City passes amended permit parking plan

In three weeks, give or take a day or two, a new parking ordinance will take effect in St. Johns requiring permits for more than two hours of parking in city-owned spaces.

Spaces which are now metered will provide free one- and two-hour parking, and all city lots but one will offer 10-hour permit parking on a first-come, first-serve basis.

One lot, on the south side of Walker between the American Legion Hall and old Clinton County News office, will have eight spaces designated for ten-hour permit holders, under an amendment to the ordinance prior to approval Monday night, April 26.

At the urging of Robert Barber, representing a downtown merchants and St. Johns Area Chamber of Commerce Parking Lot Committee, city commissioners agreed to designate half of the spaces in the Walker Street lot to avoid overcrowding by downtown employees.

The lot is the closest to the downtown area and would likely fill up with employees' cars first, leaving few or none of the 16 available spaces for shoppers, Barber said.

Designation of ten-hour areas in other lots will depend on how many permits are sold, City Manager Randy Humphrey said.

Permits will cost \$10 for the six-month trial period of the ordinance, and \$20 for an entire year if the law goes into effect permanently.

"If we sell only 20 permits, it will be no problem," he said. "But if we sell 200, then we will really have problems."

By holding off on further designation, the city can save on signs which must be posted in front of each designated space to ensure the law can be enforced, Humphrey said.

One hour free parking will be available along both sides of Clinton Avenue, at all presently metered spots along Walker and Higham and directly in front of the courthouse, the ordinance says.

Ten hour parking and two hour free parking will be offered in part of the Walker Street lot and in four remaining city lots: Ott's Landing, two lots off Walker west of Clinton and one at the corner of Spring Street and Higham.

It was the request of the city and parking lot committee that a patrolman mark tires four times a day to enforce time limits, but Police Chief Lyle French said Tuesday that may not be possible on a regular basis.

"We will make every attempt to abide by that but there are other priorities that could get in the way," he

said. Officers' vacations, crime problems and other demands will make four daily rounds difficult, French said, but at least two times a day should be possible, he said. "I'm not making any guarantees, though," he added.

"It's not going to be what we would call strict enforcement, but under the circumstances it will be stricter than the last six months of last year."

During that period, French said, the officer in charge of enforcement, Sgt. Robert Ott, was occupied with establishment of a new parking lot and other duties. In addition, the period includes the Christmas season, he pointed out, when parking enforcement was suspended for the month of December at the request of downtown merchants.

Warming to wage freeze?

The pressure is mounting for Clinton County teachers and school employees to accept contract concessions.

A wage freeze and fringe benefit cap has been demanded by St. Johns' School Board, causing a break in negotiations with the St. Johns Education Association, and other school boards are asking for similar concessions from teachers as contracts come up for review across the county. If teachers grant concessions, other employee unions are likely to follow suit.

St. Johns board members have told the public and teachers they find it hard to come up with millage request figures without knowing what raises for teachers could cost the district. They've worked out figures which show the system could scrape by and maintain most present programs if teachers agree to a freeze.

Monday night, April 19, Fowler Public Schools took a different approach. The Fowler School Board placed a freeze on all administrative and non-union personnel for the 1982-83 school year, sending a message to teachers currently bargaining for a new contract, and to voters, who will soon be asked to approve additional millage.

According to Superintendent Gary Jackson, the freeze

will help reduce the system's projected deficit of \$145,000. An additional 2.2 mills is still needed, however, or already reduced programs will be cut further, he said. The millage request will go to voters June 14.

Fowler plans to combine the additional request with renewal of 20.8 mills, a move which has backfired in other mid-Michigan districts which were forced to hold two elections when renewals attached to extra millage requests were rejected.

"Board members unanimously approved the one ballot issue because they feel that all 23 mills are necessary to provide a basic educational program to the students of Fowler," Jackson reported.

In the first Clinton County millage request of the year, Bath voters turned down a request for one additional mill Monday, April 19. But the election won't be the last this year for Bath, which will return to voters with another one-mill request June 14. The first one-mill request was earmarked for maintaining programs; the next request is for maintenance and repair of a damaged school roof.

Voters, also, are watching negotiations, school officials say, and concessions could help get millage requests passed if those who go to the polls in June believe all are tightening their belts to put education first.

Contract concessions by large labor groups like the United Auto Workers have also put pressure on teacher groups, which have relied in the past on raises granted to large unions to justify their own cost-of-living and salary increases.

Canoeists find Hayworth Creek drowning victim

The body of a St. Johns man missing since a canoe accident on Hayworth Creek March 8 was found by two canoeists near noon April 22, Clinton County Sheriff's Department reports said.

