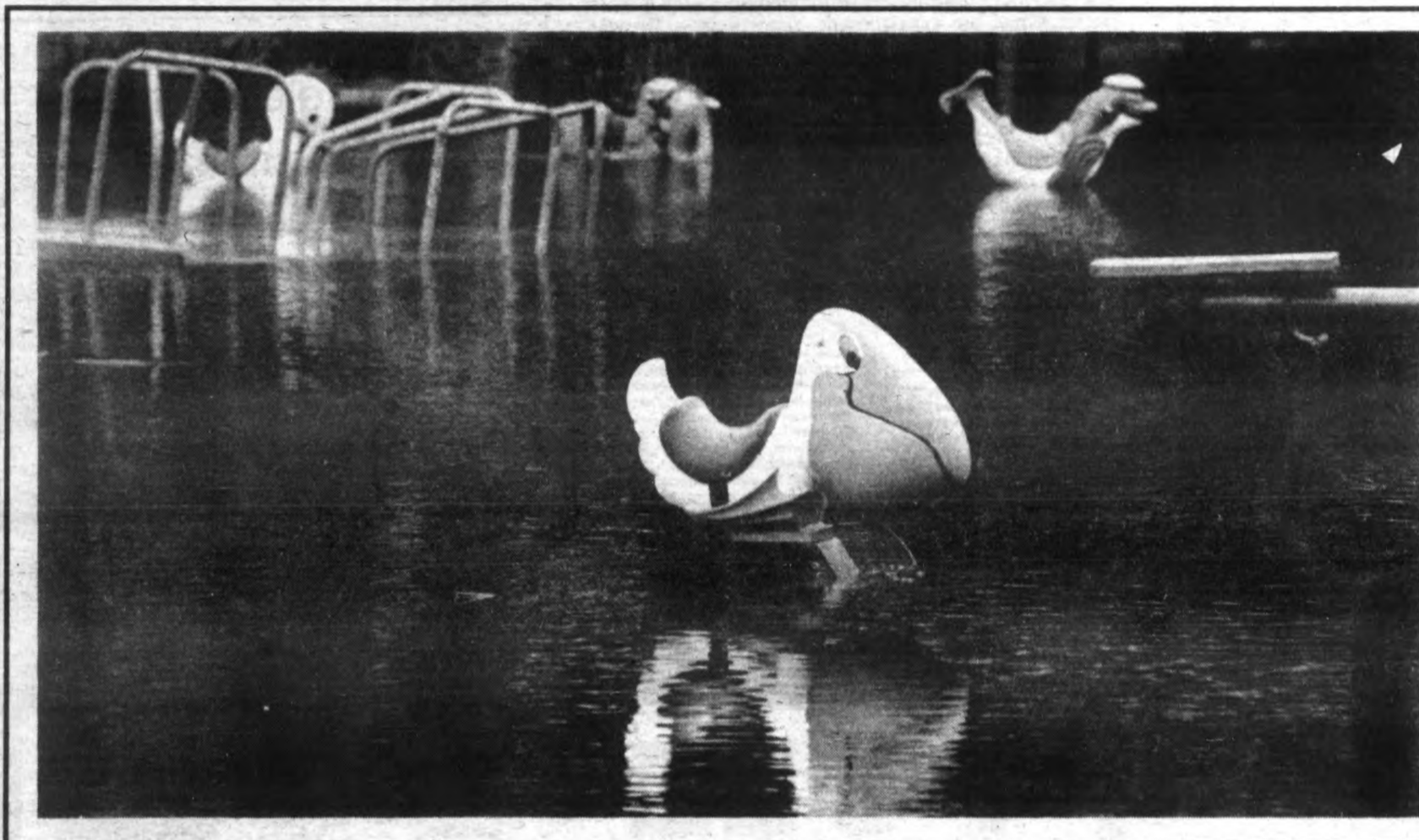

## Ice-jammed drains leave reminders of fall floods

# City readies for future floods as thaw waters recede

With last fall's flood still fresh in the memory of many and spring thaws spilling over river banks throughout the area, St. Johns City Commissioners took steps Monday night to avert future disasters.

