## County to get new taxi service

If all goes as planned, Clinton County should be getting a new taxi service in a couple of weeks.

Jean and Roger Lupnitz, of DeWitt, would like to set up their business, L and H Family Cab, headquartered in a building beside Capitol Equipment on US 27 in DeWitt by the end of January.

"I'm really doing this for my father," says Jean Lupnitz. "He had a cab company, Family Cab, in Branch County, and it was his life. He gave his life to that company. He died a year ago and I would like to carry on with what he started." Lupnitz has had to wait until now to continue with her father's dream because of legal tie-ups with his estate.

So far, the L and H Family Cab Company, the L and H coming from the initials of Lupnitz' father, Leo Hoag, is still pretty much in a planning stage. An office site has been

selected, on US 27, north of DeWitt, but the taxi company still has to deal with the regulations imposed on cab companies, hire employees, and even buy the cabs. L and H cabs probably won't be the classic boxy Checker-made taxis, says Lupnitz, but they will be "nice looking vehicles" when some kind of deal is worked out. Lupnitz would also like to have a van in her taxi fleet, for handicapped and larger carpools or parties.

"I talked with senior citizens and I kind of took a survey around and they were very excited," says Lupnitz of one of her company's potential fare-groups. She hopes to be able to charge special reduced senior citizen and handicapped rates. "All kinds of customers" are the ones L and H will be serving she says. Lupnitz sees carpooling Oldsmobile workers, teenagers without cars, seniors, handicapped, and really just anyone who needs to get

somewhere but doesn't have means of transportation as potential Family Cab users.

One special type of customer Lupnitz hopes to serve with her cab company is the drunk driver. "Once we start in operation there will be no excuse for that in this county," says Lupnitz of drunk driving, which she sees as an all too common problem in

the area. Lupnitz had originally wanted to start L and H on New Year's Eve, with three free hours of transportation for anyone unable to safely drive home. But the red tape of setting up a small business, especially a business as regulated as a cab company, was a little too tangled, so Lupnitz looks forward to providing the service next year.

L and H Family Cab, while setting up its resources, is also currently appearing before township and city governments around the county seeking permission to operate within the limits of each. The DeWitt City Council, in its Dec. 17 meeting, has tentatively granted permission for L and H to operate in DeWitt, based on review by City Attorney Dan Matson to

see if an ordinance governing the taxi company's operation is needed. Lupnitz will be appearing before the St. Johns City Council, DeWitt Township Board, and Bath Township Board, later this month.

L and H Family Cabs will be radio-dispatched and the company will be needing between three and four employees, says Lupnitz.

## P-W Players perform Harvey

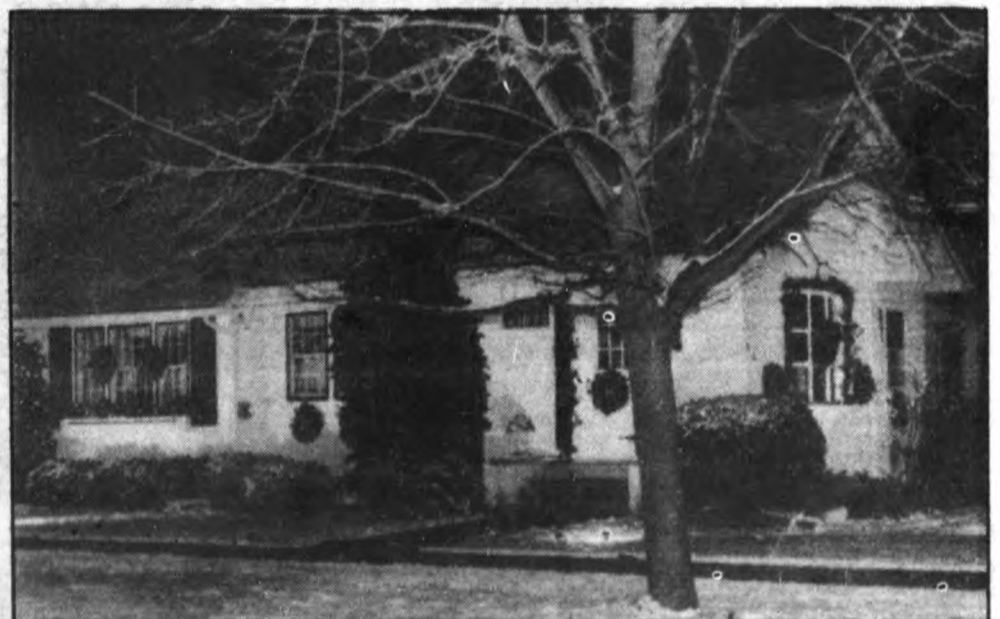

on the east side of the building.

