## Detectives discover fraud

# Scam money returned to county farmers

Approximately \$2000 was given back to several area farmers recently after the Clinton County Sheriffs Department caught up with roughly 30 people professing to be professional barn painters.

According to Clinton County Sheriff's Detective Richard May, the money was given back after officials of an area bank reported that several suspicious individuals were trying to cash checks worth \$1,750. Upon arrival at the bank, deputies discovered that they were the suspects involved in the recent barn painting scam occurring in the county.

May said deputies then told the suspects that the department was going to send samples of the paint they were using to their crime labs to discover the content. The individuals then immediately agreed to return the money to the area farmers.

The painters, under the guise of Jay Carroll Distributing in Ohio, had reportedly been approaching area farmers and offering to paint their barns at a reduced rate. May said the group would actually paint the barn, but with a paint suspected to be deluded with water, kerosine or oil. On one occasion, a farmer reported that his barn was still wet with paint four days later.

According to May, the painters are only part of the seasonal influx of scams occurring in and around the county. He explained that each spring gypsy travelers begin coming through the state, often staying from 10 days to two weeks in one area. Professing to be professionals in several areas, the group goes from door to door offering their services. May said

the gypsies often prey upon retirees, but will try getting money from anyone.

He cautions area residents to be alert about several other scams that are occurring in the county, including phone calls telling residents that they have won a trip to Hawaii or mail deliveries in which money must be paid before receiving the package.

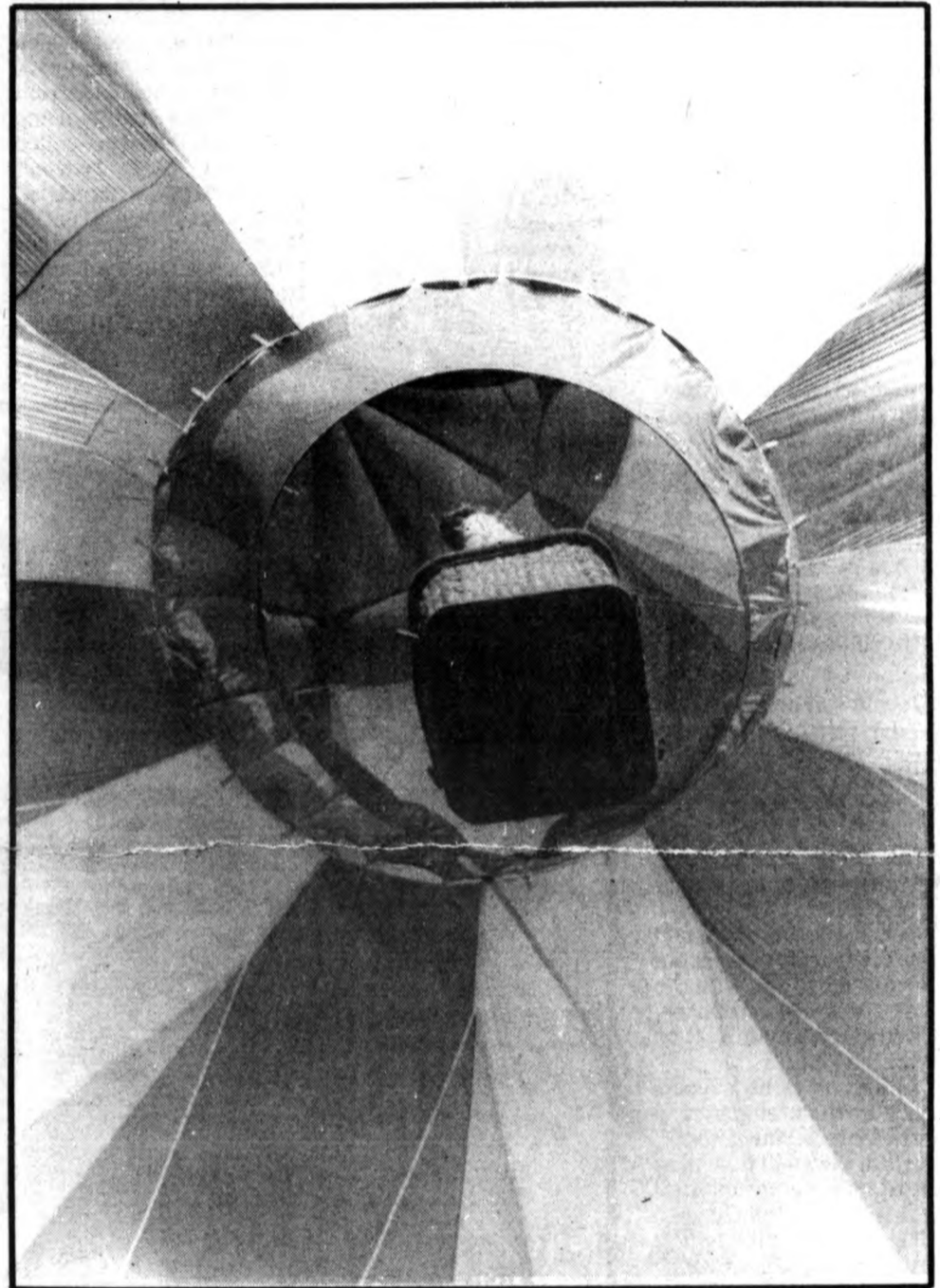
"Just have the post office send the parcel back to the promotion outfit," May said. "These people get thousands and thousands of dollars a month because no one knows who they are. Just remember, you don't get first class material for nothing."

He suggests other ways of protecting yourself from a possible scam is to know who you are dealing with and to deal only with local businesses. The scams usually occur by groups from outside the state. They are driving out of state vehicles and appear unfamiliar with the area.

According to May, many people have a wrong concept of a gypsy, thinking they aren't neat in appearance and that they drive older automobiles. He said, however, that gypsies are clean cut, nice looking individuals who drive nice looking automobiles. They often travel with their family and appear to be very polite.

"Pay attention to who you're dealing with," May said. "Don't let anyone in who you don't know. If you don't trust the person at the door, call the police department."

May added that legally there isn't much that can be done about the scams because the groups are from out of state, making prosecution a difficult thing. He did say, however, that people can be protected by protecting themselves.

