# Prosecutors office has a race

### Bob Steinman

Bob Steinman has announced his candidacy for the position of Prosecuting Attorney for Clinton County in the August, 1984 primary election.

As a county resident for the past 11 years, Steinman says he knows and understands the problems in bringing offenders to justice. "My extensive administrative experience in both state and local government, as well as my experience as an attorney has provided me with a sound background to serve as your prosecutor. If elected I can offer the citizens of Clinton County the kind of leadership and professionalism which they deserve from our prosecutor."

Steinman attended Michigan State University where he earned bachelor's and master's degrees. He graduated from Thomas M. Cooley Law School in 1978.

After receiving his honorable discharge from the United States Army, Steinman settled in Clinton County and became an active member of his community. He served as a Clinton County Commissioner; Clinton County Circuit Court Probation/Parole Agent; Township and Tri-County Planning Commission member; Special Olympics Volunteer; Little League Coach; Big Brother and Foster Parent. He is a current member of Paine-Scott-Gillman Museum Advisory Board; a Director on the Clinton-Eaton-Ingham Community Mental Health Board;

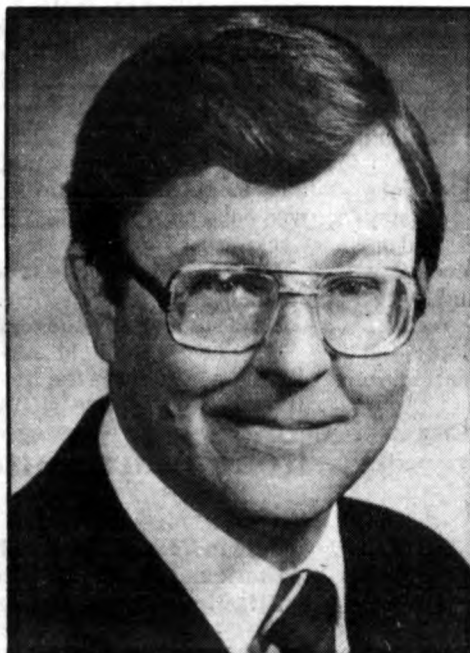

Township Public Safety Committee; Knights of Columbus, American Legion and law related associations.

Bob and his wife, Colleen, reside in DeWitt and attend St. Judes Catholic Church.

"I believe as an active and hard working prosecutor, I can more effectively bring criminals to justice and at the same time provide citizens of Clinton County savings in the costs of prosecution. In

short, I intend to be a hard working prosecutor who actually prosecutes criminal cases in court. I believe that I can renew a positive relationship with the County Board of Commissioners and represent the County in matters which will save the taxpayers the expense of hiring outside attorneys."

Steinman announced the selection of John Hopko of St. Johns as his Committee Treasurer.

### Jon Newman

Clinton County Prosecutor Jon Newman has announced he will seek re-election in 1984. Newman has served as Prosecutor since 1971.

At the present time his office initiates approximately 1,200 criminal cases each year. Newman's office is also responsible for proceedings involving commitment of the mentally ill, juvenile delinquency, child abuse and neglect, and serves as attorney to all county officials and boards.

In 1972, Newman obtained a grant to make his office the first to undertake a concerted effort to locate missing parents and obtain child support orders whenever the other parent is receiving welfare. This program has proven so successful that it has spread across the state.

Newman is past president of the Prosecuting Attorneys Association of Michigan, and serves on the group's Board of Directors. He represents the Association on the Governing Council of the Criminal Law Section of the State Bar of Michigan.

After graduating from Okemos High School, Newman obtained his Bachelor's degree from Michigan State University and Juris Doctor from Wayne State University Law School.

He was employed by the Governor's Crime Commission and as an Assistant Prosecutor before becoming Prosecutor.

Newman lives in St. Johns with his wife, Marilyn, and three school age children, Emily, Sarah and Matthew. They are members of the First Congregational Church of St. Johns. Newman and his wife Marilyn have been involved in numerous community activities. Newman is presently a member of the St. Johns Rotary Club, Clinton County Council for the Prevention of Child Abuse, and St. Johns Lodge No. 105, F.&A.M., where he is a Past Master.

# Sheriff won't seek reelection

Clinton County Sheriff Anthony A. Hufnagel has announced he will not be seeking re-election. Sheriff Hufnagel will complete his third four-year term at the end of this year.

He began his career in 1966 as a dispatch/corrections officer for the county, rising through the ranks to undersheriff in 1972, under long-time Sheriff P.J. Patterson. Upon Patterson's retirement in 1972, Hufnagel ran a successful campaign for the office which he has held since.

Hufnagel said he has worked hard to maintain integrity of the Sheriff's office and to provide a well trained professional

staff to serve the needs of the public. He said his philosophy has always been a, "Common Sense," approach to people's problems. As a fiscal conservative, he noted the most challenging issues he faced as Sheriff were the jail inadequacies and the violations of the State Jail Codes. He said these issues will continue to plague any incoming sheriff.