City officials told commissioners standing water has again accumulated behind Bee's Chevrolet & Oldsmobile, the site of flood damage late last September. The latest back-up may have resulted from ice-jams in drainage systems, commissioners were told, but it was decided to have Clinton County's Drain Commissioner look into the problem and make recommendations for improvements, along with cost estimates.

If flooding is not stopped, local residents might at least be better prepared, thanks to another decision by commissioners during their second March meeting.

St. Johns will apply for inclusion in the Federal Flood Insurance Program and local residents will eventually have a chance to purchase flood insurance, commissioners agreed. First, representatives of the federal program must attempt to find a flood plain in the city, but with no rivers in St. Johns, that is unlikely, a city spokesperson admitted.

Flood insurance will be available regardless, however, though the coverage can be costly and is not comprehensive, Zoning Administrator Diane Edwards said.

In other action commissioners agreed:

- To tighten language in proposed changes in their Site Plan Review Ordinance. If the changes are approved, most non-residential developments will be forced to submit to review by the city planning department and city commission. Presently, no review is required except in the case of zoning variances.

- To further define projects subject to review, City Attorney Paul Maples and Mrs. Edwards suggested adding criteria to the original proposal which required review for any project with four or more parking spaces. Added were: sites of two or more acres, buildings of 2,500 square feet or more and structures to

- be developed on land which abuts an existing residential district. A public hearing on the ordinance was set for April 12.

- To approve plans for parades, fireworks and other activities sponsored by the St. Johns Rotary Club during their annual July Fourth celebration.

- To permit St. Johns Lutheran Church to hang balloons and other decorations throughout the city in celebration of Easter.

- To continue monitoring work on the Oddfellows Building at 323 N. Clinton intended to remove hazards created by decay of the structure.

## County considers joining legal effort

# Suit may force state to share the wealth

Redistribution of wealth is the aim of a lawsuit against the state being considered by Clinton Intermediate School District (CISD) and soon to be discussed at local school boards throughout the county.

About 27 school officials representing all of the districts in the county except DeWitt and Ovid-Elsie met at the CISD offices Monday night, March 22 to hear about the lawsuit from Jackson County school officials.

"They're confident they have a good case," CISD Superintendent Larry Schwartzkopf said. "The constitution says all are entitled to an equal opportunity and it (education) is not equal. You can see the disparity and inequality in state funding to education."

When a school district's total property values are high enough, the district no longer qualifies under the state's aid to education formula. Wealthy communities with high property values become "out-of-formula" districts, and get much more revenue per-pupil than poorer districts with the same amount of operating millage, Schwartzkopf explained.

"Waverly's school district has 30.5 operating mills, but is out of formula and receives about \$2,800 per student," he said. "At Bath, the operating millage is 31.87, but they only receive \$1,971 per student."

The result is unfair to students, he said.

"You get two districts with the same millage, the

same effort from taxpayers, but district A gets \$1,000 more per student than B because B is a poorer district.

"What we're looking at is a redistribution of wealth to make sure some districts don't have to say 'We can't have some programs this year because we're out of cash.'"

The gap between rich and poor districts is growing, Schwartzkopf said. This year, 170 Michigan school districts are out of formula; next year, the number will climb to 184, he said. Meanwhile, it is estimated that as many as 55 districts will be in the red at the end of the present school year and many may go bankrupt, the CISD superintendent warned.

"I feel there should be some basic programs and opportunities offered to students no matter how rich the district is that they live in," he said.

Many who attended the meeting to receive handouts and look over charts and graphs provided by the Jackson group may have left with the same impression, Schwartzkopf said.

"I think most left with a feeling that there is some disparity in the distribution of wealth throughout Michigan. Maybe a lawsuit should be pursued to see if a better way (of distributing state aid) can be found."

Those who attended the meeting will be reporting back to their school boards and individual boards must decide if they wish to participate in the legal proceedings being advocated by Jackson school officials, he said.