# Local communities to sponsor firework displays

Several cities in Clinton County will be providing residents with a spectacular fireworks display Wednesday, July 4th, in celebration of America's independence.

The St. Johns Rotary Club will be sponsoring "the biggest and best fireworks in the mid-Michigan area" Wednesday evening, as a culmination of the annual Fourth of July Festival, beginning June 29. The display will be held in the St. Johns High School parking lot area. Parking is available in designated parking spaces, leaving the streets in the area open for ingress and egress for emergency vehicles.

Rainbow Lake B.B.Q. and Fireworks Display. Starting at noon, chicken and

home baked pies will be served. Rainbow Lake is located on Luce Road, three miles south of 57, between Perrinton and Maple Rapids. All area residents and visitors are welcome to the B.B.Q. and community sponsored firework display in the evening.

Two Ovid volunteer staffed emergency services will sponsor the village fireworks display, beginning at 11 p.m., at the Leonard Elementary School. There will not be an admission charge for the event, but donations will be accepted.

The City and Township of DeWitt, as well as Bath Charter Township, will not be holding a fireworks display.

# Yankee Doodle Days comes to Grand Ledge

The Michigan Volunteer Seventh Infantry is coming.

But don't be alarmed — it's all part of the show, according to Wayne Withers, organizer of Grand Ledge's Yankee Doodle Days Parade, June 30.

The Waverly-based infantry unit, along with a cavalry unit and an artillery unit from Saginaw, will demonstrate a Civil War muster at Fitzgerald Park from 8 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. on Saturday.

Included in the muster will be mock battles, cavalry charges, a summary court martial and execution, "the whole shot," says Withers.

These units, Withers says, have been reactivated as demonstration units and have been sanctioned by the State.

"They have these all over the United States," says Withers.

But this is the first time one has been done in connection with the three-year-old Yankee Doodle Days celebration.

People will be allowed to wander through the camp at no admission charge and talk with the "enactors," as the participants are called.

The main emphasis of the muster is authenticity, says Withers.

To achieve this, the enactors "research everything and anything to do with the Civil War — diaries, newspapers, anything," he says.

Withers says he expects about 20 to 30 enactors to participate in the muster, and that they will take time out to join the parade that begins 11 a.m. June 30.

The parade will begin at Grand Ledge High School, proceed down Jenne Street

to South Bridge and then cross the bridge and move up to the fire barn before dispersing. Withers estimates the distance to be about one-and-a-half miles.

In connection with the muster, the T&T Trading Post will be selling such articles as musket-loading equipment and moccasins, and the Grand Ledge Long Rifles will set up a tent on Clark Road for a demonstration with flintlock rifles.

The muster, says Withers, is just one of the aspects of this year's Yankee Doodle Days that adds to the growth of the annual celebration.

He expects the parade to run about twice as long as last year's.

"We've come a long

ways in a short while," says Withers, noting that the Yankee Doodle Days parade has grown every year.

Among the new entries this year are: the Battle Creek Shrine Club Mini-T Club, which will present small model-T Ford cars; the Saladin Temple Memorial Band from Grand Rapids; the Elf Khurafeh Highlander Bagpipe Band from Davison; the Saladin Temple mini-500 Patrol, which will present 14 mini-race cars and a pace car, from Battle Creek; two twirling units from Bellevue, called Twinkling Star Twirlers and Shooting Star Twirlers; the Charlotte Frontier Days Queen; two Senior Citizen Kitchen Bands, from Charlotte and Grand Ledge; the Alma Highland

Festival Queen of Scots; and Lansing's Donald Rice and his Roaring Twenties Wurlitzer Organ.

Wothers also notes this year's Yankee Doodle Days raffle will award three prizes worth \$1,500 each. Lucky winners will receive \$500 worth of groceries at Carter's IGA, Felpausch and McNeil's, according to Withers. Tickets for the raffle are \$10 apiece.

Also new this year will be a flea market on W. River Street near the Masonic Temple, Withers says.

This year's celebration "has come along really well," says Withers, "and we're proud of it."

Should the people working on the Yankee Doodle Days Parade stop clowning

around?

Not if Nancy Block can help it.

Block's been working hard to organize a "Clown Alley" competition, which will involve "professional and semi-professional" clowns.

About 70 clowns are expected to compete in the "Whiteface," "Tramp-Hobo" and "Auguste" classes for trophies and cash prizes amounting to \$525 during the Saturday, June 30, parade, says Block.

In addition, Block explains, an overall award will be given at the end of the day for best clown.

The prize for that will be a carving of the famous clown, Emmet Kelly, carved and donated to Yankee Doodle Days by the late

Burr Parker of Grand Ledge, notes Block.

Judges for the event will include Eaton County Prosecutor Paul Berger, Channel 6 news personality Martha Dixon, clown-collector Kay Comport of the Grand Ledge Shopping Guide, and Reba Avenshine, community relations director for MacDonald's Restaurants.

"It's a feather in our cap (to have Clown Alley)," says Wayne Withers, organizer of the Yankee Doodle Days parade, "because we may be able to make it an annual event."

The main sponsor of the Clown Alley event is the Vernors Co., which donated over \$500 toward the total cost of \$900, says Block.