Richard D. Lobsinger, 20, of 6366 Forest Hill Rd., St. Johns, was reported missing after his canoe tipped over in the rain-swollen creek while canoeing with a group of friends. His body was found near 11:55 a.m. Thursday, April 22 on Hayworth Creek about 300 yards north of Hyde Road by Barbara Beale and Dorothy Bancroft, both of Maple Rapids, reports said.

The body was found about a 1.5 miles from where he was last seen, and had been the subject of an intensive search effort by sheriff's department divers, local volunteers and other law enforcement agencies.

Assisting in the recovery effort were Clinton County Sheriff's deputies, Maple Rapids firemen, neighbors and friends, reports said.

A Lansing woman was listed in fair condition Tuesday following an accident Friday afternoon, April 23 in DeWitt Township, police reports said.

Mary Schieve, 28, of 409

Francis Ave., Lansing, was injured when she collided with an auto driven by Diane Miller, 21, of St. Louis. The broadside collision occurred at the intersection of Clark and Wood, DeWitt Township Police reports said.

The accident was reported near 5 p.m., when Ms. Shieve, northbound on Wood Road, pulled in front of Ms. Miller's auto, reports said. Both women were alone in their autos and Ms. Miller received only minor injuries, reports said.

A DeWitt woman escaped injury when a rock was thrown through the windshield of her moving auto on Airport Road near Stoll Road, DeWitt Township Police reports said.



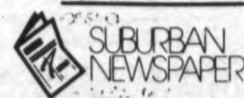

Penix clarifies statements

To the editor:

I would like to clarify for your readers the points I tried to make with the St. Johns Board of Education, as reported in the April 22 Clinton County News.

1. It is impossible to determine the amount of revenues needed to run a business until the expenses of that business have been determined.

2. In any projection of a budget, there are always uncertainties. The fewer present, the more accurate the budget.

3. As a parent of elementary school children, I was asking the board of education and the bargaining units of the school district to sit down in earnest and settle all contracts for the coming school year so that the largest variable on the expenditure side of the budget would no longer be a variable.

4. Once this has been accomplished, the board could then determine the revenue needs for the district. For instance, X number of mills will provide for X quality of education and Y number of mills will provide for Y quality of education.

5. Then the voters can intelligently decide in the privacy of a voting booth the quality of education the students of this school district deserve.

6. As you mentioned in your article, I was a teacher, coach and later a principal in the Bay City Public School

System. I have seen what happens to a city, a school and a school district that continues to use the student as a pawn in the name of the democratic process. This becomes a very divisive force within a community — everyone has a particular pet peeve with a part of the educational system as well as a sacred cow. Consequently, no one is satisfied with the local school district as a result of one program being cut rather than another. This causes mistrust between parents and teachers, teachers and administrators, and voters and the board of education.

7. The educational process grows in the same manner as a plant. If carefully cultivated, the plant will flourish, but if not, its growth is stunted and weeds will sap its growth.

8. A quality education system is just like a well constructed building — it costs much less to maintain than to rebuild it.

9. In no manner am I aligning myself with the St. Johns Education Association or any other special interest group. I am representing the interests of my children. They deserve the same quality education my parents offered me.

10. The statement in your article attributed to me concerning (Superintendent) Dr. Burns was not accurate. The point I was trying to make was that Dr. Burns has tendered his resignation effective January, 1983. As a result of this fact, the board of education must NOW take a much greater leadership role and move the planning for the 1982-83 school year along at a much more aggressive pace.

Motocross track needed

To the editor:

We would like to bring the sport of bicycle motocross racing (BMX) to the attention of our community. In the last few years, BMX has spread across the country and other parts of the world.

Last year alone, riders age 6 to 26 raised thousands of dollars for the Leukemia Society of America by going door to door and having people sponsor them for a few dollars.

In Michigan, there are already 30 tracks operating with more starting every season and thousands of participants.

Still, in our town BMX is non-existent. There are plenty of riders but no track for us to practice on. We take our racing just as seriously as other athletes and feel the need for safer riding areas other than our city streets.

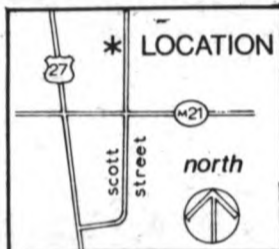

County squads fight for crowns

If former baseball stars make good coaches, Clinton County baseball teams should be among the state's best in 1982.