# Flushing woman killed in crash

A Flushing woman was killed and her husband critically injured in an accident in the southern part of Bath Township Friday afternoon, March 19, according to Bath Township Police reports.

Janice D. Anderson, 46, of 1262 McKinley Rd., Flushing, was pronounced dead at the scene following a crash which pinned her in the vehicle she had been driving near 1:20 p.m., reports said.

Her husband, William C. Andrews, 48, of the same address, was taken to Sparrow Hospital, where he was reported in serious condition in the hospital's intensive care unit Monday.

The crash occurred on I-69 about three-tenths of a mile west of Marsh Road, reports said. Mrs. Andrews apparently pulled out onto the highway from a gas station driveway on the north side of the highway, intending to cross the median and head east on I-69 when her vehicle was struck by a west-bound cement block-carrying truck driven by William Edward Brock, 51, of 2035 Miller Rd., Lansing, reports said.

Witnesses at the scene of the crash said Mrs. Anderson may not have seen the cement truck owned by Standard Block of Lansing, which was in the process of passing a semi truck when it struck her vehicle.

Brock suffered minor injuries, reports said.

In other action by Clinton County law enforcement agencies, Clinton County Sheriff Tony Hufnagle said efforts to locate the body of 20-year-old Richard D. Lobsinger of St. Johns have been curtailed.

Lobsinger has been reported missing and is believed to have drowned when his canoe capsized in the swollen Hayworth Creek near Maple Rapids Saturday, March 13.

Hufnagle said cooperation and contributions of time from volunteers county-wide have been "fantastic," but said the search was to be scaled down following a fruitless foot search of river banks by 65 volunteers and nine members of the sheriff's posse Tuesday.

"We've had fantastic cooperation and hospitality by the Maple Rapids area community, and I'm sure his family and friends will continue searching until the body is found," the sheriff said.

A Perrinton resident was arrested by the Clinton County Detective Bureau Wednesday, March 17 and

charged with conspiracy to commit larceny from a building, St. Johns Police reported.

Barry Melvin Robinson, 42, of 2156 W. Taft, was the latest to be charged in a series of recent arrests resulting from a lengthy investigation into thefts of ingots from St. Johns' Federal Mogul Plant, reports said.

Robinson waived his right to a preliminary exam in 65th District Court and was remanded to Clinton County Circuit Court for arraignment, reports said. He was released on a \$2,000 personal recognizance bond.

Also arrested by St. Johns Police was Daniel J. Fedewa, 30, of 12272 W. M-21, Fowler. Fedewa was charged with two counts for allegedly cashing checks on a closed bank account, reports said. Arrested March 19, Fedewa demanded an exam and was released on a \$2,000 personal recognizance bond, reports said.

## Former resident accepts ultimate canoe challenge

Verlen Kruger and Steve Landick don't seem that unusual — they're just making a one-in-a-million dream come true.

"It's the realization of a dream," Kuger says. "I've been working toward this trip all my life."

Since May, 1980, the former St. Johns resident and his son-in-law have paddled 17,260 miles of a 28,000-mile canoe trek throughout North America. They call it "The Ultimate Canoe Challenge."

Last November they stowed their paddles and came home, out of cash. But with bankrolls replenished, Kruger, a 60-year-old father of nine, and Landick, his former plumbing partner, recently set out again.

Along the way, they'll be breaking some records: their own. Already the pair has canoed farther than anyone in the record-books, they say. But to continue putting miles on their paddles required hard work during their recent three-month furlough.

Kuger and Landick spent their time back in northwest Lansing looking for sponsors and patching up their "Loons," the home-built kayak-canoes they've called home for the last 17 months.

Landick was scheduled to depart for Alaska March 7, and Kuger said he would be following by the end of the month. Meanwhile, to finance their trip the two have offered travelogue films and advised in the manufacture of replica Loons by a leading canoe-maker.

Kuger says a National Geographic feature story and even possibly a movie about their odyssey are in the making. They also plan to write a book about their adventures.