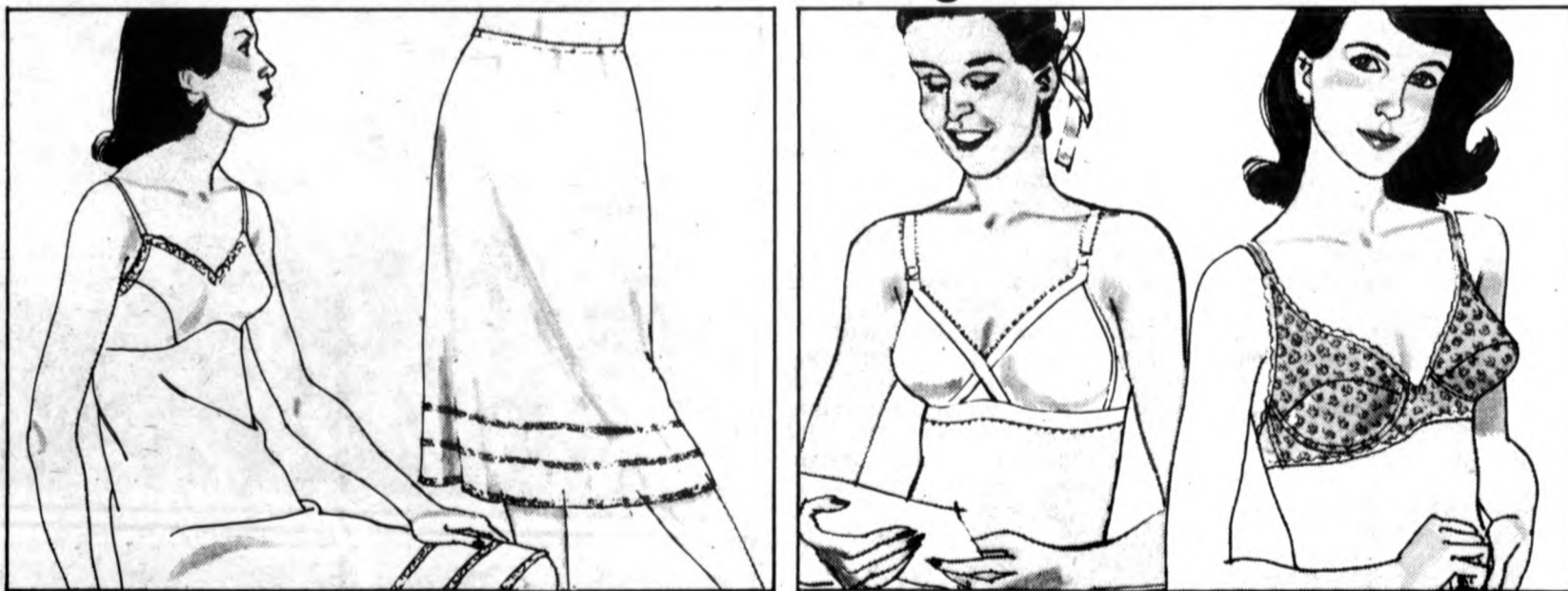

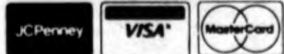

## Youth Corps deadline extended

The Michigan Employment Security Commission (MESC) is extending the application period for the Michigan Youth Corps an additional week, Monday, June 18, through Friday, June 22, to give all eligible young people a chance to apply, S. Martin Taylor, MESC Director, announced recently.

Taylor said, because the final legislation for the Youth Corps has not yet passed, the program has not received the publicity that it might have.

"As a result, we are extending the application process to ensure that every young person who wants to work has a chance for a Youth Corps job."

As time passes, due to delays in the passage of the legislation, a portion of the young people who have registered will get other jobs. This opens the door for other applications to get placed, Taylor said.

"I'm urging young people who may not have applied because they thought they may not have a chance to get a job, to come in and register next week."

Taylor said that MESC locations across the state will take applications up until the last minute, to ensure that a pool of eligible candidates is ready for immediate referral to jobs once the program is approved and the application period is over.

To qualify for the Youth Corps, young people must be unemployed Michigan residents, 18 to 21 years old.

Referrals for the Youth Corps jobs will not be on a first-come, first-served basis. Instead, hiring preference will be given to those from families where the principal wage earner is unemployed. In addition, older applications will be referred to jobs before

younger ones. MESC offices, including a local office at the Clinton County Intermediate School District office, will accept applications for the Youth Corps program during normal working hours from 8:15 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

## Flinn wins Ionia auto race again

Ionia's Bob Flinn continued his dominance of the Late Model Feature event at the Ionia County Speedway, out-distancing Gene Playter of Greenville to win the 25-lap (12.5 mile) auto race, held June 15.

In the 20-lap Sportsman Feature event, Eric Chant of St. Johns took first place, followed by Dennis Walker of Carson City. Ionia's Brian Bowerman managed a third-place finish in that event.

Rick Stout of Carson City won the 15-lap Street Stock Event, placing ahead of Larry and David Kyser, a pair of brothers from Cedar Springs who earned second and third place respectively.

The Flinn Stock Event, a regular 15-lap event at the Ionia Speedway, wasn't held on June 15, but is scheduled to resume each week hereafter.

The four classes of race cars compete each week at the Ionia County Speedway, located just south of I-96, exit 64 (Lake Odessa).