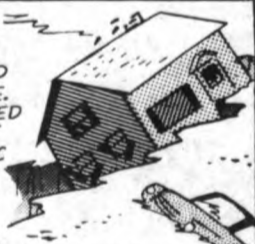
The two offices were previously located at 100 S. Ottawa. Phone numbers for the organizations will remain the same.

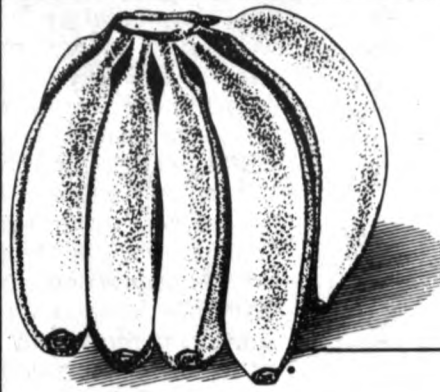

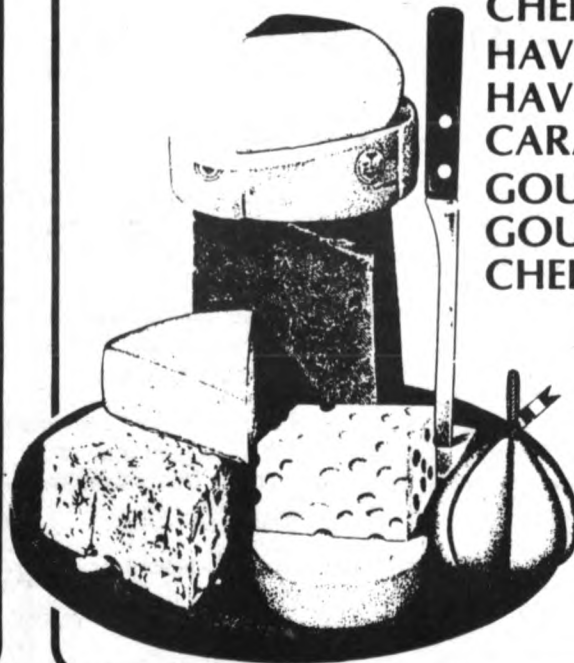

## SJ driver Patterson wins state fan club's Achievement Award

St. Johns auto racer Kris Patterson will be adding another award to his already formidable heap of Michigan auto racing honors January 19.

Patterson has been selected as 1984's Achievement Award recipient by the board of directors of the Michigan Automobile Racing Fan Club. The award is presented annually by the MARFC to the person who has achieved the most in Michigan auto racing. "Patterson's success in winning three championships this year makes this award deserving and justified," said Bill Stone, MARFC president.

Patterson captured his third Michigan Speedway Promoters Association point series championship in 1984. He also holds the track record at most of the small tracks in Michigan, as well as being the recognized champion at the Ionia and Owosso tracks, to name a few.

The MARFC's Achievement Award will be presented to Patterson at the club's 19th annual dinner and awards banquet, Jan. 19 at the Warren Chateau, Warren, Michigan.

Earlier in 1984, Patterson earned the honor of appearing on the cover of Dick Lee's 1984 Michigan Auto Racing Yearbook. He was selected because of an outstanding 1983 track record. Here is what journalist Lee had to say about Patterson:

"Only one racer stood over and above everyone else in Michigan in '83 and that was young Kris Patterson of St. Johns. Winning the MSPA championship for the second straight season, Kris now has nine MSPA feature wins, more than anyone else. Six of these feature wins came in 1983 when he dominated the dirt late model

races. In addition, Kris won the season point championship at Ionia County Speedway, Owosso, and was leading at Hartford till the track closed. '83 also brought new track records for Kris at Ionia (20.61), Owosso (19.23) and Whittemore (14.50). Merritt's Coke Invitational was also captured by Patterson. Not only does he win consistently, but also spectacularly. Anyone who witnessed the Merritt MSPA race this year will never forget how Patterson hounded Tom

Rosebrugh the entire feature and then coming out of turn four on the last lap Kris put his yellow number zero on the bottom of the track and won by inches.