But for now, thousands of miles of open water lie ahead. At the end of the trail of rivers, lakes and

streams lies Lansing, the final destination in their circuitous route. They hope to circle back via the Pacific Coast, arriving home in November, 1983.

How will they celebrate the end of their trip? "We'll see what we're going to do when we get there," Kuger said.

## Local farmers convicted

Four Clinton County farmers were fined after pleading guilty to charges filed by the Michigan Department of Agriculture, according to reports.

Leon Miller of St. Johns and Van Zee Bros. of Eagle were each fined \$45 and charged \$5 in costs by District Judge Fredrick Lewis in St. Johns Feb. 19 for antibiotics in milk, reports said.

Robert Daggett of Elsie Daggett was convicted on a

similar charge before the same judge March 1 and fined \$95 and charged \$5 in costs, reports said.

Ron Henning of DeWitt was ordered to pay \$50 in costs and given no fine by Probate Judge Marvin Robertson in St. Johns March 3 after pleading guilty to having added water in milk, reports said.

## DAVE SAYS

### Sports gives writer complex

It's easy for a sports writer to convince himself that he's the most unpopular guy in town.

I've had the opportunity to cover both sports and local government. I seldom receive complaints about my coverage of city councils, school boards or county commissions. Sports, however, is a different matter. I'm definitely convinced that people around here take their sports much more seriously than they take their government.

There never seems to be a day that goes by that someone in Clinton County doesn't call me to complain about the lack of coverage that I'm giving a certain sport or a certain team.

"You print way too much stuff about basketball," a recent caller complained. "You guys never write anything about swimming. I bet you were a basketball player in high school and don't know anything about swimming."

We get calls from coaches, parents and players who are all fighting for more coverage of their favorite sport. Often the calls are very friendly and we appreciate the input from the reader. Other times, however, they take on a less friendly tone and the callers terminate the conversation by threatening to cancel their subscription if

more coverage isn't given their sport.

I wish I could say we have a logical, scientific and fair method of determining exactly what sports should be covered and how often. Newspapers, unfortunately, don't work that way. We're continually faced with such handicaps as lack of space, deadlines and not enough reporters and photographers to cover each event. We try to carefully plan what we're going to be covering weeks in advance and then religiously stick to our schedule. Unfortunately, something always seems to get in the way.

Last winter, for example, we had planned to give extensive coverage to the Clinton County Volleyball Tournament. On the night before the tournament, however, the worst ice storm of the winter hit and the tournament had to be cancelled. We never were able to arrange to give volleyball the space we had hoped.

In another instance, I asked photographer David Olds to try to get some pictures of St. Johns star Jeff Casler. It was right after Casler had scored 46 points and we were thinking about running his photo on the front page. Just as the ice hit the volleyball tournament, the flu hit Jeff and we had to find another front-page photo.

I hate to admit it, but very often the sports

Johns, Steve Spitzley of Pewamo-Westphalia and Randy Smith of DeWitt are three of the best. They're always available to talk and somehow they're always able to find me if they have something to report. Some of the other coaches do not make themselves as readily available and stories about their teams do not seem to get written as frequently.

I will admit, though, that non-accessible coaches, winter weather and the flu are not completely responsible for any omission that the sports fan might find on our sports pages. Sometimes I mess up and neglect to cover something that probably should be covered. For those omissions I apologize and hope it doesn't happen too often in the future.

Winter sports are over and baseball, softball, track and tennis will soon be starting. I know that I'll be getting a lot of calls complaining that we're not giving enough coverage to a specific sport. And once again I'll probably convince myself that I am the most unpopular guy in town.

## St. Johns man champion at home and at school

Most Americans will long remember the winter of 1982 as being one of the worst of the century. Randy Smith was so busy he hardly noticed.

Smith, wrestling coach at DeWitt High School, spent the cold-weather months seeing the birth of his first child, producing two state wrestling champions, leading his Panther grapplers to fourth place in the Class C state championships and receiving honors as Michigan's Wrestling Coach of the Year.

"It wasn't too bad a winter," he admits.