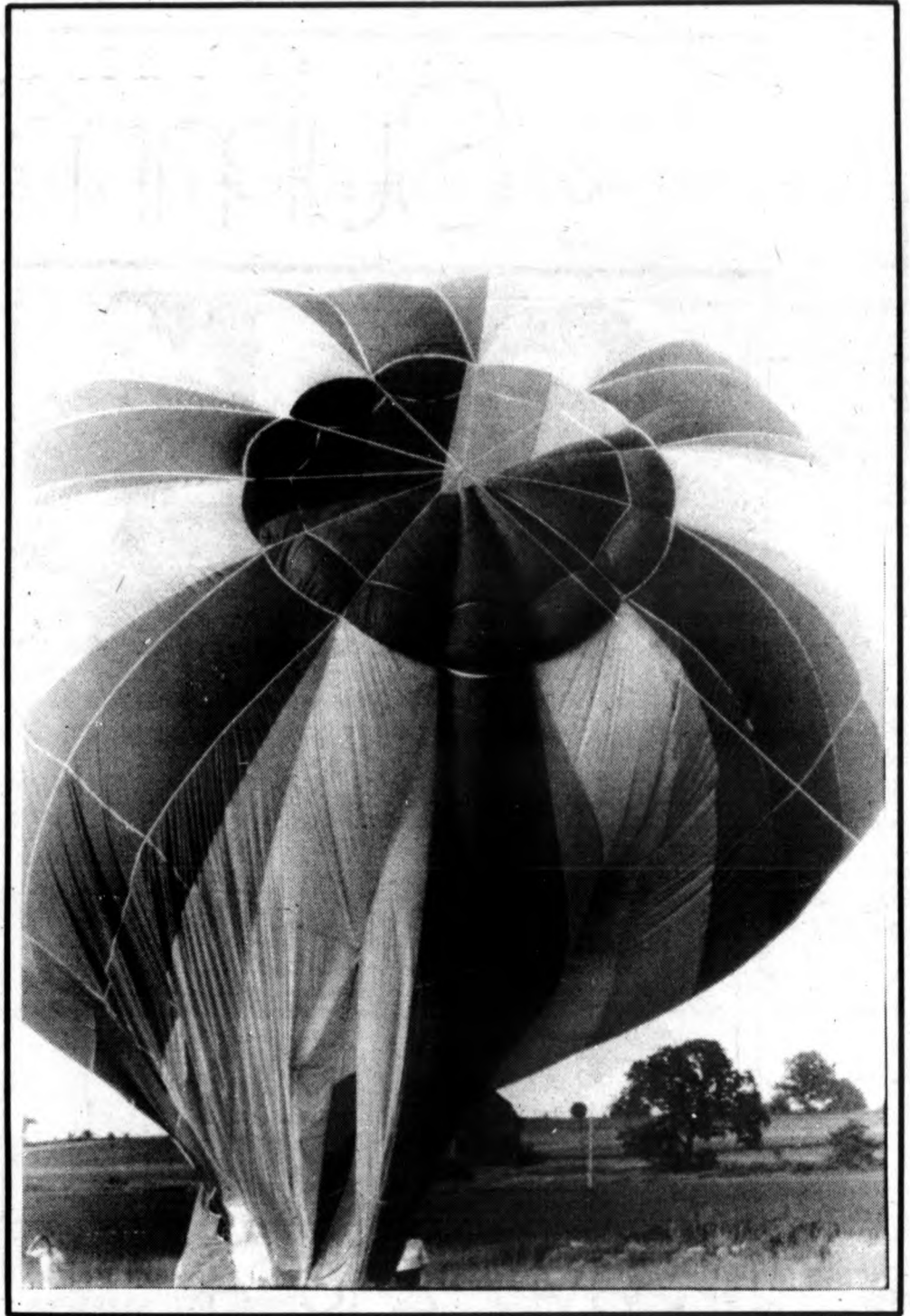

Moon and Phillips will be members of Alma's class of 1988, one of the classes which will be on campus during Alma's Centennial Year celebrations in 1986-1987. Their academic careers at Alma begin with a 10-day freshmen preterm/orientation from August 25 until Alma's Fall Term classes begin September 5.

