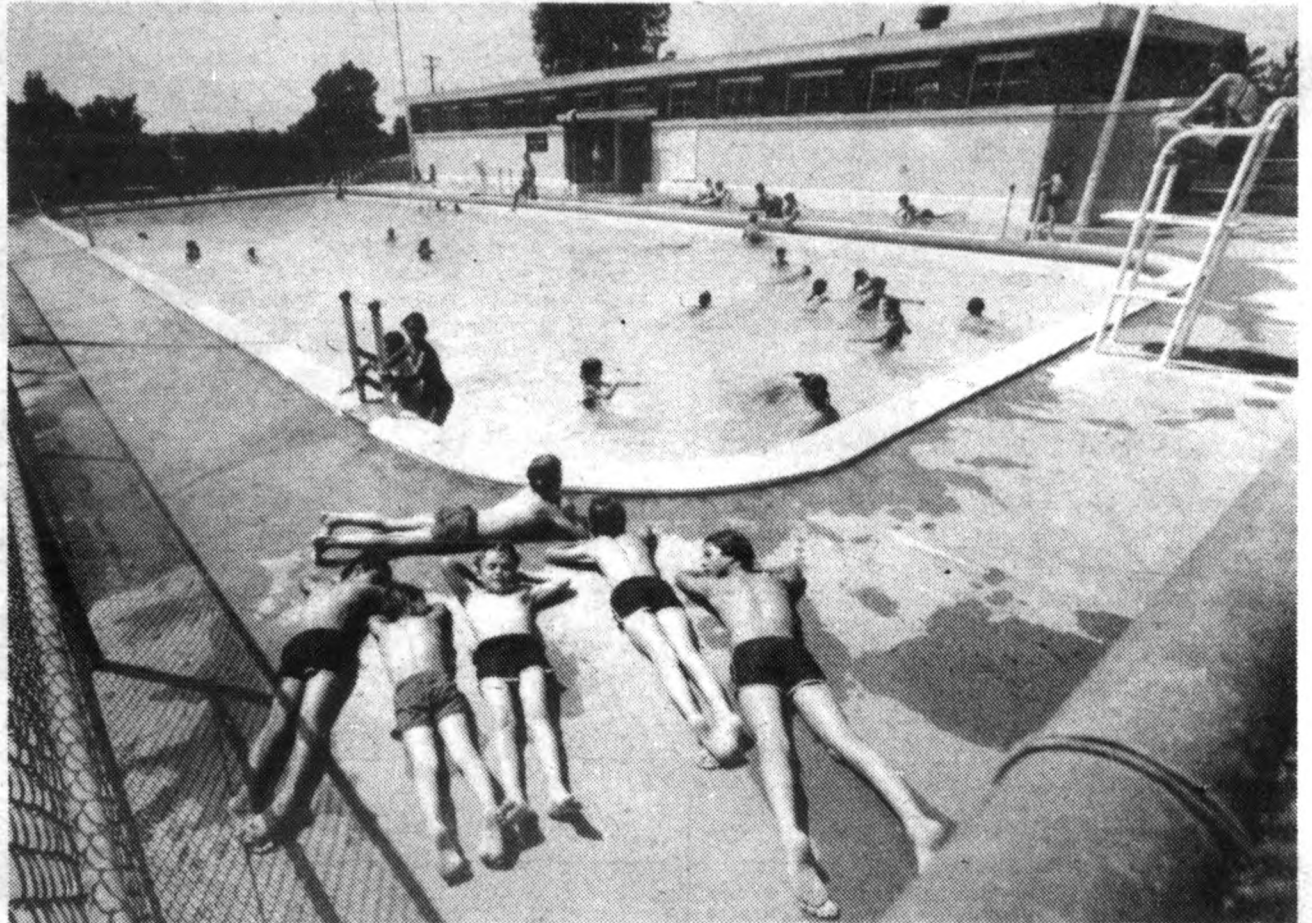

## Says step-dad abused family

# Alzner claims self-defense

Pleading self-defense to charges of second degree murder, Roy Christopher Alzner appeared in court Tuesday, June 15 with his attorney, Fred Abood, to stand trial for the murder of his stepfather, William Barrett.

