## City sets deadline for Well 10 tests

City commissioners have given a Grand Rapids contractor until June 1 to find out what's wrong with Well 10. If tests aren't done by then, another well expert will be asked to check out the city's latest, and most disappointing water source.

Months overdue, the new well is producing only a trickle of the water the city was promised by Grand Rapids contractor Walter Meinert, and city officials want to know why. In a recent letter, Meinert promised to perform tests to determine the cause of problems by May 28, but city commissioners aren't taking any chances.

At the urging of Mayor John Arehart during a commission meeting Monday night, May 24, they agreed to authorize City Manager Randy Humphrey to hire another well expert, Keck Consulting of Williamston, if Meinert does not do the tests on schedule.

Pointing out the well is "way, way overdue," Arehart said the city should take steps to protect itself in light of Meinert's past record.

Humphrey agreed Meinert's work has not been satisfactory. If permission to replace Meinert was not given, he said, tests on the well could be delayed for three more weeks before commissioners met again June 14 to give the go-ahead. Meanwhile, pressure on Meinert may help get results, he said.

Well 10, which was expected to cost about \$50,000 and has run up bills of \$30,000, so far, is producing less than half of the 300 gallons per-minute promised at the beginning of the project. And new city developments okayed by the city — in expectation of full water production from the new well — may leave St. Johns high and dry this summer.

Water demand from the Clinton Area Care Center, Suntree Apartments and the new Southpoint Mall could cause shortages and sprinkling bans in coming months, city officials say.

"We want to find out if the well is rehabilitatable or if it isn't as soon as possible," Humphrey said.

With rainfall lower than expected for the month of May, water supplies are already getting slim, City Clerk Rick Coletta said. "With that last dry spell, we were already having shortages. It was nothing serious, but it makes you think of August and worry a little bit."

Dissatisfied with his work, the city began holding back Meinert's payments, so plenty should be available in the well budget to pay Keck if a second opinion is needed, Coletta said.

Also at the Monday night meeting, city commissioners approved:

- Purchase of a new custom-built fire truck for a bid of \$120,428. Although nearly \$20,000 more costly than a commercially-built truck, Fire Chief Clare Maier told commissioners the custom-built rig has a bigger cab, a more powerful diesel engine and heavier steel construction. The truck should be delivered sometime next February to replace a 1963 Ford, and will be paid for in cash with a fund which was first set aside by commissioners five years ago.

## Once-vocal opponents keep mum

# Religious group gets its Way

What a difference four years makes. With little fanfare, the Clinton County Board of Commissioners at their May 25 meeting unanimously approved renewal of a special use permit (SUP) for The Way of Michigan to continue operating a biblical research and teaching center at 3793 W. M-21 on the outskirts of St. Johns.

In 1978 The Way was the center of controversy, both on the national and local scene. Accused by civil rights groups and a variety of newspapers and national magazines of practicing brainwashing, religious indoctrination, weapons training and infiltrating defense plants, Way leaders denied participation in any activities other than religious education and research.

When The Way applied for and received a special use permit in 1978 to operate a "biblical research and teaching center" on West M-21, some county residents questioned the religious group's motives. A Sept. 6, 1978 Clinton County News article featured an interview with a former Way member who accused the group of brainwashing and mind-control. Local Way leaders termed the accusations "nonsense".

This year, no mention was made of infiltration or brainwashing when The Way applied for renewal of its SUP. Although some local residents may be concerned about the organization's tax-exempt status, according to Township supervisor Harold Benson, the only controversies that did surface during the board of commissioners meeting were issues of proper location of portable toilets and construction of environmental buffer strips.

Clinton County Planner Tom Warstler, the local official responsible for preparing background material used by commissioners to make their decisions on zoning matters, agreed there was minimum opposition to re-issuing an SUP to The Way.

"I wasn't here in 1978," he said, "but I understand there was a lot of concern about The Way locating in this area. There really wasn't a lot of opposition this time around."

Warstler said concern over adequate parking facilities, the need for a buffer strip or fencing between Way property and adjoining landowners and indiscreet siting of portable toilets (used when large groups of people attended Way functions) was brought up before both the Bingham Township Board and the Clinton County Planning Commission. None of the concerns were considered serious enough, however, to deny the SUP, he said.