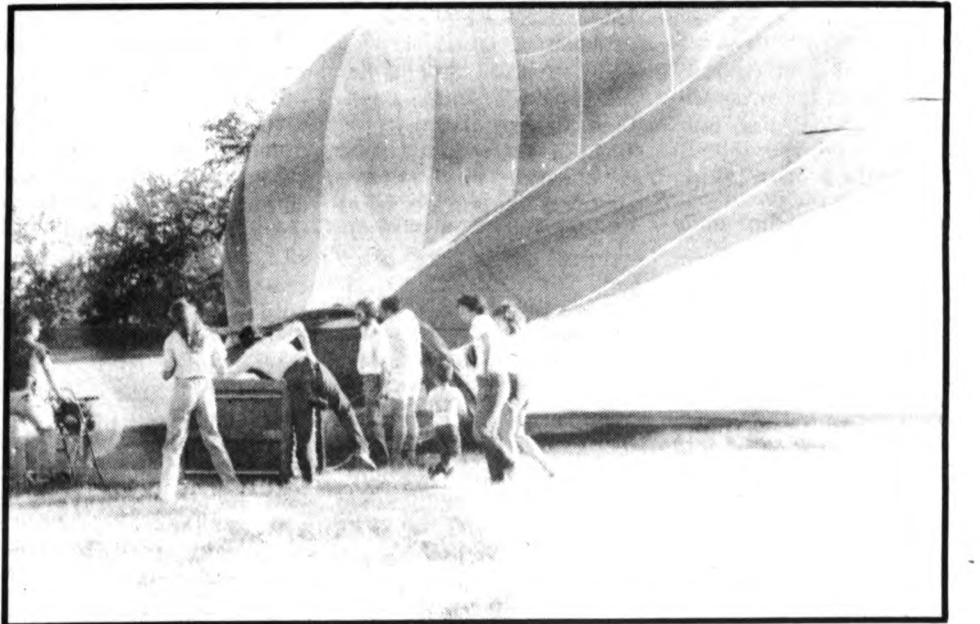

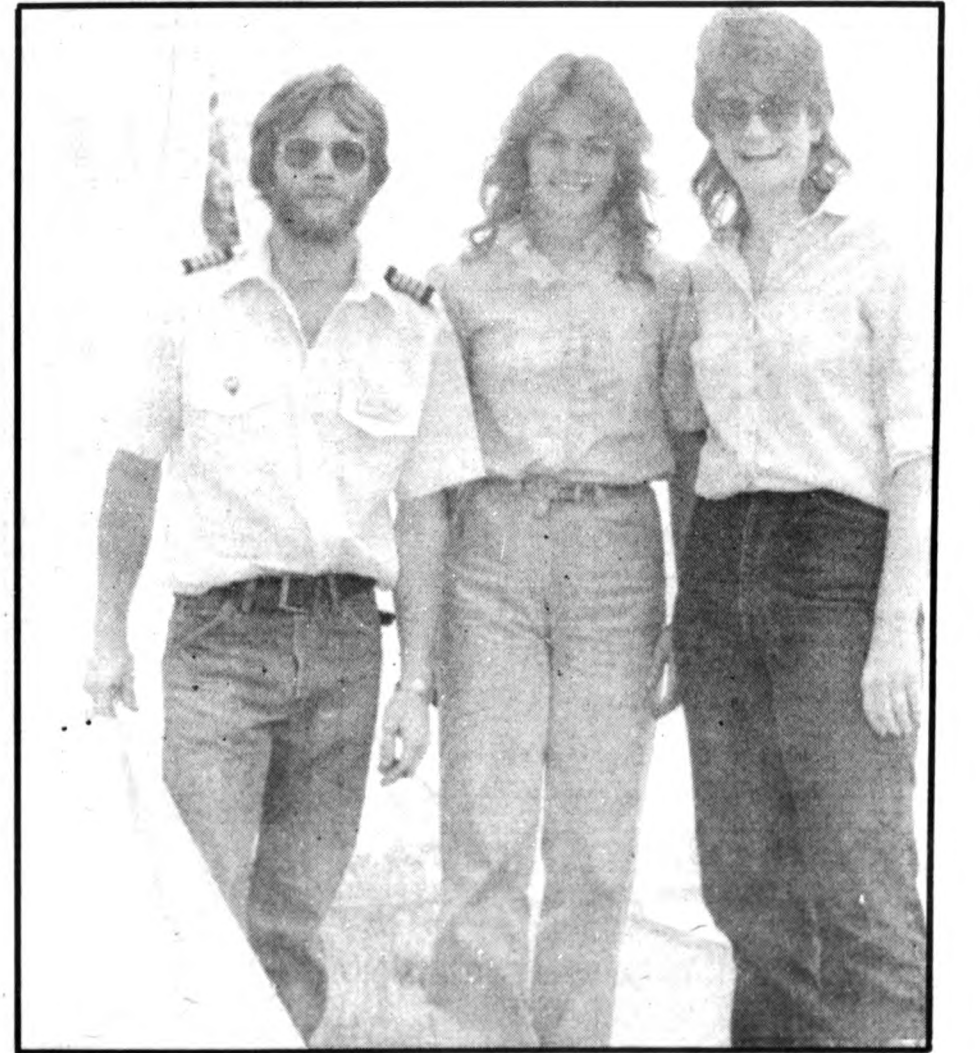
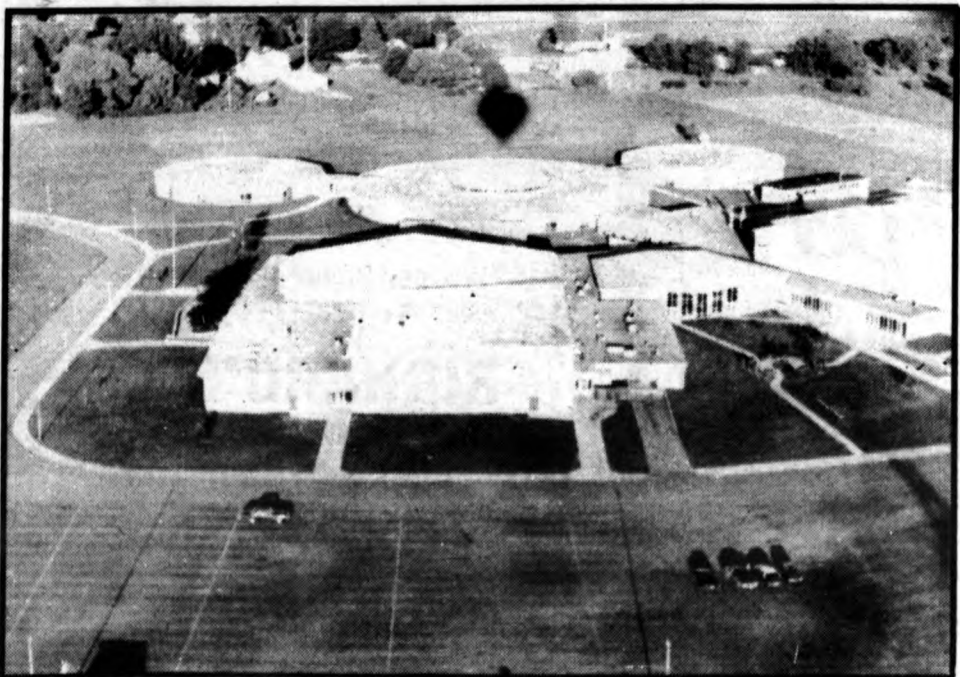

## Pest Control available to Clinton County residents

If you have an insect problem in your home, don't panic—not even termites can chew your house down around your ears overnight. Serious pest problems do not get better with time, however, so consult books, local pest control operators or the county Cooperative Extension Service to get the insect identified quickly.

The next step is to take corrective action. This may mean applying control measures yourself or hiring a pest control firm.

"Finding a reliable, reputable, licensed pest control organization could save you hundreds—even thousands—of dollars," says Gary Dunn, Extension entomologist at Michigan State University.

Consult several companies and get estimates, he suggests. Then check the credentials and references of the companies.

By law, all pest control firms in Michigan must be licensed and at least one employee must be tested and certified to apply pesticides.

Find out if the firm belongs to the Michigan and/or National Pest Control Association. Members ascribe to a code of ethics and generally try to keep up with the latest developments in the field.

Ask for references and check them out. And check the companies' reputation with the local Chamber of Commerce, Better Business Bureau or the Consumer Protection Division of the Michigan attorney general's office.

Certain practices and approaches should put you on your guard, Dunn says. Beware of the companies that:

- Stop by uninvited and offer a free inspection.
- Claim to have excess chemical left from another

job and offer a reduced rate if they can do the treatment immediately.

-Quote a treatment cost based on the gallons of material used.

-Claim to have a secret insect control formula.

-Do not have a listed telephone number.

-Want to trim trees and do general foundation repair work as part of the deal.

-Cater to elderly or infirm people who live alone.

-Claim to be endorsed by or affiliated with Michigan State University.

When you have your home inspected by a pest control firm, insist on a written report noting the location and severity of any infestations, the exact pest involved and the estimated cost for correcting the problem. The report may also note pest entryways, structural problems and sanitation practices contributing to the infestation.

"Be sure you understand the report," Dunn says. "Ask to see the pest or signs of its activity, and ask questions until you are sure you understand what the problem is, whether the estimate is a firm price and what the treatment will involve."

If you are uncertain about the inspection information, consult the Cooperative Extension Service office in your county for an unbiased opinion.

Before signing a pest control contract, be sure you read and understand all the provisions, including any type of guarantee. Find out what it covers, how long it lasts and what you must do to keep it in force. Be sure there are no blank spaces in the contract that could be filled in after you sign it.

Also find out whether you must vacate the premises to be treated, and for how long; and whether you'll

need to empty cupboards and remove pets or household articles.

"Pest control is a joint venture between the company and the customer," Dunn says. "You expect the company to know about the pest, choose the proper insecticide and apply it correctly to the right locations with the least possible inconvenience to you. You, on the other hand, must be willing to cooperate with the pest control operator and follow suggestions on sanitation and repairs and other corrective measures."