Alzner's trial began late the next afternoon, on his 18th birthday, with opening statements by his Lansing attorney and Prosecutor John Newman. It is expected to continue throughout the week of June 21 with testimony from Alzner, his mother and officers called to the scene of Barrett's shotgun murder the night of April 11, 1981 in the home of Alzner and Barrett at 145 Boychott Road, DeWitt.

Jury selection stretched to two days and ended Wednesday, June 16 after the court was forced to call in prospective jurors from July to finally select a 14-person jury, which includes the father of the presiding judge, Circuit Judge Randy Tahvonon. Two jurors will be kept as possible alternates, then dropped before deliberation begins.

In his opening remarks, Abood said he would introduce testimony to prove Barrett was an alcoholic who sexually abused Alzner's mother and physically abused the entire family. Alzner had reason to fear for his life from Barrett, he said, and the killing was done in self-defense.

According to statements Alzner gave police on the night of the murder, his father returned home from a bowling banquet at 11:30 p.m. on April 11 and began drinking. Alzner told police he went to bed, only to be ordered out of his room by Barrett, who complained that Alzner's mother and Barrett's wife, Carolee, had been called into work for the night shift.

The two then began arguing when Barrett told his stepson he was immature and began talking about Carolee, and Alzner got up to leave, saying he wanted a

one-way ticket to Texas. Alzner got his coat and boots, as it was a rainy, cold night, got a shotgun from his room and walked back through to where his stepfather was seated announcing, "If you try to stop me, I'll kill you." Hearing the apparent footsteps of his stepfather behind him as he turned to leave, Alzner turned, saw Barrett approaching and shot him. Alzner then returned the gun to its proper place, took off his coat and boots and called the police.

Officer Lorene Levknecht of the DeWitt Township Police testified she arrived on the scene at approximately 2 a.m. to find Alzner standing in the yard in the rain with no coat on and "visibly shivering." Levknecht then approached Alzner and asked who he was and what had happened.

"He said he was Roy Alzner and that his father had been shot," she said.

When other officers arrived on the scene, Ms. Levknecht went into the house and found Barrett lying on the floor in a pool of blood with a bottle of beer in his hand. She then searched the house, "in case there was the alleged murderer still present," and found Shaun Barrett, the only son of both William and Carolee Barrett, asleep in bed. Later, she took Shaun and Alzner to stay at the home of grandparents.

At the time of his first questioning, officer Levknecht said, Alzner told police he woke and found his stepfather dead and then called the police. He also said he knew of no weapons that could have been used. But later, on the way to his grandparents home, he told Levknecht he thought a shotgun had been used because he remembered seeing a shell. Finally, with no one but police officers present, he confessed he had shot his stepfather.

In an interview Alzner gave to a Lansing State Journal reporter, Alzner was asked why he lied and reportedly replied, "I'm a good liar, I always have been."

Newman used the quote in his opening statement, saying the defendant's version "doesn't line-up" with physical evidence and that Alzner is, as he allegedly said, "a very good liar."

Abood asked the jury to judge Alzner "in the light as circumstances appeared to him" and not on happenings at the time of the murder. Alzner's motive "wasn't formed in that time, it was formed for a long time," he stated referring to Barrett's record of physical abuse. Abood concluded by asking that Alzner be found not guilty "on the facts involved."

The prosecution finished their defense on Friday, June 18 and the defense began with testimony of Carolee Barrett on Tuesday, June 22. No verdict has yet been reached.

## FBI investigating investor firm

A St. Johns brokerage business has closed and federal authorities are investigating charges of forgery, St. Johns Police said.

Holloway International Investments Inc., located on the northwest corner of M-21 and US-27, closed last week after only about five months in business in St. Johns. Charged with forgery is owner Nicki Leroy Holloway, 25, of 10263 Hillrun Dr., Perrinton.