Pewamo-Westphalia's Jim Cotter, for example, teamed up with current Detroit Tigers Kirk Gibson and Larry Pashnick to pace Michigan State to the Big 10 championship in 1979. Bath's Gary Boyce also starred for the Spartans and spent several seasons in professional baseball. Ovid-Elsie's Jack Nutter used to fire fastballs for the Philadelphia Phillies.

While area coaches are excited about the 1982 season, most are faced with significant rebuilding jobs. Only St. Johns returns a healthy supply of lettermen from 1981.

□**BATH** — Gary Boyce is beginning his second year as the Bee's head coach and is hoping to improve on last year's 6-8 league and 7-14 overall record.

"We're going to be real young," he said, "but we're hoping to make a run at the league title. Right now we're a little shy in pitching experience."

Boyce will be counting on seasoned hurler Tim Palmatier for most of his pitching help in the early part of the season.

Other key veterans are shortstop Steve Oberst, outfielder Shane Heddens, catcher Scott Heddens and infielder Mike Dyer.

Boyce is also counting on infielders Rick Ramsayer, Glenn Spears, Tyler Vail, T. J. Lackey, Barry Schiffer and Roger Flewelling; outfielders Ed Beachneau, George Escojido, Larry Lowrie and Jeff Koftal; and catcher Dave Gibbs and pitcher Mark Schneider.

□**DEWITT** — Frank Deak is hoping for the same kind of season that saw the Panthers go 26-7 and 20-7 the last couple of years and win two consecutive Capital Circuit crowns.

"We're young, but we're determined to defend our league crown and hopefully repeat as district champions."

Deak has only three returning veterans returning from last year's squad, but all three are outstanding and two are his sons. Tim, who is being recruited by more than a dozen colleges, was an All-League pick last year and is both an outstanding pitcher and hitter. Brother Tom, also an All-League selection, holds down the catching spot. The two Deaks are joined by basketball center Steve Sontich who will both pitch and play in the outfield.

Nine key seniors are missing from the 1981 team and Hoffman hopes some of his younger players come around in a hurry.

"We're real inexperienced," he admits. "We're still out there to defend our league crown, however."

Hoffman is depending on a senior and a freshman to bolster his inexperienced pitching staff. Veteran Mike Ulrich and rookie Dan Simon are both lefties and both have looked pretty good so far.

Dean Schmitz will see plenty of playing time at catcher as will infielders Bob Simon, Jiles Feldpausch, Marty Hamilton and Bill Kohagen and outfielders Don Simon, Bryon Antes, Jim Farley and Steve Weber.

□**OVID-ELSIE** — After a disappointing 1981 season when the Marauders did not field a baseball team because of financial difficulties, Ovid-Elsie is back in business.

"It is tough to predict what kind of team Ovid-Elsie will have this season because of our not being able to play last year," present coach and former Philadelphia Phillies' hurler Jack Nutter said. "Our strengths ap-

Don Phillips, Brian Hilton and Thad Ridsdale will handle the catching chores and Scott Bates, Craig Smith, Wade Kioski, Hurst, Baker and Buckovcik will be on the mound.

□**PEWAMO-WESTPHALIA** — Jim Cotter begins his first year at Pewamo-Westphalia and is hoping his squad will be able to improve on last year's 9-10 record.

"We think we've got a shot at winning the CMAC," he said. "The season is so short we've got to do well right away, though."

Cotter has been especially pleased about the early-season performances of outfielders Glenn Thelen and

George Heckman. Thelen is hitting .545 after five games.

ORDINANCE NO. 342
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND TITLE X, CHAPTE 127, PARKING VIOLATIONS BUREAU OF THE ST. JOHNS CITY CODE

THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS ORDAINS:
Section 1. That Section 10.56 of Chapter 127 of the St. Johns City Code shall be amended in the following respects:

Section 2. Title X, Chapter 127, Parking Violations Bureau, shall be further amended by the addition of the following sections:

10.57 Definitions

(1) The word "vehicle" as used herein, shall mean any device by which any person or property may be transported upon streets and highways.

(2) The word "parking" shall mean the standing of a vehicle upon any street or public place, whether occupied or not, otherwise than temporarily for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading and unloading of passengers, or when obeying traffic signals or regulations.

(3) "Parking lots" as used herein shall mean those lots owned, leased under option to purchase, or contracted for and maintained by the City of St. Johns, and designated as municipal parking lots.

(4) "Parking zone" as used herein shall mean that portion of the streets of the City of St. Johns designated and signed as parking areas for specified time periods.

(5) "Parking meter zone" as used herein shall mean that portion of the streets of the City of St. Johns on which parking meters are placed and designated as parking.