Immediately after treatment, you may notice a flurry of increased insect activity. If after several days you still detect damage or signs of infestation, call the company and discuss your observations. A reputable firm will take whatever steps are necessary to insure you are satisfied with the job and to preserve its reputation.

If you think the treatment was ineffective or damaged your property or belongings and you cannot come to an agreement with the firm on correcting the situation, you have the option of filing a civil suit. If you do this, be sure you have a copy of your contract. And keep notes on everything the firm's representative tells you after you have brought your complaint to his attention.

If you think your family's health or safety has been endangered by improper use of pesticides, you may file a complaint with the Consumer Protection Division of the attorney general's office.

Your complaint will go from there to the Michigan Department of Agriculture's Plant Industry for investigation.

## Farm Equipment choice important

Selecting the right equipment for various farm jobs can help farmers increase production efficiency and keep costs down.

Farmers can make the equipment selection process more efficient, too, by attending Ag. Expo '84, the largest farm equipment show of its kind in Michigan.

The event, July 26-28 at Michigan State University, features nearly 40 acres of farm equipment and displays. Visitors will be able to see just about every type of machinery and supplies needed to help improve farm production efficiency.

William Bickert, MSU Extension agricultural engineer and Ag. Expo chairperson, says the machinery displays will represent almost every mechanized area in a typical farm operation. Examples include irrigation systems; field machinery; dairy equipment and supplies; livestock handling equipment; grain harvesting, handling and storage systems; sprayers; buildings; and seed and fertilizer supplies and services.

"This complete machinery exhibition will allow farmers to see the latest machinery on the market and enable them to compare systems," Bickert says.

The Ag. Expo '84 site is near the intersection of

Farm Lane and Mt. Hope Road, close to central campus. Free shuttle buses will operate between the main exhibit site and field demonstrations that will be conducted during the three-day event.

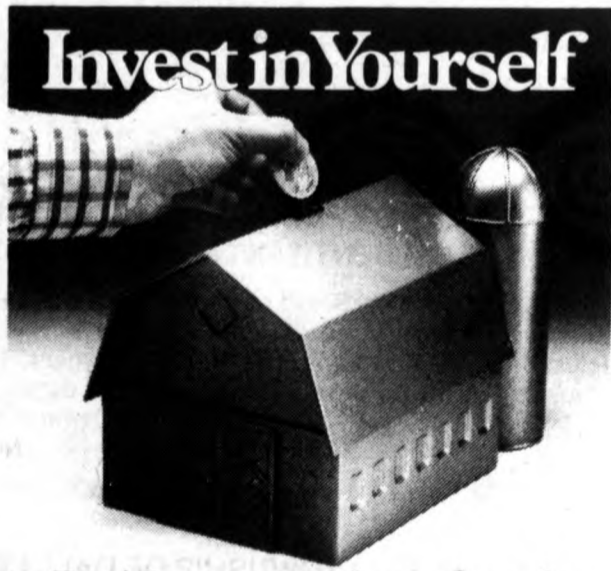

## Safe roads expected for 4th of July

While Michigan tourism operators can expect a 4 to 7 percent jump in business during the Fourth of July week, that increase should not result in major traffic jams on state highways, reports the Automobile Club of Michigan.

"The reason is this 30-hour holiday falls on a Wednesday, keeping long distance travel during that period to a minimum," said Auto Club's Travel Operations Manager James Drury.

Drury added that the busiest travel periods headed north will be on the Fridays before and after July 4, with southbound traffic expected to be heavy both Sundays surrounding the holiday. In addition, a surge of traffic will head home from resort areas Monday, July 9.

Advance reservations

and inquiries for recreational and travel activity for the 30 hour period indicate that campgrounds, day-use parks and recreational sites should do brisk businesses, with few turn away crowds due to the mid week holiday.

The Michigan Department of Transportation estimates motorists will log 300 million miles on state roads during the 30 hour July 4th holiday, 7 percent more than the 280 million miles driven during the last 30 hour period in 1979. Over the last 78 hour Memorial Day weekend, state motorists traveled 720 million miles.

The holiday officially runs from 6 p.m. Tuesday, July 3, to midnight Wednesday, July 4.

An Auto Club check of 10 resort area chambers of commerce shows eight ex-

pect heavy activity, most notably from July 4th through Sunday. Many resort area motels contacted reflected that same trend.

Many private campgrounds should fill for the holiday, but space is expected for campers in all areas of the state.

Heaviest state park campground pressure is expected the weekend following July 4 although the entire week should be busy. Parks expecting to be busiest include those in Southeast Michigan and along the Lake Michigan shore.

The last 30 hour July 4 holiday occurred in 1979, when 12 persons died on Michigan roads. Of the nine at-fault drivers, eight were known or suspected

of drinking.

The Auto Club points out that the most dangerous place to drive this holiday will be in familiar surroundings. All of the drivers involved in fatal accidents over the 1979 July 4 holiday were within 25 miles of home. None of those killed in cars was wearing a seat belt.

Twenty-two persons died over the 78 hour July 4th holiday last year.

For the 20th year, the Auto Club's "Bring 'Em Back Alive!" Holiday News Service will provide hourly traffic and tourism bulletins to more than 165 Michigan radio stations. The service will operate from 3:15 to 11 p.m. Tuesday, July 3, and 8:15 a.m. to 11 p.m. Wednesday, July 4.

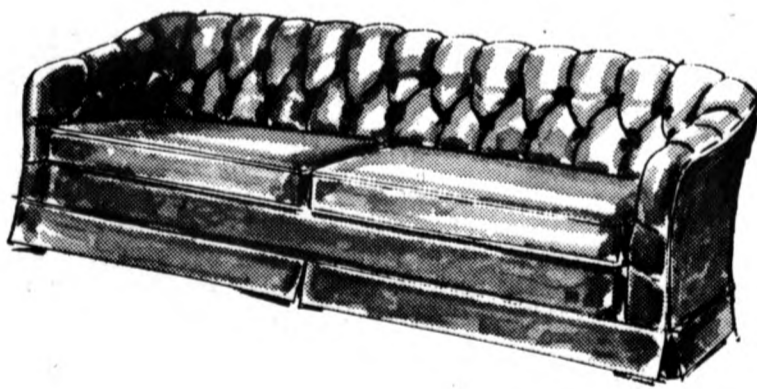

you need it, and want it, the final results are well worth it."