The planning commission had earlier recommended approval of the Way's SUP.

The SUP is good for four years, requires compliance with all federal, state and county laws and limits the facility to 13 meetings per year to be attended by no more than 50 people at each meeting.

The Way is also required to construct and maintain a parking area and construct an environmental buffer strip on its east property line.

Neither representatives of The Way's local organization or its headquarters in New Knoxville, Ohio were available for comment after Monday's commission meeting.

In other action, commissioners unanimously denied a request for the rezoning of approximately 70 acres on the northeast corner of Clark and Chandler roads in Bath Township from low density residential to medium density residential. The change, requested by owners David L. Kares and Roger C. Beebe of Lansing, would permit single family residences on lots with a minimum width of 80 feet instead of the presently required 100 feet.

County development control staff recommended denial of the request for rezoning because the parcel "best fit" the intent and purpose of the existing zoning and would leave the 70 acres "more closely comparable to the density of adjoining residences."

The rezoning of the 70-acre parcel was also opposed by both the Bath Township Board and the Bath Township Planning Commission, the county planning commission and approximately a dozen area residents.

### Has anti-freeze opinions

To the editor:

This is in response to your editorial, "Frozen Wage Better Than None," which you printed in your May 13 issue. Your suggestion that all Clinton County teachers accept a wage freeze before the June millage elections in order to show good faith to the community that teachers hold education first is not only simplistic in its view but ignorant in its concept.

The idea that a community would vote for a millage if it knew the money was going for education and not for teacher raises is, in essence, asking voters to say YES to education and NO to teachers. Would anyone expect a community to say YES to good medical care and NO to physicians? How about YES to well cared for children and NO to motherhood? Just as good health care depends on physicians to provide it, so does education depend upon teachers.

The National Education Association reported this year that teachers' salaries across the nation have failed to keep up with the inflation rate over the last ten years. Historically, teachers' salaries have never kept pace with the Consumer Price Index. Asking teachers to accept a wage freeze is not only discriminatory, but actually a request for a reduction in wages. If everyone's wages were to be increased \$100, no one would be any richer; but if there was one who did not receive the \$100 increase, he would be \$100 poorer. This is a basic economic concept and one with which you should be familiar before making any statement about wage freezes. Teachers who accept a wage freeze while others receive cost of living increases will not stand still, but fall behind.

When the UAW recently announced plans to reduce worker absenteeism to 25 percent, and therefore require 187 days of work from its members, "Time" magazine applauded the idea. At the same time, the 180-day school year remains a rallying point for groups who seek to downgrade the salary structure of the teaching profession. Those 180 days become somewhat more when one considers that a teacher's day is frequently longer than the eight-hour day associated with business and industry. Teachers do not receive overtime for the evenings and weekends spent checking papers, preparing lessons, making teaching aids, marking progress reports or attending meetings with parents or school officials. Perhaps the public thinks, as you do, that these are part of the fringe benefits of the teaching profession.

Severe budget cutbacks in schools have already caused teachers to experience a reduction in pay. If

satisfaction in one's job is to be considered a form of remuneration, as you stated in your editorial, then certainly you would not argue that working conditions and class size are also to be considered part of the fringe benefit program.

Teachers are having to work in dirty classrooms, with inadequate or broken plumbing, under leaky roofs, with inferior supplies and dilapidated equipment. Increased class sizes compound the situation. When the number of children in my classroom increased 39 percent last November, my workload also increased 39 percent. Since there was no increase in pay for 39 percent more work, I assume you would agree that a wage decrease is already in effect. Workload increases and wage freezes add up to deficits which teachers, like anyone else, cannot afford.

It would be wonderful if teachers could use the satisfaction, excitement and self esteem which you talk about to buy groceries and pay rent, but they are lacking as a medium of exchange in the marketplace. Neither do they serve to pay the taxes I pay to support education in the community. (Yes, teachers pay taxes too!)

