## Open ditch a danger?

An open drainage ditch which fills with water following heavy rains poses a threat to local residents' safety, St. Johns City Commissioner Donald Roesner said at a meeting of the commission Monday night, Jan. 11.

Roesner called the ditch near a trailer park and the intersection of Gibbs and Morton streets "scary," and suggested sending "a very strong memo to the (county) drain commissioner."

"I'd like to see something done on it," the vice-mayor said. "It's deep enough to present a serious problem, I'm told."

But commissioner Paul Maples said if the city is prepared to contact the Clinton County Drain Commissioner to have the drain problem corrected, it had also better be prepared to pay for repairs.

"If the commission wants a letter written, we are petitioning for repairs and if so, we must pay," Maples said. "That can be a very expensive proposition."

City Manager Randy Humphrey was concerned with the city's liability if an unwary resident or child fell into the ditch and drowned. He pointed out the ditch is mostly located on private property, so anyone near it would be trespassing.

"Unfortunately, youngsters don't understand trespassing," Roesner replied.

"But it is a defense. You have to put that on the scales," Humphrey said. He compared the ditch to other city waste water holding ponds, but Roesner pointed out the ponds are fenced.

It was agreed the county should be contacted in an effort to obtain cost figures for repair or improvement of the drainage ditch, and commissioners approved Humphrey's suggestion to have city staffers look over the problem and submit suggestions.

In other commission business: Mayor John Aerhart proclaimed Jan. 17-23 Jaycee Week; commissioners approved a plan to get quotes on cost of a building utilization study and examine funding for improving usage of city property; approval was given to increase city assessments under the new Truth in Assessment law (see related story).

## City assessor tells public

# Hike, like taxes, is inevitable

Local tax assessments will go up for St. Johns residents when notices are sent in mid-February, but don't panic — the increase would have come sooner or later anyway.

Tax bills will be hiked by a factor of 1.5964 for residential property owners and 1.35 for commercial and industrial properties, according to City Assessor Diane Edwards. That means a home valued at \$60,000 will be reassessed at a total cash value of \$95,600, and the State Equalized Value (SEV) upon which taxes are levied will be raised from \$30,000 to \$47,800, Mrs. Edwards said. (SEVs are 50 percent of assessed true cash value in real estate markets. The average tax increase in Clinton County is expected to be about 10.5 percent this year, Mrs. Edwards said.)

But while the jump may be substantial, it is also inevitable, Mrs. Edwards said. If not included in city assessment reports, the increase would have been added

in by the state; in fact, the increase was determined using factors supplied by the state.

In the past five years, the city has assessed property using figures from a 1976 reappraisal. Since the figures do not reflect home value increases resulting from a real estate boom in the late '70s, the state was forced to raise assessments each year.

But with recent passage of the Truth in Assessment bill, local units of government must either conform to state assessments or roll back millages to reflect the actual amount of tax revenues they would collect using their own lower figures. As a result, if St. Johns did not raise the tax assessment in anticipation of state-mandated increases, the city would stand to lose \$198,705 in tax revenues, Mrs. Edwards said.

A reassessment study completed by Mrs. Edwards a year ago would have brought the city's assessments up to state requirements and eliminated a need for a state-applied factor by increasing taxes on individual properties. But city commission members voted to stick with the state factor which spreads the increase among all property owners.

"I think we should opt to spread the factor to protect the fiscal integrity of the city," St. Johns Mayor John Aehart said Monday night. Commissioners agreed unanimously and the measure was approved.

Also during their first meeting of 1982 Monday night, Jan. 11, commissioners said they have no objection to approving a packaged beer and wine sales license for a new Shop Rite store being built at the city's new mall, although a packaged liquor license requested by Goff Development Co., Inc., owners of Shop Rite, was not available since the city's quota of such licenses is full.

## Cropsey asks: is man from slime or divine?

"The news media this past week has really been cranking up my phone. Here's a bill that hasn't been introduced yet and hasn't even been debated yet, but it's getting more attention than any bill I've worked on."