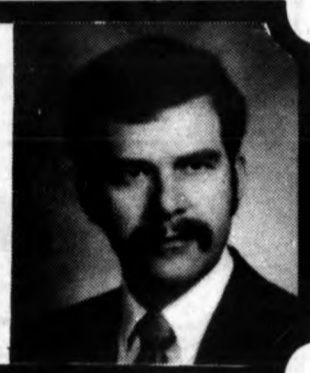
This fall, the couple would like to continue their education by enrolling in some computer classes through the Community Education program.

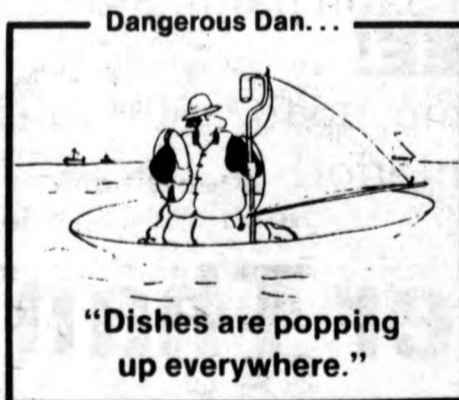

The largest single private gift in the University of California's 116-year history has been received from the Marion O. Hoffman Trust for creation of the world's largest and most powerful telescope—a UC project being planned for construction on Mauna Kea, a 14,000-foot peak on the Big Island of Hawaii.

Astronomers believe the

powerful telescope will open new windows on the Universe. It will enable them to begin to unravel mysteries that before remained just out of reach. It will be possible for the first time to see faint distant objects as they once were, near the beginning of the Universe, to look at stars, solar system and galaxies in the process of formation and to engage in other exciting discoveries.

**Studies Prove Ersatz Aspirin Easy on Stomach**

Acetaminophen, an aspirin substitute marketed under brand names such as Tylenol and Datril, protects the stomach lining from the damaging effects of aspirin and alcohol, physicians at the UCSD School of Medicine have shown.

A study published in a recent issue of *Gastroenterology* showed a significant decrease in damage induced by aspirin and ethanol in subjects who first took acetaminophen.

**Learning and Memory**

A University of California, Santa Barbara biopsychologist is investigating the possibility that a hormone secreted by the pituitary gland may stimulate learning and memory functions of the human brain.

Aaron Ettenberg, assistant professor of biopsychology, has a faculty research grant to study the effect of the hormone called "vasopressin" on the learning and memory of laboratory rats.

**Dream vacation becomes reality**

**Area couple joins caravan of antique automobiles**

"We're taking a 500 mile trip and we're taking the family car," said Clifford Oles, of St. Johns. "It's been my dream to drive my car to the bridge and now we're going to do it."

On June 29th, Clifford and Barbara Oles will join three other area couples in a caravan of antique cars making their way to the Mackinac Bridge.

For Oles, this is the longest trip he has made in their 1920 Oakland. He said he thinks the trip will take 12 hours to get there, traveling at an average speed of 22-25 miles an hour.

"I'm hoping the car will make it with no problem," he said. "It's been driven

approximately 2,000 miles since the car has been finished and we haven't had a problem."

Oles owned the car for more than 15 years before finishing the restoration in 1977. Altogether, he and his wife traveled in 18 states looking for the Oakland parts.

"I had always wanted a show car," he said. "Everybody said I was never going to get it together. But now I've proved it."

Oles put the entire six cylinder car together by himself, while his wife researched the automobile for authenticity. In the first car show they entered in 1977, they won first place for having the Best Show Car. Out of 100 points, the car received 98 and one

quarter from the judges of the exhibit, an event Oles described as both exciting and disappointing.

"When we won, it took most of the fun away," he said. "I never expected to get top honors the first time around. It was like there was nothing more to do for the car. We did it all the first time. So I decided I wanted to go on a vacation with it. Now we're doing it."

According to Oles, his restored Oakland is only one of three that exists in the United States. He said it's that kind of exclusiveness that is appealing to him.

"If not many people have it," he said, "I want it. And if someone says I can't do it, I'll prove I can."

Oles, a diesel mechanic by trade, has currently began restoration work on his newest project, a 1933 Reo. He said this will be approximately the 14th car he has worked on since his wife bought him his first one for a wedding present 26 years ago. He expects it

will take up to five years to totally restore the four-door elite car to its original condition.

## Outdoors By Dick Bradley

There are a dozen things that sneak up on us during June, like the overnight lengthening of the lawn. When we relent to the mower and go into the shed or the garage to fetch it, the breeze takes that moment to mischievously swirl the last dry leaves that have taken refuge there. The hammock stretched coolly, comfortably, will have to wait for chores.

I don't mean so much those kinds of things, or painting jobs or trimming hedges or pruning. Those are always with us. I mean the things of nature that June always brings. Like the first mixtures of hot and wet that make things grow, bugs and plants and creatures alike. That make the dog's tongues hang out and cause them to find the shady spots. I mean the steamy times that make the does and their fawns lie down in tall green ferns, ears twitching against the pesky flies.

Have you noticed? Have you seen the wheat, already tall with swelling heads, about to change to that special shade of copper-gold that only belongs to a wheat field? But the humid evenings come too, and we must take a refuge now behind a screen to talk quietly of the progress of our gardens. We watch the first blinking fireflies and we listen to the patterns of the lawn sprinkler against leaves and house. If the lights are bright around us, we hear the drone, the bumping and the clicking of a thousand insects against those

sheltering screens. The junebugs, the moths, the beetles and of course, the mosquitoes are common. If we've not been vigilant with a spray around the edges of screen doors and other ports of entry, we feel the sting of an occasional intruder.

But it all goes with the season — the season that we spend most of the rest of the year yearning for.