Success is nothing new to Smith. In the nine years that he has been head coach at DeWitt, his teams ranked in the top ten seven times and 10 of his wrestlers have gone on to capture state titles.

Randy is not the only Smith who is currently achieving plaudits on the athletic field. His wife Betsy is a highly-respected softball coach at Fowler High School.

"She's very talented," Smith says. "She's taken her team to regional competition in the past, and last year was the only Class D team invited to the State Journal Classic. In addition, she's probably my number-one supporter."

Robin Jean, the Smiths' infant daughter, is also getting an early introduction to athletics. She's been a spectator at almost all of DeWitt's wrestling meets and will likely be in the stands when her mother's softball team takes the field this spring.

While the Smiths teach and coach at different corners of the county, they live halfway in between in St. Johns.

"We really like the area, lots of our friends are in St. Johns and it's convenient for both of us," he said.

"If I had to do it all over again, I wouldn't change anything ... I've always wanted to coach at a school like DeWitt and live in an area like this. I've been very fortunate."

A Flint native, Smith was captain of his high school wrestling team and a league champion at 120 pounds. He later wrestled at Albion College and was the first wrestler from that school ever to participate in national competition.

Unlike many coaches who take pride in compiling glittering dual-meet records, Smith considers the early part of the season only an opportunity to prepare for

later championship competition. This past season his team produced an unimpressive 3-4 record in dual meets.

"The state meet is it for us," he says. "We lose a lot of matches in December ... I really believe you can get kids up only a few times during a season. We especially try to peak for the state meet."

Smith attributes much of his program's success to the help he receives from his former wrestlers.

"We always seem to have a former state champ in the room wrestling with us," he explains. "I think that's why our kids are not awed by the state meet. They're used to wrestling against state champs."

Smith is modest about the honors he received during his nine years at DeWitt.

"Sometimes you wonder if you're really that good or

if it's just that you have good kids," he says. "I tend to think I got them (awards) because my kids are good."

When Smith isn't in the wrestling room, he's in the classroom at DeWitt Middle School. A math teacher, he has established a reputation for originality in his approach to education. His Adventure in Math course, including units on income-tax preparation, computer programming and stocks and bonds, is especially popular with eighth graders.

It's athletics, however, that tends to dominate the life of Betsy and Randy Smith. When they're not coaching, they're likely to be out on the golf course, in the swimming pool or watching an athletic event on TV.

"Everything we do seems to be involved with recreation or athletics," he admits. "And now Robin Jean is one of my hobbies."

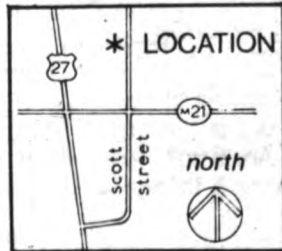

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE V, ZONING AND PLANNING, CHAPTER 51 KNOWN AS THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS.  
THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS ORDAINS:

**Section 1.** That the Zoning Ordinance of the City of St. Johns, and the Zoning Map of the City of St. Johns forming a part thereof, shall be amended in the following respects: that the premises hereinafter described shall be rezoned from its present R-3, High Density Residential to "O", Office classification.

**Section 2.** That the description of the affected zoning reclassification is as follows:

A part of the South 1/2 of Section 16, T7N, R2W, City of St. Johns, Clinton County, Michigan, described as follows: Commencing at the SE corner of said Section 16, thence South 89°23'44" West 1165.30 feet along the South Section Line of said Section 16; thence North 01°20'26" West 698.30 feet to the point of beginning; thence North 01°20'26" West 151.90 feet; thence North 43°12'17" East 305.35 feet; thence North 03°32'28" East 225.00 feet; thence North 43°39'15" East 174.34 feet; thence South 28°09'29" East 81.00 feet; thence South 27°36'47" East 729.24 feet; thence South 89°23'44" West 715.99 feet to the point of beginning. The above described lands contain 6.350 acres of land, more or less, and are subject to all easements and restrictions of record.

The Planning Commission will consider the following amendments to the Clinton County Zoning Ordinance, OR-1-78, as amended.