Hufnagel says he leaves the office with mixed emotions, knowing most of his goals have been attained, yet changing careers after 18 years creates some apprehensions. When asked about future

plans, he said his skills, education, training and 18 years of hands-on experience have given him a diverse management background. He will be seeking an area where those can be used.

Commenting on reasons for not running, the Sheriff said, "Being basically a private person, I feel at this point in my life, I need the change." Politics have changed, campaigning costs have increased beyond reasonable limits as compared to an elected officers wages, and it is probably time someone else led the fight, he added.

# SJ Board considers bond issue

The St. Johns Board of Education met Jan. 25 to discuss the proposed bond issue. The Board agreed to apply for the preliminary qualifications of bonds by the Superintendent for the purpose of financing a new proposed elementary school.

The bond optimum worth is set for \$3.95 million. The worth of the bond could be less depending on how much the district would actually need to build the school. The estimate given for building the new school was \$2.7 million. Equipment for the new school would cost approximately \$250,000.

Cost estimates to renovate other schools were: Swegles at \$32,000; East Olive at \$52,600; East Essex at \$40,000; Eureka at \$29,000; and Riley at \$76,300. For new equipment for the old schools an estimate was set at \$33,000. Site development costs were listed at: the new building, \$330,000; Swegles, \$10,000; East Olive, East Essex and Riley, \$30,000 each; and Eureka, \$50,000.

The board agreed to meet Feb. 1 to discuss in detail the new proposed school.

"I feel we're over building," stated one Board member.

## Victory is 'bittersweet'

To the Editor:

I've been reading articles about pollution in our environment with great interest, especially the one on Monday, Jan. 2, in the Lansing St. Journal — Hazardous sites raise public ire. I am writing as a member of a local citizens group which has been "fighting in the trenches" because of the existence of an improper site. I fully agree with the statement that the regulatory agencies are inept and have poor regulation policies. I submit the following episode as one example of their inadequacies.

In March 1981, the citizens in the area of the Granger Landfill became concerned when they learned that the landfill (a former township dump) had been receiving

hazardous waste. When the landfill owner applied for an extension of time to operate the landfill, the citizens organized and attended many public meetings to present their viewpoints and concerns. A group of engineering experts within the group did extensive research on the past, present and future impact of the landfill. The conclusion drawn by the citizens was that the site should be closed, because the soils and water table found at the site were totally inadequate for any type of landfilling operation. Their findings were simply ignored.

Now, three years after our initial statement that the landfill is not safe, the DNR has issued an order to the owner to close the site because it is not geologically safe and cannot meet state law standards.

The citizens' efforts cost their organization over \$50,000 in legal fees.

As one of the many who has spent innumerable hours on the issues raised at this site and many hours raising badly needed funds, I find victory at this time a bittersweet experience. I feel relieved that our initial conclusions are being enforced, but feel also that the \$50,000 plus debt should have been avoided. The bill should be forwarded to the DNR and Clinton County for payment in full.

lead and maintaining it throughout the game.

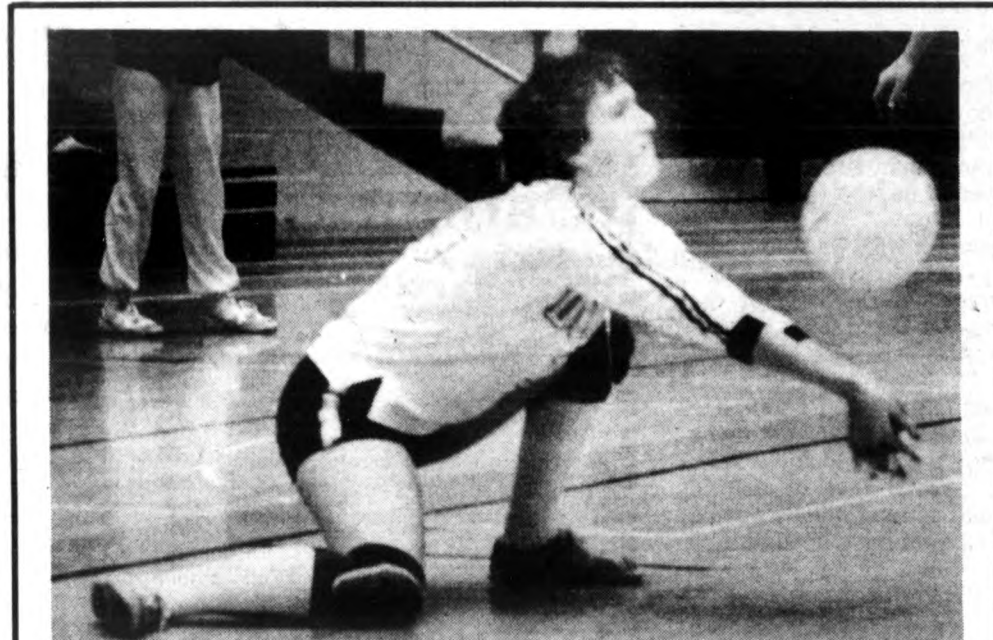