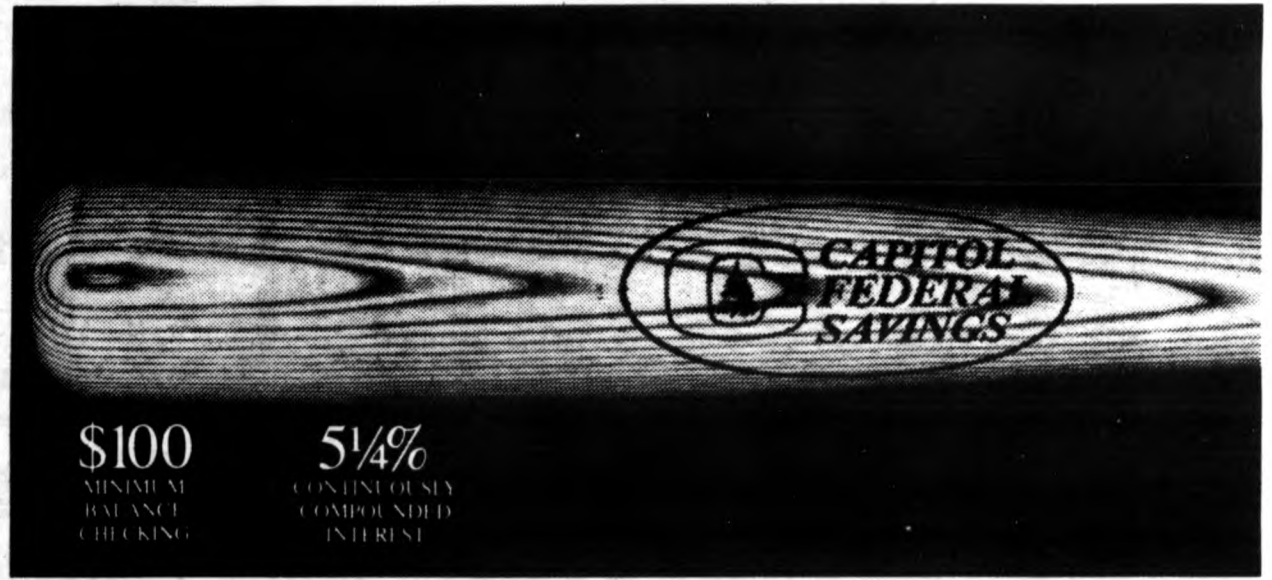

# IRS examination July deadline announced

This year, applications must be postmarked no later than July 31, for individuals who wish to take the 1984 Internal Revenue Service Special Enrollment Examination, the IRS announced recently. No extensions of time to file for the examination will be granted.

The examination is scheduled to take two days: Monday and Tuesday, September 24 and 25. It is given annually in each IRS district to individuals

who wish to apply for enrollment to practise before the IRS.

The application fee is \$50 for those taking all four parts of the examination, and \$40 for prior year examinees taking fewer than four parts. All checks or money orders must be made payable to the Internal Revenue Service.

Those interested in taking the examination should obtain the Special Enrollment Examination Ap-

plication Packet from their local IRS district office. The packet includes materials on the requirements for enrollment and on the requirements for taking the examination. The examination will include true or false, multiple choice and problem-type questions that require some computations.

The packet includes Form 2587, "Application for Special Enrollment Examination;" Publication 486, "Requirements for IRS Enrollment and

Special Enrollment Examination;" Publication 693, "Questions and Answers-1983 Special Enrollment Examination Sample Booklet;" Treasury Department Circular No. 230, "Regulations Governing the Practice of Enrolled Agents;"

Publication 1140, "Special Enrollment Examination Background Material for Applicants;" Publication 1183, "Rules for Tax Returns Preparers;" and Form 4190A, a special order form for requesting Special Enrollment Examination Study

Materials.

The Special Enrollment Examination Application Packet can be ordered by calling 1-800-424-1040, extension 6080 or 7227, Training Branch, Internal Revenue Service.

## Tax office solves problems

Taxpayers with an "unsolved" federal tax problem can get help from a special Internal Revenue Service office. It is called the Problem Resolution Program (PRP) office, and it gives personal attention to taxpayers when previous contacts through normal IRS channels have not helped, the IRS said recently.

For example, if a taxpayer's expected refund has not arrived after 10 to 12 weeks, he or she should first contact IRS Taxpayer Service with the problem. An assistor will help the taxpayer, find out what is happening to the return, and let the taxpayer know when to expect the refund. If the refund has not arrived by that date, the taxpayer should contact PRP. Once PRP takes the problem, the taxpayer deals with one person and is kept

informed of the progress of the case, according to the IRS.

The most common complaints brought to Problem Resolution are about delayed refunds. Sometimes these are caused by incorrect or duplicated Social Security numbers, the IRS said, or by taxpayers who change their names - after marriage, for example - and do not inform the Social Security Administration. Taxpayers who move after filing a return without providing a forwarding address may also have their refunds delayed.

The IRS stressed that PRP is not a substitute for normal IRS channels and cannot be used to appeal technical decisions in an audit. The PRP office usually takes complaints only after there has been at least one unsuccessful con-

tact with the IRS.

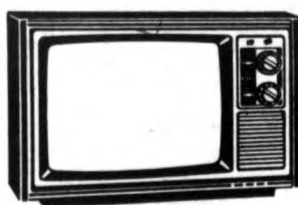

# Savings Bonds rise to highest level in state

The total value of United States Savings Bonds held by Americans rose to its highest level since September 1980, \$72.7 billion, in May. The value of Bonds outstanding has increased five percent in the last 12 months, rising more than \$3.3 billion from last May.

Sales of Series EE Bonds in May were reported at \$351 million. Sales for the first five months of this year amounted to \$1.8 billion. Reported redemptions in May were \$286 million, 11 percent below last May's \$322 million. Redemptions for the first five months of 1984 were \$2.7 billion.

New Series EE Bonds, and most older Series EE and E Bonds and Savings Notes, earn market-based interest when held five years or longer from their date of issue or their first interest-accrual period on or after November 1, 1982,

whichever is later. The rate is 85 percent of the five-year Treasury marketable securities rate for the six months preceding each market-based period. The latest market-based rate, effective from May 1, 1984 through October 31, 1984, is 9.95 percent. When combined with the previous market-based rates - 11.9 percent from November 1982 to April 1983, 8.64 percent from May to October 1983 and 9.38 percent from November 1983 to April 1984 - the average is part of the market-based formula only for eligible bonds issued on or before April 30, 1983.

Bond holdings represent debt that does not have to be financed in the open market at higher interest and administrative costs. Savings Bonds save the Treasury, and taxpayers, more than \$2.5 billion annually in interest costs on the debt.