The schools' economic problems do not lie with the amount of teachers' salaries, but instead with the reluctance of the legislature to courageously deal with equitable ways of funding education for all of Michigan's students. Voters who genuinely want to support education will support teachers; those who don't, won't.

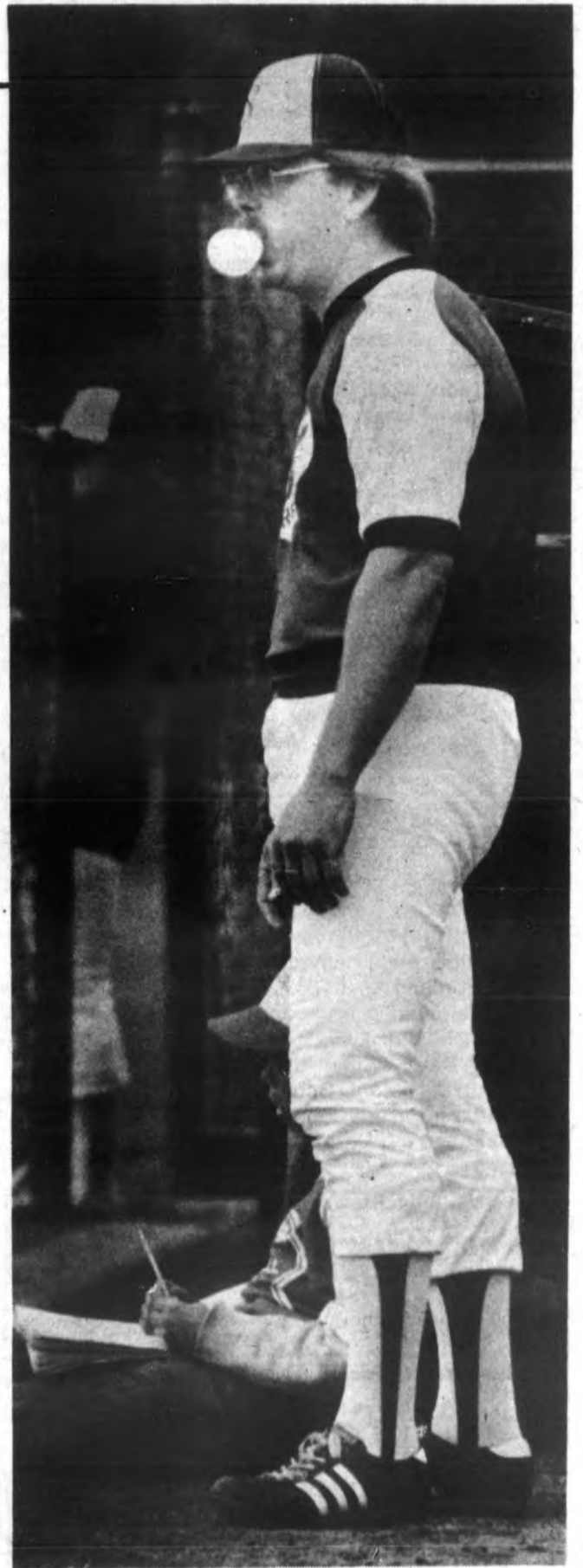

## Redwings lose 3-1 in Classic opener

If only the fifth inning hadn't happened, St. Johns might still be in the Diamond Classic.

The Redwings entered the fifth inning leading Waverly by a 1-0 margin, but then disaster struck. Too many walks, an infield error and a mental lapse and St. Johns was suddenly behind 3-1.

"Except for the fifth, we played a real good game," Redwing coach John Wilcox said. "I'm terribly disappointed to be out of the tournament, but I'm pleased with the way the team played."

St. Johns scored their only run of the game in the fourth inning when Catcher Eric Slamka knocked in Dean Sharick from third with a single.

"Slamka played a real good game," Wilcox said. "We also showed some real good baserunning . . . We stole at least five bases . . . when we got on base, they (Waverly) couldn't throw us out . . . Getting on base was the problem."

Pitcher Rod Rojas went the distance for St. Johns, striking out 10 and giving up only one earned run.

"Rojas pitched well, Wilcox said. "But Paul Simons of Waverly also pitched a fine game. He only gave up four hits."