Holloway opened in mid-February, advertising his firm as "professional dealers in gold, silver, rare coins and diamonds."

According to St. Johns Police Chief Lyle French, Holloway is charged with forging a check for \$10,000 to an unnamed stockholder in his firm. The complaint was received June 8, French said. Also under investigation

in the Lansing area, Holloway became the subject of an FBI investigation when French contacted FBI officers and reported the complaint.

Lansing FBI Bureau Senior Agent Dick Davidson confirmed Holloway is being investigated by local agents, but said he could not comment on the case.

French said Holloway has paid back all but about \$600 of the forged check, but still faces possible prosecution on the forgery charge.

Davidson said federal authorities could take the results of their investigation before a federal grand jury.

Many stockholders in Holloway International Investment live in St. Johns and the Ovid-Elsie area, French said.

# Cable TV is big hit in county

Bath Township residents will soon join 26 million other Americans in participating in one of the premier media experiences of the 20th century — cable television.

Earlier this month, the Bath Township Board authorized Bath Cablevision, a subsidiary of Signet of Durand, to build a 35-channel cable system in the township.

Bath now joins DeWitt Township, the city of DeWitt and St. Johns as Clinton County governmental units that have authorized the provision of cable TV to their residents.

"We are hoping to begin providing actual cable service by the end of the year," Bath Township Clerk Kathleen McQueen said.

The concept of cable television was originally just a means of providing programming for outlying areas with poor broadcast reception. Today, however, because of the use of satellites, sophisticated equipment to pick up far-away signals and the substitution of strands of glass instead of bulky wire to transmit signals, cable television seems to be limited only by America's imagination.

The country's most sophisticated cable systems provide viewers with a choice of more than 100 channels and allow subscribers to actually "communicate" with their TV. One system, for example, conducts viewer opinion surveys by providing a box containing control buttons that allows users to indicate their views about specific issues. Another system provides fire and burglary-warning services.

While it may be several years before area viewers are able to "talk back" to their TV sets, local cable representatives say they are always on the lookout for improved features.

"We will add new-services as they become viable for area viewers," said Ron Hartman of Continental Cablevision, a company serving both DeWitt Township and the city of DeWitt.

Special cable features that are available from most area systems include movie stations (HBO, The Movie Channel and Cinemax), a news channel (CNN), sports (ESPN), children's programming (Nickelodeon) and rock music (MTV). Many systems also provide channels that local residents can use to broadcast their own programs.

Cable services that are or soon will be available to county residents are:

□**BATH TOWNSHIP:** — Bath Cablevision will be building a system that will initially provide subscribers with 12 channels and eventually will include a 35-channel system. The basic rate for everything except the movie channels will be \$9.50, while HBO, Cinemax and The Movie Channel may be accessed for an additional \$9.50 each. There will be a public access station, according to Ms. McQueen.

□**DEWITT TOWNSHIP:** — DeWitt Township has been serviced by Continental Cablevision of Lansing for approximately two years, according to DeWitt Township Treasurer Catherine Reed. Thirty-five channels, including HBO and Cinemax, are currently being provided. Special features include ESPN, MTV and CNN. The basic rate for one outlet is \$8.85 a month, while a movie channel is an additional \$9.95 monthly. Continental now serves 1250 township residents. Areas in the township, however, must have 40 houses per linear mile before they can receive cable service.

□**CITY OF DEWITT:** — Continental Cablevision will be extending the identical service being provided the township to the city. DeWitt residents will have both a public access station and a special channel for the exclusive use of the DeWitt school system. Hookups for city residents are expected to begin later this summer.

□**ST. JOHNS:** — Cable Vision Inc. began connecting St. Johns residents on Labor Day of 1980. Twenty-two channels are currently being offered including HBO, Cinemax, ESPN, MTV and Nickelodeon. All 22 channels and both HBO and Cinemax can be received for \$22.50 a month. There are currently 1113 St. Johns area subscribers, according to Cable Vision representative Pat Hine.

Levey coordinating reservations and dinner arrangements.