"The story of Kris Patterson should end with his victories, but it doesn't, because when you get to know Kris personally, you find that he possesses a warm, outgoing personality that immediately wins you over. Most race drivers are tough to get information from, but Kris Patterson is the ideal representative, not only a winner, but articulate, handsome and married to Debby, who is pretty enough to have been selected as a queen for the World 100 at Eldora. Kris has that unique quality of being refreshingly honest and always comes on straight. Some drivers seemed bored after a feature win, but Kris is always enthusiastic, and welcomes fans in his pit area afterwards. If you have never met Kris, do so this season, because Kris is on his way and it couldn't happen to a nicer guy. "For the above reasons, Kris Patterson comes to my mind as the outstanding Michigan racer of the year and therefore was chosen for the cover."

One O-E and Saint Johns hoopster each were named to the all league second team. Senior Lori Ross of O-E and Pam Sehlke of St.

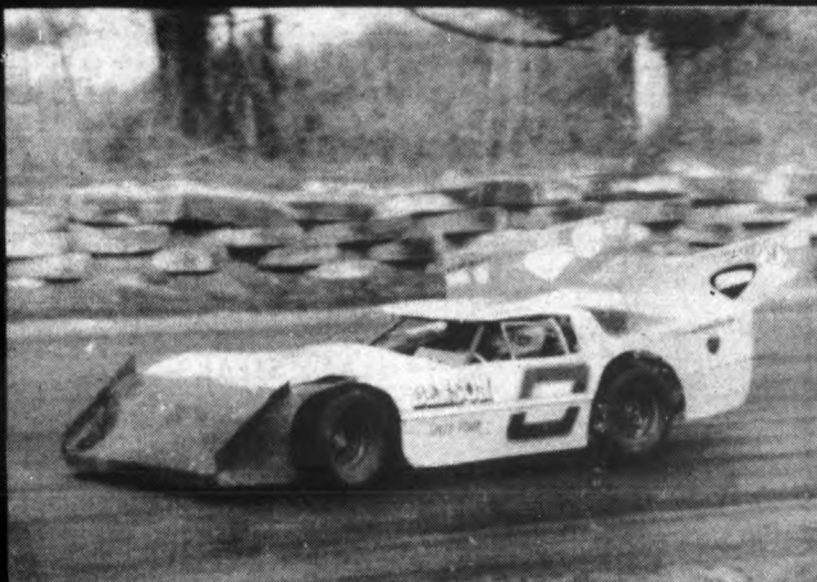
Johns were named along with Chesaning cagers Maureen Gengler and Cheryl Kruske and Ionia's Tracy Stoakes for second team honors.