St. Johns played a doubleheader at Mt. Pleasant on Tuesday and opens pre-district play at Everett at 4:15 on Friday.

Wilcox plans to win this one. He's starting Rojas and fully intends not to have any more "fifth innings" against the Vikings.

#### STURGEON SIZE LIMIT

The Natural Resources Commission, at its meeting on July 14, 1978, under authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, renewed the order of August 10, 1973, that no sturgeon may be taken or possessed from the waters of this state of a length less than 50 inches for a period of five years beginning January 1, 1979.

#### REGULATIONS ON TIGER MUSKELLUNGE

The Natural Resources Commission, at its meeting on July 14, 1978, under the authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, renewed the order of August 10, 1973, that hybrid muskellunge, commonly known as the "tiger muskellunge", shall be deemed a muskellunge, and it shall be unlawful to take or possess tiger muskellunge except in accordance with laws, rules, and regulations governing muskellunge, for a period of five years effective January 1, 1979.

### COMMISSION ORDER

(Under authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended)

#### GEAR RESTRICTIONS FOR STREAM FISHING DURING SALMON AND STEELHEAD RUNS

The Natural Resources Commission, at its July 11, 1980, meeting, under the authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, approved the following gear restriction for a period of five years beginning October 1, 1980:

Double or treble pointed hooks exceeding 3/8 inch between point and shank and single pointed hooks exceeding 1/2 inch between point and shank may not be used on any stream except St. Mary's, St. Clair, and Detroit rivers before May 15 or after August 31 of each year.

(under authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended)

#### LAKE TROUT SPEARING STATEWIDE BAN

The Natural Resources Commission, at its July 14, 1978, meeting, under the authority of Sections 1 and 2, Act 230, P.A. 1925, as last amended by Act 82, renewed the order of August 10, 1973, that no person shall take lake trout by means of a spear or bow and arrow from any of the waters over which this state has jurisdiction for a period of five years effective January 1, 1979.

Becky Klein paced the Fowler girls to first place in the Class D regional track championships at Pottsville, while Dave Koenigsnecht and Jeff Thelen led the boys to a fifth-place finish.

Klein, won the 440- and 220-yard dashes and anchored both the 880 and mile relay teams to victory and qualified in all four events for the state-championship meet. Other qualifiers for the Fowler girls were Connie Feldpausch and Lana Hafner in the high jump, Hafner in the 880-yard run and Emily Feldpausch and Deb

Not qualifying, but turning in good performances were Tina Simmon who set a school record of 12:00.1 while finishing sixth in the two mile, Theresa Pope with a sixth in the discus, Debbie Hufnagel with a third-place tie in the high jump and Connie Koenigsnecht with a sixth in the long jump. Carol Good made the finals of the 100-yard dash.