10.58 Parking Regulations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park in a parking zone on the streets of the City of St. Johns within the areas designated for parking and designated for a specified time period for a period in excess of that time designated by Traffic Control Order and respective traffic signs. If any vehicle shall remain parked in such a parking space beyond the time limit fixed for such parking space, said parking shall be deemed overtime parking, a violation of the within chapter and punishable as set forth herein.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park in a designated municipal parking lot for a time period in excess of that time period set forth by Traffic Control Order and denoted by signs respectively and such parking in excess of that designated time period shall be deemed overtime parking, and shall be a violation of this Chapter and punishable as hereinbefore provided.

10.59 Parking in a Metered Zone Area.

When parking meters are erected adjacent to a space marked for parking, such space shall be a metered parking zone and no person shall stop or park a vehicle in any such zone for a period of time longer than the parking period designated on said parking meter or without satisfying the conditions designated on said parking meter for the deposit of coins of U.S. currency on the days and during the hours such regulations are designated on such meters as being in effect. Whenever a vehicle shall be parked in an individual parking zone when parking meter regulations are in effect, coins as required by the designation on such meter shall be deposited in such meter immediately upon parking by the owner, operator or passenger of such vehicle.

10.60 Parking Meter Violations.

It shall be unlawful for any person to park in a parking meter zone or parking meter lot except within the areas designated, or to fail or neglect to deposit the proper coin or coins. If said vehicle shall remain parked in any such parking space beyond the parking time limits fixed for such parking space the parking meter shall by its dial and pointer, indicate such illegal parking. In that event, such vehicle shall be considered as parking overtime and shall be in violation of this chapter and punishable as set forth herein.

10.61 Control Marks or Devices

It shall be lawful for the St. Johns Chief of Police, and/or his designated employee or agent, to place chalk or other approved marking devices upon parked vehicles, their wheels or tires to designate and control time limitations as set forth herein.

10.62 Erasure or Removal of Control Marks or Devices.

No person shall erase or remove any mark or device placed on any vehicle for the purpose of enforcing the provisions of this Chapter.

10.63 Conflicting Ordinances.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances that are in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby rescinded, revoked, and/or repealed.

Section 3. Except as herein set forth, Title X, Chapter 127, Parking Violations Bureau of the St. Johns City Code shall stand as first enacted or otherwise amended.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its passage.

I RESOLUTION FOR TRANSFER OF LIQUOR LICENSE FOR ARTHUR IRISH

The fire chief inspected the building and before the transfer of this license is made, several corrections need to be made.

Whitlock moved, supported by Mann, that the Liquor License request be tabled. Motion carried.

II BACK-UP EQUIPMENT FOR POLICE AND FIRE DISPATCH

Chief North explained that communication between the County and the Township sometimes is out of service, and suggested a back-up system. This will involve an adaptor to be part of the Police Station and operated by our Police Department when St. Johns communication is disrupted. Cost would be approximately \$1,000. Discussion was on the dispatching from the Township; Bath and DeWitt being asked to be included and their helping with expenses; and acquiring a generator or alternator for emergency use for operating the Township Hall.

Hammond moved, supported by Mann, to allow the purchase of a D.C. Adaptor and Encoder not to exceed \$1,000.

ROLL CALL VOTE: AYES 6, NAYS 0, ABSENT 1. MOTION CARRIED.

Chairman Reed called for a 5 minute recess.

Hammond inquired how much repairs will cost. Mann stated around \$535. Whitlock has submitted bill to insurance company to see if we are covered.

Whitlock moved, supported by Verlinde that the Contract be approved with the understanding that the plumbing will be repaired by the Township before the preschool occupies the building.

V PUBLIC SAFETY REPORT

Hammond read through the Public Safety Minutes of March 15, 1982, and informed the Board of the material discussed at that meeting as follows: 1) the hunting districts in the Township with a representative from the D.N.R. (Hammond stated a committee-comprising of a representative from the Clinton County Sheriff's Office, Michigan State Police Department, Department of Natural Resources and an officer from the Township study the problem and report back to the Board who would have the final say.) 2) Animal Control; 3) approved sending five (5) men to L.C.C. Hurst Tool Class; and 4) the February Fire and Police Reports were accepted.

Kraus asked if anymore information was available on the Youth Employment Training Program. Woodruff answered, not as yet. Kraus then advised the Board of the actions taken at the Park's Committee meeting of April 6 as follows: 1) approved the expenditure of up to \$120.00 for scales for Aerobic Class; 2) Arts and Craft Sale; 3) Patches for softball program; and 4) Hiring of a Recreational instructor.