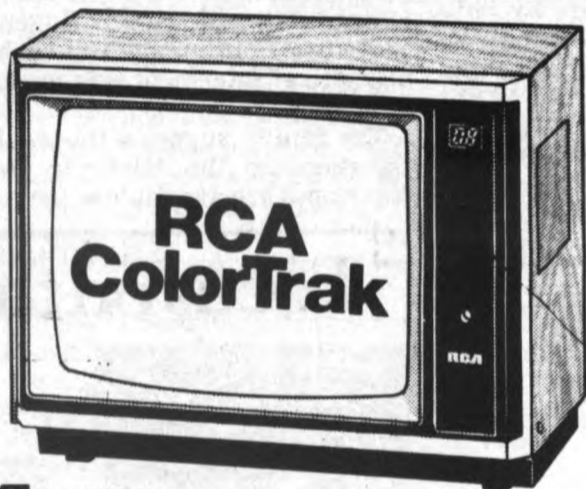

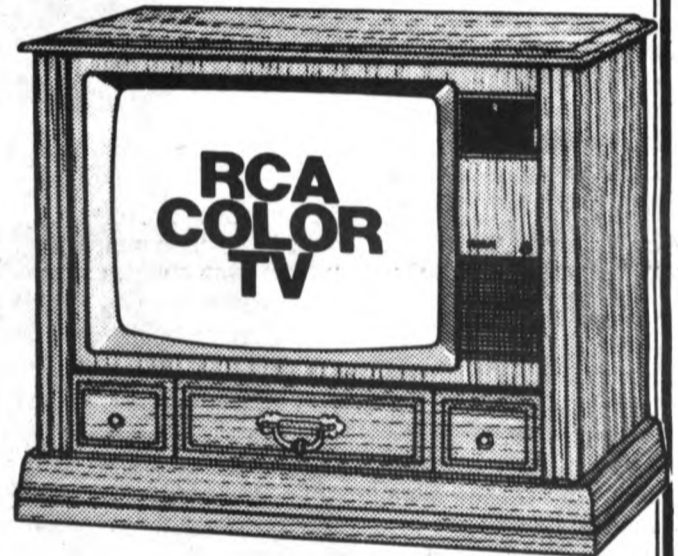

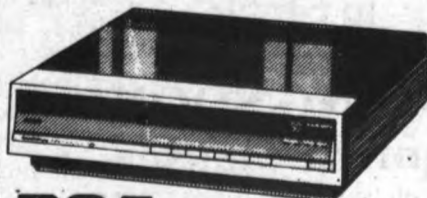

# Historic DeWitt

Chief Okemos

Among the most well-known Indians of the mid-Michigan region was Chief Okemos of the Chippewa. Although he was a more familiar sight to the early pioneers of the Lansing area, he reportedly favored the hunting grounds of the upper Looking Glass river valley to that of the Grand.

On December 5, 1858, Okemos, along with the remnants of his once proud tribe of Chippewa, were at a seasonal encampment several miles upriver from DeWitt (near where Chandler Road crosses the Looking Glass) when the aged warrior took sick and died. His mourning tribesmen wrapped his body and placed it, along with his few other precious personal items which would be needed in the afterlife, upon a sled. Forming a procession, they began the long trip to the sacred burial grounds at Pe-Shimnecon (near the present city of Portland).

Many histories and personal essays have been written of the death of Okemos and the procession that followed. Some differ in details but most agree on the basic format of the event. Judging from the numerous accounts which survive to the present it is obvious that the event, if not all the details, was unforgettable for those who witnessed it.

On the day following the chief's death the Indian procession came to the village of DeWitt. Here they purchased some additional items for their beloved chief that he would need in his afterlife: tobacco, gun powder and bullets. One account also states that they purchased a coffin. This was contrary to their usual custom but is very possibly true for many Indians had, by this late date, taken to the practice of many "white" customs. It is also possible that this was thought of by his survivors as a final

honor or tribute to their former leader. Their purchases transacted, they again took up their trek down river towards Pe-Shimnecon.

They stopped that night at Wacousta. It is recorded that the sleigh which bore the body was kept for the night in the hotel livery barn. It is not recorded where the Indians themselves rested. The next morning the ponies were again hitched to the sled and the final day of travel was resumed.

At Pe-Shimnecon the mourning Indians were out of sight from the curious and watchful eyes of the white settlers and it is here that

the stories, handed down from the early pioneers, ends. Undoubtedly a customary ritual was carried out by his tribe after which

his remains were laid to rest in an unmarked grave in that sacred ground of his forefathers where the Looking Glass meets the Grand.

In later years Okemos' grave was marked but not unlike his place of death and place of birth, the exact location of his gravesite has been debated for decades. Perhaps it is fitting to the man, so much a legend to central Michigan, that the exact details of his life and death should remain shrouded in mystery.

For a more informative look at the life of Okemos, an excellent source is a small booklet entitled "Chief Okemos of the Chippewa" by Thelma C. Lamb, printed by the Friends of Historic Meridian in 1976.

Funeral services were held at 10:30 a.m. Saturday, Dec. 22 at the DeWitt Area Chapel with Rev. Robert Prange of the Grove Bible Church, officiating. Burial in the Deepdale Cemetery, Lansing.

## Harold I. Jenkins

Harold I. Jenkins, 83, of 330 Cambridge Drive, Dimondale, died Dec. 13 at a Lansing hospital. He was born March 19, 1901, the son of Thomas and Sarada Jenkins, at Saginaw.

Mr. Jenkins was a life member and past master of the Wacousta Masonic Lodge No. 359 F&AM; life member of the Wacousta O.E.S. ## Agricultural News

The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources (CANR) offers 4 year degree programs in areas that foster your creativity; develop your ability to analyze scientific data; put your concern for the environment to work; find a role for you in business management; prepare you for a leading role in decision making on future resource needs; put you behind a microphone, television camera or podium to communicate with the public and show you how food production works in the high-tech age.