The bill referred to by 88th District State Representative Alan Cropsey, R-DeWitt, still has not been drafted. But because it deals with a topic of increasing controversy — teaching creationism in public schools — Cropsey's as yet unborn legislation regarding the origin of man is making headlines.

The 29-year-old lawyer and former bible school teacher says he hopes to have his law ready for consideration by the House sometime in late spring or early summer. Co-sponsor of the bill will be Senator Ed Fredricks, R-Holland, Cropsey said.

An Arkansas law which mandated creationism be taught along with evolution in public schools was struck down Jan. 5 by a federal judge, who found the law violates the constitutional separation of church and state. In his ruling, the judge said the law requiring the teaching of creation science was "an effort to introduce the biblical version of creation into the school system."

"That's totally erroneous," Cropsey said. "Nowhere in that law was the bible even mentioned."

Regardless of the federal court ruling, however, Cropsey said his bill will be different.

"Instead of mandating that if one is taught the other must be taught, we're leaning toward academic freedom. Many science teachers may want to teach (creationism) but they feel so much pressure not to."

There is presently no law to prevent teachers from introducing creationist theories along with units on evolution, but a law is needed to guarantee them the right, Cropsey said. "There are some teachers who would be teaching it now, but it is controversial to present another side to the story."

Cropsey said he will be watching the efforts of other creationist advocates in the next few months. He hopes to model his legislation after an Iowa law, he said, and will monitor developments in Louisiana, where a law "almost identical" to the one in Arkansas is likely to be the focus of the next battle between creationist forces and their opponents.

"Louisiana's creationist law has a better chance of passing because the attorney general will give it a much better shot than the attorney general in Arkansas," Cropsey predicted. He echoed complaints voiced by many creationists that the Arkansas law was as much a victim of heel-dragging on the part of the state attorney general asked to defend it as it was of opponents' efforts to overturn it.

Cropsey, who said his own faith is "Independent Bible ... closer to Baptist than anything else," pointed out

creationism is nothing new, although the recent attention it has received may make it seem so. His mentor on creationist legislation, Dr. John Moore, has been teaching creationism to natural science students at Michigan State University for years, he said, and although it received little attention, the issue was raised during the last Presidential election.

"I think it's ironic that when Ronald Reagan was running for President, he brought it out that both models should be taught. Most people thought this was something that just came up lately."

Although optimistic about his planned new bill, Cropsey has had little success passing laws so far in his

three years as a legislator. Most have gone the way of his first attempt.

"The very first thing I did in my first term was introduce a bill to freeze legislative pay. It got shot down royally, but I'm glad I did," he recalls.

Although he admits support for his latest plans could be coming from "certain elements in the community who support" restoring prayer in classrooms, Cropsey does not want his bill tied to religion. "I don't see creation as being any more religious than evolution," he said.

Instead, he stresses freedom of choice in an academic setting. Though unwilling to say just how far such academic freedom should extend, Cropsey hopes it can be stretched to support another version of man's beginning — besides Darwin's — in Michigan's public school science classes.

"When you're dealing with the origin of life, that is an area that affects a person's whole outlook on life. Instead of giving one viewpoint in a science class, both explanations should be given.

"Certainly, sooner or later, a person has to make a decision on his own and they should have a chance to hear both sides."

## Legislating freedom can be contradiction of terms

Phrases like "academic freedom" have a tendency to generate a conditioned response. Along with "freedom of religion," "freedom of speech," and other "freedoms," the phrase conjures up images of quill-wielding patriots inking their names on the Declaration of Independence. One's immediate reaction when confronted with questions regarding liberty is reflexively positive.

This response has not gone unnoticed by skilled advocates of various laws which often may actually abridge liberty and limit our personal freedom. Shards of our Constitution and Bill of Rights have been cast into weapons and brandished by opponents and supporters of any number of issues, from gun control to the Equal Rights Amendment, from abortion to the draft.