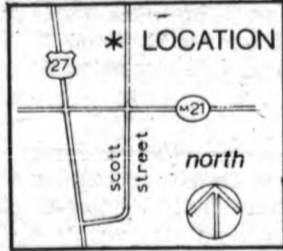

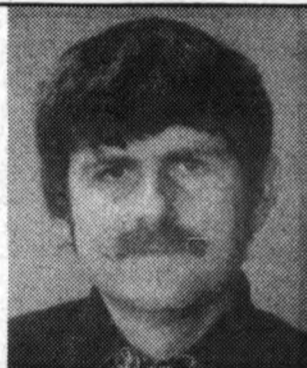

### Girls are athletes too

Women will be allowed to run the marathon for the first time at the 1984 Olympic Games in Los Angeles and there is one Clinton County resident who is probably very unhappy about it.

A call came in the day after we published the All-County girls' softball team. The caller only identified himself as a long-time area baseball fan who was mighty unhappy about the things we were writing in our paper.

"What the heck do you think you're doing making such a big deal about girls' games and not putting out an all-star baseball team?" he said.

I tried to explain that we would be featuring baseball in just a couple of weeks, but he wouldn't listen.

He went on to tell me that there were many readers in the county that were very unhappy with me because of the "equal coverage" I was giving girls' sports.

"You're hurting the chances of some of these guys to play professional ball," he reminded me. "The major league scouts won't notice the kids in this area if you guys who call yourselves sports writers don't give them enough press."

I assume the caller was an extreme case, but I think there are still quite a few people who believe women's athletics are second-class sports.

After writing about sports in Clinton County this past season, I would have to disagree.

Sure, I thoroughly enjoyed watching Jeff Casler and Tim Deak score bunches of points. I was fascinated by the way Sam Dalman and Steve Gonzales made their magical passes. And seeing Greg Fox stride through a

quarter mile is an impressive sight.

But the girls were just as good. I'm convinced there is no better athlete, male or female, in Clinton County than Fowler's Becky Klein. St. Johns' Sue Pearsall can dominate a basketball game as well as anyone. And just wait for next year's track season to begin and DeWitt's Teresa Kirchen roars around the track once again.

These athletes, and dozens of others, are competitive, are talented and help make girls' athletics a real treat.

Coaches are important to any athlete and this area has many who think women's athletics are anything but second class.

I will always remember the time Lisa Smith socked a double with the bases loaded to give St. Johns a thrilling 8-7 win over Grand Ledge. Coach Jan Szymczak called the next day and was still so excited by the win that he could barely talk. To him, high school softball was "big time."

I think that anyone who hasn't had a chance to see women's sports at the high school level should give it a try next season. County teams seem to be developing a bevy of young, talented, female athletes who have a good chance to make a name for themselves at the state level. Pearsall, Klein and Kirchen are all back next year. So are such potential superstars as Pewamo-Westphalia's Patty Theis, Ovid-Elsie's Marry Perrien and Fowler's Patty Wieber.

I hope the caller was wrong and that many people in Clinton County are not angry because we attempt to give equal coverage to women's sports.

The guy doesn't know what he's missing.

Clinton Memorial Hospital welcomed back an old friend recently when doctor Edward Manring returned with his family from West Africa, where he has been doing missionary work.

While living in a village in Liberia, Manring worked as a physician and his wife, Nancy, was a teacher.

"It was a great change," he said after returning to St. Johns. "The buildings were the typical tropical type — open air, no air conditioning and very old."

Few would give up modern comforts to move to an underdeveloped country like Liberia, but Manring said he had an obligation. "We became missionaries out of a commitment to Christ," he says. And after meeting the people of Liberia, Manring discovered people are pretty much the same everywhere.

"The Liberians are friendly, gregarious and listen closely to the word of Christ," he said. "We are more affluent in the U.S. Liberians live in a simpler way of life and lack a lot of the blessings of the U.S.

But they are trying to improve their lives."

One of the major problems facing Liberia is lack of adequate medical care, he said. "In the U.S., we have approximately one doctor to every ten-hundred or twelve-hundred patients," Manring pointed out. "But in Liberia, it's one to every ten- or twelve-thousand."

