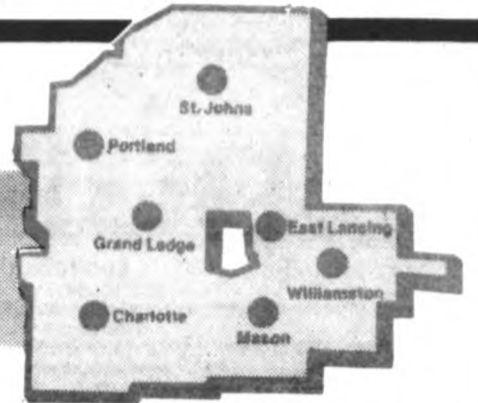

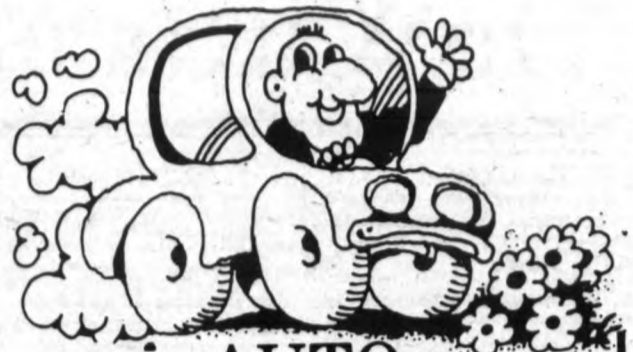