The latest group to tug on opposite ends of Democracy's documents are those for and against teaching creationism in public schools. The loudest battle on this score since the famous "Scopes Monkey Trial" recently took place in Arkansas and ended when a federal judge overturned a state law mandating that creationist classes be taught

wherever evolution is taught.

Locally, 88th District State Representative Alan Cropsey, R-DeWitt, has joined the fray by promising to introduce his own version of a similar bill next spring. Cropsey and other creationist advocates want students to get the "other side" of the story of man's origin; along with science classes dealing with the theory of natural selection and man's progress from protozoa to person, they want public schools to include lessons including what they call "evidence" of man's creation by a superior being or force.

But unlike the framers of the Arkansas law, Cropsey says he will not attempt to force any schools or teachers to include creationism in their lesson plans. Instead, he says his bill will guarantee the right to introduce creationist theories in the classroom, thereby freeing many from pressures not to introduce such controversial subjects in public classrooms.

His justification, he says, is academic freedom.

We agree with the ruling in the Arkansas case that creationism is religion, not science,

and has no place in the classroom; an attempt to introduce similar bills in light of such a ruling can only be a fruitless waste of taxpayers money.

But there are other flaws in Representative Cropsey's proposal.

Further regulating or legislating the academic environment will not foster true academic freedom: a freedom which can only thrive in the unfettered minds of inquiring students.

Furthermore, we suspect Cropsey and others who presently find defense of academic freedom so comfortable would soon retreat from their position if similar justification were given on behalf of legislation less to their liking. Why not academic freedom to teach atomic bomb assembly?; why not freedom to introduce the philosophies of Rev. Moon or Charles Manson? As sure as one man's freedom is another's license, these and other topics can be justified under the guise of "academic freedom."

In most cases, Representative Cropsey, legislating freedom is a contradiction in terms.

## Through rain, snow and sleet, Mishler delivered

When Keith Mishler began working at the St. Johns post office as a substitute clerk back in March of 1949, he had no idea what the next 32 years would hold in store. In fact, becoming postmaster was the last thing on his mind.

When he first came to St. Johns, Mishler was an inspector at Sealed Power Company. However, it wasn't long before he and several other employees decided they wanted to form a union. As the idea of a union grew, Mishler said, he knew "my days were numbered."

"I was still working at the shop, but I was also working parttime at the post office nights and weekends," he said. "Who would have ever thought I'd end up in management?"

Mishler took the first Civil Service test offered after World War II and became the first non-politically appointed postmaster in St. Johns after he and three others were hired at the post office to replace wartime help.

"That always bothered me a little, that I was taking a job that someone else had," he said. "After all, they were good enough to work during the war, so why not after the war?"

Living through 10 years of new postal regulations was one of the most challenging things Mishler had to deal with as postmaster, he said.

"The job has been both interesting and rewarding," he said prior to his Jan. 8 retirement.

And becoming postmaster was also a natural type of progression, he said. As a substitute clerk and later as a fulltime clerk, he learned all the jobs on the "floor." He became assistant postmaster in 1964. Then, following the postmaster's retirement, Mishler took over as the officer in charge for 15 months before assuming the top spot.

"As long as I was the assistant I might as well have been postmaster," he said. "That's why I went to Chicago to interview for the job."

Mishler said he has liked being a small town postmaster. He says in a small town there is the ability to not only become close to customers, but also to employees.

"In a small office you can also do more favors for people, like holding their mail for short periods of time," he said. "In a larger city this wouldn't happen as regularly."

The retired postmaster can only think of one time when the mail was delayed due to unusual circumstances. It seems that one Christmas a clerk was taking what appeared to be empty crates to the basement. However, when they went to use the crates again the following Christmas, a postcard was discovered stuck between two of the crates. "We delivered the postcard a year later, but it was still pretty embarrassing."

There used to be a time when all unaddressed mail got

delivered in St. Johns. Now, however, if the first clerk who gets a piece of mail doesn't know who it belongs to, the item goes back to the sender.