CASE ZC-7-82 Text Amendment - Flood Hazard Areas

The following amendments are necessitated since Watertown Charter Township is going from the emergency to the regular phase of the Federal Flood Insurance Program. The proposed changes are as follows:

1. Amending Art. 5, Sec. 5.10.2(A) by deleting the first paragraph and replacing it with the following new paragraph.

A. The flood hazard area zone shall overlay existing zoning districts delineated on the official Clinton County Zoning Map. The boundaries of the flood hazard area zone shall coincide with the boundaries of the areas indicated as within the limits of the 100 year flood in the report entitled "The Flood Insurance Study County of Clinton, Michigan" dated November 17, 1981 with accompanying Flood Insurance Rate Maps and Flood Boundary and Floodway Maps. Within the flood hazard area zone a regulatory floodway shall be designated. The boundaries of the regulatory floodway shall coincide with the floodway boundaries indicated on the Flood Boundary and Floodway Map. The study and accompanying maps are adopted by reference, appended, and declared to be a part of this ordinance. The term flood hazard area as used in this ordinance shall mean the flood hazard area zone and the term floodway shall mean the designated regulatory floodway.

2. Amending Art. 5, Sec. 5.10.6 by adding the following new subsection (C).

C. Mobile homes within zones A1-30 on the Flood Insurance Rate Map shall be located in accord with the following standards:

1. all mobile homes shall be placed on stands or lots which are elevated on compacted fill or on pilings so that the lowest floor of the mobile home will be at or above the base flood level
2. adequate surface drainage away from all structures and access for a mobile home hauler shall be provided
3. in the instance of elevation on pilings, lots shall be large enough to permit steps, piling foundations shall be placed in stable soil no more than 10 feet apart, and reinforcement shall be provided for piers more than 6 feet above ground level.

4. in mobile home parks and mobile home subdivisions which exist at the time this subsection is adopted, where repair, reconstruction or improvement of streets, utilities and pads equals or exceeds 50% of the value of the streets, utilities and pads before the repair, the standards in subparagraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this subsection shall be complied with.

3. Amending Art. 5, Sec. 5.10.7 which had been reserved for future amendments by adding a new section entitled FLOODWAY PROTECTION STANDARDS, as follows:

A. New construction, substantial improvements and all other development, including fill, shall be prohibited within zones numbered A1-30 on the FIRM, except where it is demonstrated to the zoning administrator that the cumulative effect of the proposed development when combined with all other existing and anticipated development will not harmfully increase the water surface elevation of a base flood. In determining whether a harmful increase will occur, compliance with P.A. 245 of 1929, as amended by PA 167 of 1968, shall be required, provided that the allowable increase shall not exceed one foot. The provisions of this section shall not apply within the regulatory floodway. The provisions of subsection (B) shall be applied to land situated within the regulatory floodway.

B. All development occurring within the regulatory floodway shall comply with the following standards:

a. encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements and other development shall be prohibited. Exception to this prohibition shall only be made upon certification by a registered professional engineer or the DNR that the development proposed will not result in any increases in flood levels during a base flood discharge, and compliance with Act 167, P.A. of 1968.

b. the placement of mobile homes shall be prohibited except in mobile home parks and subdivisions which exist at the time this article is adopted.

c. development which is permitted in the regulatory floodway shall meet the requirements of sections 5.10.3 to 5.10.6.

The uses of land permitted in an underlying zoning district shall not be construed as being permitted within the regulatory floodway, except upon compliance with the provisions on this section.

Case ZC-8-82 Text Amendment - Mobile Home Site Development Standards

Amending Art. 6, Sec. 6.11.3(G) Rule 944 (R 125.1944) SETBACKS FROM PROPERTY LINES, by changing the fifty (50) feet property line setback to thirty (30) feet.

## VILLAGE OF FOWLER

### Summary of Fowler Village Council Meeting Minutes

A roll call vote was taken. Goerge yes, Thelen yes, Spicer yes, Koenigsnecht yes, Simon yes. Motion carried.