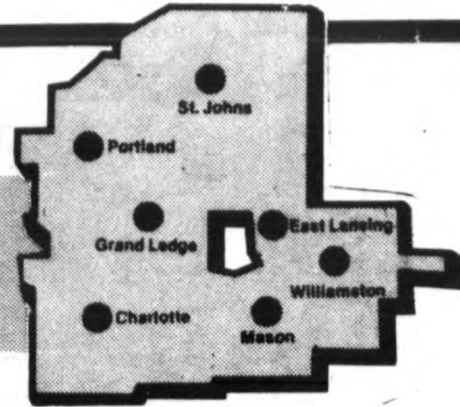

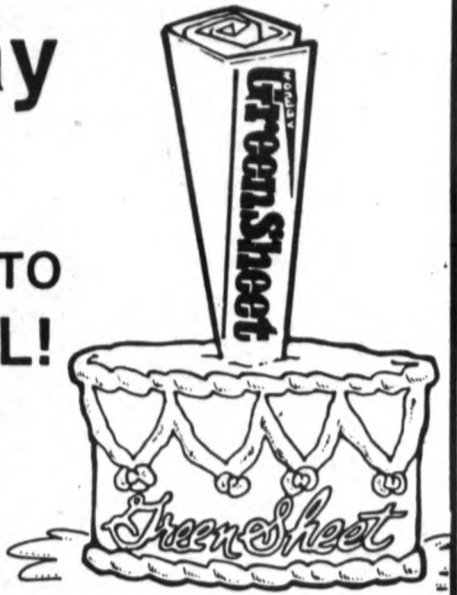

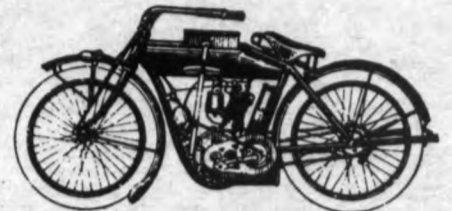

Prepare a 9 inch double crust pie. Soak apricots in boiling water for half an hour. Drain most of water; cook apricots for 20-30 minutes. Mix dry ingredients of brown sugar and cornstarch. Mix in oleo into apricot mixture; add dry ingredients. Pour apricot filling into crust. Top with crust which has been split to let steam escape. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 40-45 minutes or until crust is golden brown.

**CHICKEN CIAO**

I found this recipe in a health magazine, fixed it for my family and they loved it. I hope yours does too...

- 2 tbsp. corn oil
- 1/4 c. finely chopped onion
- 2 (8 oz.) cans tomato sauce
- 1/4 c. honey
- 2 tbsp. chopped parsley
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 bay leaf
- 1/4 tsp. oregano leaves
- 2 frying chickens halved or quartered

Heat corn oil in skillet over medium heat. Add onion and saute until tender. Stir in tomato sauce, honey, parsley, garlic, bay leaf, oregano. Heat to boiling. Reduce heat; cover and simmer 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Arrange chicken, skin side down on broiler rack. Brush with sauce. Place broiler pan in broiler so chicken is 9 inches from source of heat. (charcoal grill can also be used) If pan cannot be set so low, place chicken on rack in a 450 degree oven for 45-50 minutes basting with sauce frequently until chicken is tender. A RE/MAX facility is a franchise where agents earn 100 percent commission, but share in office expenses. Most real estate firms evenly split sales commissions between the sales agent and the broker, but under the RE/MAX concept, agents retain the full commission, but pay a flat fee to cover office expenses and advertising.

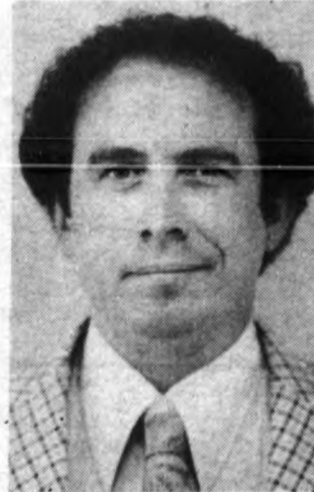
RE/MAX was founded in 1973 in the Denver area. The name stands for "Real Estate Maximums." RE/MAX has more than 450 offices and 4,000 agents in the United States and Canada.

According to Addiss, a million dollar salesman usually generates about \$50,000 in gross commission. The average monthly bill for a RE/MAX agent runs about \$900 a month (including office expenses, advertising costs and miscellaneous expenses), he said. The agent would spend about \$11,000 annually on expenses and retain \$39,000 in commission. Addiss said under the traditional 50-50 commission, the agent would retain \$25,000.

Addiss received his associate's degree in Business Management from Lansing Community College and has been broker/owner of Acorn Realty for the past six years. In addition to Addiss, a Lansing native who has been active in the real estate profession for the past 11



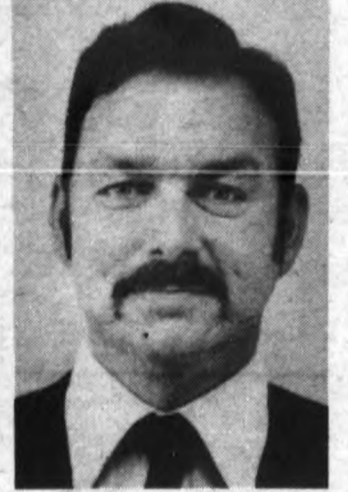