Mishler has gone through all the cost increases in stamps from three cents when he first started to 20 cents, but says, "The cost of sending mail is still the best buy in the industrialized world. Even the people coming to the window don't seem to complain too much."

But if stamp price hikes have hurt postal patrons, things aren't easy for post offices either, he said.

"You have an hourly budget to work with," he explained. "A few years ago I could just call Chicago and ask for an extra 100 hours. If you are over in hours now, you hadn't better be."

Mishler says it's been very hard to see people standing in line and have to wait for service, but each

employee has a certain number of hours during the day for various duties, so when it was their turn to sort mail, that's all they could do.

"One thing I won't miss is the paper work and reports," he added with a smile.

The post office also offers other services to residents in addition to mail delivery, Mishler was quick to mention. Those services include alien registration, migratory bird stamps for the Department of Interior, and 18-year-old registration for the draft. 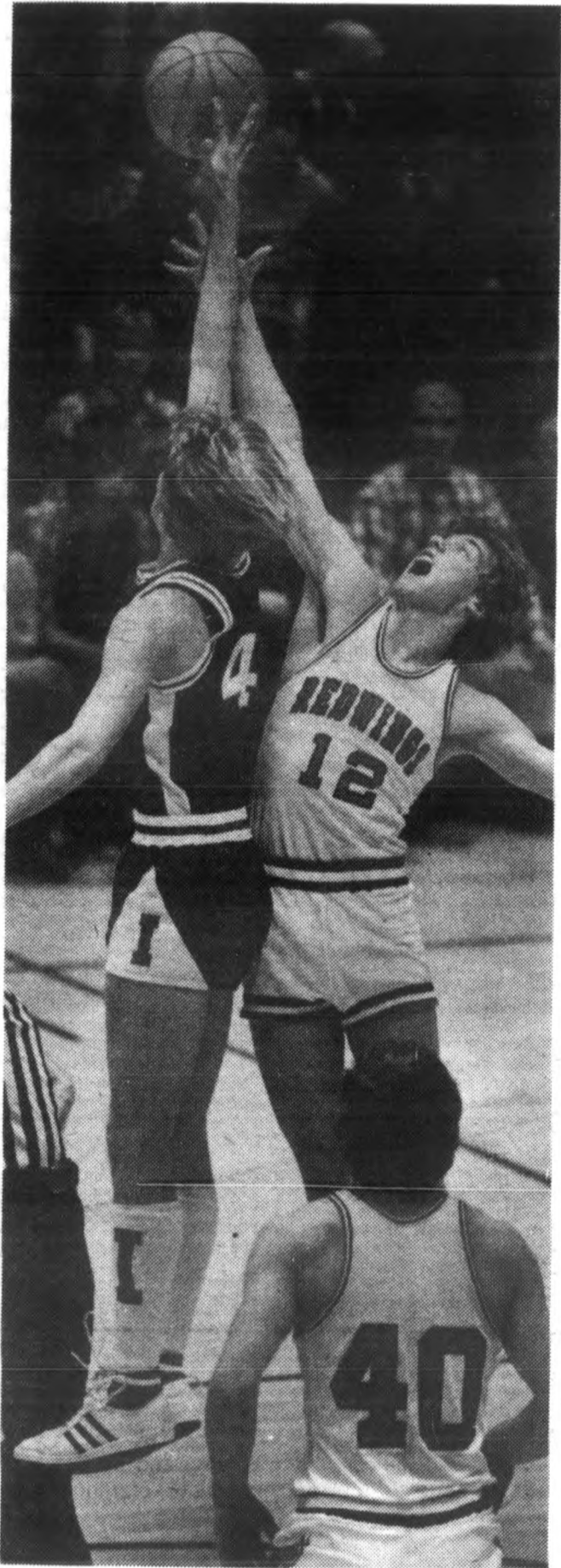
## Fowler wins in overtime