Liberians also contract different types of diseases than those seen in the U.S., he said.

"Their health problem is one of infectious disease, whereas the U.S. is one of degenerative diseases," he said. "Life expectancy in Liberia is 48 years. They don't live long enough for degenerative diseases."

Americans who visit Liberia are treated daily to keep from getting malaria or other diseases which are abundant in the area, Manring said. And most of the problems which Liberia faces stem simply from a lack of finances, he said.

"They can't afford public sanitation and a lot of the diseases are due to this. Malnutrition is also a big killer, especially among young children."

But with all the problems he witnessed, Manring plans to return to Liberia one day.

"It's nice to be back among your own people and I am very grateful for Clinton Memorial Hospital, but they are looking for us to return," he explained.

Meanwhile, Manring plans to practice at DeWitt Medical Center and says he is looking forward to seeing his old patients again, some of whom met him at the airport upon his return.

1) Richard Brook has employed unfair and inequitable practices in assessing property in the township in that he specifically lowered the assessed value of his own property and selectively raised the assessed values of certain other properties at lesser rates and by methods different from the rates and methods used in the assessment of all other property in the township.

2) Richard Brook has constantly and continually participated in violations of the Michigan Open Meetings Act and the statute governing special meetings of township boards, being section 7(D) of Public Acts 359 of 1947, as amended, which restricts the business that a township board may transact at a special meeting to that business stated in the notice of such meeting. Specifically at a special meeting of the township board held on December 14, 1981, which was called for the purpose of discussing zoning problems, the board, in absence of one member, appointed Brook, township assessor and set his salary, although the notice of such meeting did not state such business would be undertaken.

3) Richard Brook authorized installation of a meter for a use prohibited by township ordinance. Informed of its illegality on December 22, 1981, he allowed this violation to continue.

**JUSTIFICATION STATEMENT OF RICHARD BROOK:**

In all property reassessments, I used consistent methods which were in accordance with state tax laws and procedures. The reappraisal of my property, as an LCC classroom assignment, brought to my attention many other errors on property cards, mistakes made in past appraisals. This knowledge led to 330 changes in assessment, as verified by the Board of Reivew. True assessment has not yet been completed, and it will take at least two years for total evaluation to bring about benefits to the taxpayers.

In compliance with the Open Meetings Act, all agendas and certifications of posting for all township board meetings, special or regular, were done in accordance with the law and are on file with the township clerk. In accordance with state statute, upon certification by the state, the township supervisor is the qualified assessor if he so desires. Thus my appointment was only a public formality and, as such, was verified by the township attorney.

The mobile home park water meter, though installed, was never used to determine sewer charges. This matter will come before the Sewer Appeals Board. Bath Township did not lose one penny on his meter matter.

**Recipe of the Week**

**MOM'S STRAWBERRY PIE**

This is a very special and delicious pie recipe. The ease in making it has us asking "how can something so easy be so-o-o-o-o good?"

- 1 1/2 qts. strawberries
- 3 oz. pkg. cream cheese, softened
- 2 tbsp. powdered sugar
- 1/4 tsp. almond flavoring
- 1 c. sugar
- 3 tbsp. corn starch

Wash the berries in cold water. Do not let them stand in the water or they will lose color and flavor. Hull them and place them in a colander to drain. While the berries are draining, mix together the softened cream cheese and powdered sugar. Spread this mixture over the bottom of the cooled pastry shell. Arrange the choicest berries, stem side down, over the cream cheese, using about half of the berries. Mash and strain remaining berries until juice is extracted. (If necessary, add water to make 1 1/2 cups of juice.) Add 1 c. sugar to the juice and then slowly add 3 tbsp. cornstarch stirring constantly. Bring the juice mixture to a boil, slowly, stirring constantly, and boil until mixture is clear and thick. Cool. Pour over berries in pie shell. Chill about two hours. Just before serving, decorate with whipped cream. Makes 1 nine inch pie.