Discussion by the Board was on the following with Hammond suggesting that rollers be added to the Aerobic platform so it will not scratch the floor. Reed stated cookies, cake and coffee will be sold at the Arts and Craft Sale with proceeds going to the Richard Smith family, and Richard Smith benefit cribbage tournament to be held; also the prize money the kids received last year has never been spent.

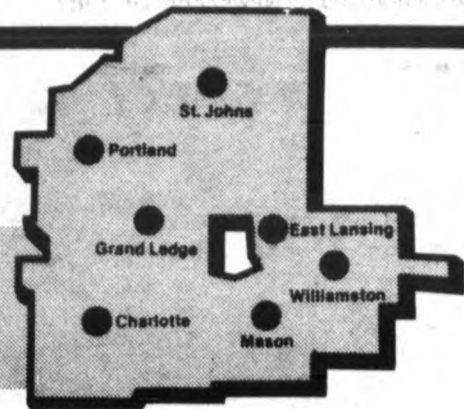



WHOLEGRAIN DEEP DISH PIZZA

High cost of fast foods is pushing more and more of us back into the kitchen. Making your own pizza is cheaper, better for you, and more satisfying when the whole family helps.

Crust:
¾ c. milk
½ c. vegetable oil
1 egg
2½ c. all purpose flour
1 ¼ c. ground oat flour
1 tbsp. baking powder
1 ½ tsp. salt
Filling: (change as you wish)
¾ pound ground beef
½ c. chopped onion
2 garlic cloves, minced
One 28 oz. can of pear tomatoes, chopped, well drained
One 6 oz. can tomato paste
2 tsp. basil leaves
1 tsp. oregano leaves
1 tsp. salt
1 med. green pepper, cut in strips
One 4 ½ oz. can mushroom slices, drained
2 c. shredded Mozzarella cheese
½ c. grated Parmesan cheese

For crust, add combined milk, oil and egg to combined remaining ingredients; stir with fork until mixture forms ball. Knead on lightly floured surface about 10 times. With greased fingers, press dough into lightly oiled 14 inch round 2 inch high pizza pan, shaping edge to form 1 inch rim. Bake in preheated 425 degree oven for 10 minutes.

Brown meat, onion and garlic; drain. In large bowl, combine meat mixture, tomatoes, tomato paste and seasonings, mixing well. Spread over partially baked crust; top with green pepper, mushrooms, and cheeses. Continue baking for 20 to 25 minutes. Serves 6 to 8.

1 can (11 ½ oz.) condensed bean with bacon soup
4 c. (1 pound) sharp Cheddar cheese (grated)
½ c. finely chopped onion
2 tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
1 tsp. basil leaves, crushed
1 med. clove garlic, minced
½ tsp. hot pepper sauce
½ c. finely chopped parsley
In a large bowl, stir all ingredients except parsley until well blended. On waxed paper, shape mixture into a ball. Chill two hours. Roll in parsley. Serve with chips or crackers.

APPLESAUCE CURRANT BREAD

Quick breads can be very nourishing; and take much less time than a batch of cookies.

1 ½ c. unbleached flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1 tsp. baking soda
½ tsp. salt
1 tsp. cinnamon
½ tsp. nutmeg
½ c. soft oleo
½ c. brown sugar
2 eggs
1 c. applesauce
1 c. quick cooking oats
1 c. currants
½ c. chopped nuts

Mix together flour, baking powder, soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg. In a separate bowl, cream butter with sugar, then beat in eggs and stir in applesauce. Add this to dry ingred. and stir in oats, currants, and nuts. Mix only enough to moisten all ingredients, then turn into a well-greased loaf pan, 9 x 5 x 3. Bake in a preheated 350 degree oven for 55 to 60 minutes or until a knife comes out clean. Best the next day. Makes 1 loaf.

In addition to Carr and Reid, organizers of Capitol National Bank are David O'Leary, president of Silver Paint Company; Charles E. Chamberlain, former Michigan Sixth District U. S. representative and partner in the Washington, D. C., law firm of Webster and



Chamberlain; Douglas E. Crist, president of Douglas E. Crist and Associates; Dr. G. A. Falkenberg, an osteopathic physician from Howell; Joel I. Ferguson, partner in F & S Development Company; Lewis D. Johns, president of Re-Bar Installation Service, Inc.; William R. Kahl, senior vice-president of Prescott, Ball and Turben; Mark A. Latterman, attorney; and Gordon L. Long, president of Long Development, Inc.