The Clerk was authorized to sign an intergovernmental agreement between the Village of Fowler and the Clinton County Department of Development Control regarding the enforcement of the State Construction Code. This agreement is necessary for the Village's participation in the National Flood Insurance Program.

A plot plan for construction of a family room, as submitted by Luke Koenigsnecht, was approved.

The Council voted to pay membership dues of \$25 to the Michigan Alliance of Small Communities.

Meeting adjourned 9:10 P.M. The next regular meeting of the Fowler Village Council will be held on Monday, April 12, 1982, at 7:00 P.M.

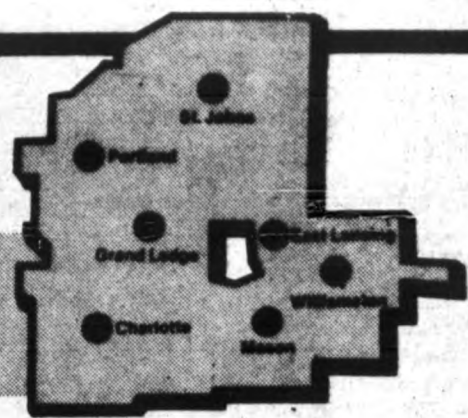

**NANTUCKET CARROT CAKE**

At a recent birthday party with wonderful friends, this delicious cake was served.

- 1 c. all purpose flour
- 1 c. sugar
- 1 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. baking soda
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 2 large eggs
- 3/4 c. oil
- 1 tsp. vanilla
- 1 1/2 c. tightly packed thinly shredded pared carrots
- 1 c. chopped pecans (the size of tiny peas.)

Line the bottom of a loaf pan (about 8 1/2 x 4 1/2 x 2 1/2 inches) with wax paper, grease paper and sides of pan. On wax paper or in a bowl, thoroughly stir together the flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt and cinnamon. In a medium bowl, with a wooden spoon beat the eggs enough to blend yolks and whites. Add oil and vanilla and beat to blend. Add the flour mixture. Stir until smooth. Stir in the carrots and 1/2 c. of the pecans. Turn into the prepared pan. Bake in a pre-heated 325-degree oven until a cake tester inserted in the center comes out clean about 1 hour. Let stand on a wire rack for 10 minutes (very important). Loosen edges and turn out on a wire rack. With another rack turn right side up. Let cool completely. Cover top and sides with frosting. Sprinkle with the remaining pecans. Frosting: Beat until blended 1/4 c. butter, 4 oz. cream cheese and 1 tsp. vanilla. Gradually beat in 1 and 3/4 c. confectioners' sugar or enough to make a good spreading consistency.

Traffic safety studies show compliance with the new law could reduce deaths 90 percent and injuries 80 percent for youngsters involved in auto accidents. Last year, 26 children died and 3,360 were injured, many seriously while traveling in motor vehicles.

Secretary of State Richard H. Austin commended Auto Club's program as a big step in helping parents protect children under age four. Displays about the new law in 37 Secretary of State offices throughout Michigan will include an approved safety seat, donated by Auto Club.

The 1.29-million-member organization will donate child restraints this year to the State Police, hospitals and community service

Some 200 seats will go to the State Police for its loan program. Troopers will ticket violators and loan the driver a child restraint. Upon return of the seat and proof of purchase of an approved device, the \$10 ticket will be voided.

"Under the direction of Colonel Gerald L. Hough,

the State Police has been a strong and valuable partner in our 'Bring 'Em Back Alive!' and other traffic safety programs," Avignone added. "We are pleased to broaden our cooperative efforts with that agency."

Michigan's new law requires all infant car passengers under one year to be restrained.

Youngsters more than one but less than four must be in an approved child restraint while in the front seat. Back seat passengers between ages one and four must use either a child restraint or a seat belt.

The law allows some exceptions, including children being nursed. The Secretary of State may exempt children due to

physical size or medical problems.

Brochures which explain the law and the required child restraints are available from Secretary of State offices and State Police posts throughout Michigan. A list of federally approved child restraints is available at those locations and at Auto Club's 56 offices statewide.