Through CANR there are 18 four-year programs. In the next two weeks we will discuss the career opportunities and the basic course work required for each of these programs to give you an idea of whether they fit your future goals.

Some of the more usable programs in CANR are the production programs. These include Animal Science, Crops and Soil Sciences and Horticulture. The course work in these programs emphasize production and marketing of the various agricultural commodities. Graduates of the production programs often return to the farm but may also be found in industry, research or in governmental or university positions.

If your interests fall more toward the preservation, processing or packaging of products you may be interested in either Food Science and Human Nutrition or the Packaging major. In food science and human nutrition you will study the chemical biological and physical properties of food and apply these principles to nutrition, product development and marketing of ag products. Packaging students may choose either the management (advertising, economics, marketing and psychology) or the technical (physics and mathematics) options and can further choose to study the packaging of food, medical, pharmaceutical or industrial products. Graduates from either of these programs may find themselves in product development, research, market research, advertising or technical sales.

If what you are looking for from an education is a good picture of the entire ag structure

Agricultural Engineering or Building Construction.

Maybe you are very science oriented. If this is the case, Agricultural Biochemistry may be the perfect program. In this program you will learn about genetic engineering or study the newest developments in molecular biology. You will work at the cellular level to develop techniques to benefit the agricultural industry.

Interests in natural resources and wildlife may be fulfilled by pursuing a degree in Natural Resources and Environmental Education, Forestry, Fisheries and Wild Life, Parks and Recreation Resources, or Resource Development.

## Annual expansion hog numbers slows

The number of hogs and pigs on farms in Michigan on December 1, 1984, was estimated at 1.31 million head, up 5 percent from the previous year's inventory of 1.25 million. This year's inventory was the largest Michigan hog inventory since 1944.

This year's inventory report does indicate a possible slowdown in the recent expansion of Michigan hog numbers. The December 1 breeding hog inventory of 155,000 head was down 9 percent from a year earlier. Market hog numbers, at slightly over 1.15 million head, were up 7 percent from the previous year. Most of the increase in market hog numbers occurred in the over 120 pound weight groups. The inventory of market

The June-November 1984 pig crop exceeded 1.15 million head, and increase of 3 percent from a year ago. Sows farrowing, at 150,000 head, increased 1 percent, and the average litter rate was 7.7 pigs, up slightly from last year.

The December 1, 1984, U.S. inventory of all hogs and pigs was estimated at 54 million head. This is 5 percent below a year ago and 1 percent less than December 1, 1982. The inventory of breeding hogs, 6.93 million, is 6 percent below last year.

The market hog inventory, at 47.1 million, is 4 percent below a year ago. The U.S. pig crop for 1984 totalled 86.5 million head, 7 percent below 1983 but 2 percent above the 1982 pig crop. An estimated 5.86 million sows farrowed during June-November 1984, 5 percent below a year earlier. The litter size during this period averaged a record 7.54, up from the 7.41 average a year ago. U.S. hog producers intend to have 5.39 million sows farrow during the December 1984-May 1985 period, 5 percent below farrowings during that period last year.

## Family Focus

By Dawn Harris

With every new year it seems that the tax code is changed slightly and 1984 is no exception. The Tax Reform Act of 1984 has some new wrinkles that you may need to know.

**INCOME AVERAGING:** Beginning with 1984 returns, the rules on income averaging have changed slightly. The new rules require that the current year's taxable income exceed the average base period income by 140 percent to qualify for income averaging, rather than the former 120 percent.

Formerly the base on which the averaging

was figured was four years...not it is three prior tax years. Tax experts have estimated that an increase of 7.8 percent in salary over the base years used to be required...now you must earn 19 percent more. So many people will find that income averaging is no longer possible.

**CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS:** The deduction you can take for the expenses of operating your personal vehicle when performing volunteer services for charitable organizations has been raised to 12 cents a mile, up from 9 cents per mile in

previous years. You can still deduct tolls and parking fees but not other expenses, such as general repair. The change is only for volunteer work. The 9 cents a mile still applies for medical and moving expenses.

**DEPENDENCY EXEMPTION:** One question that divorced or separated parents often have is who can deduct a child on their income tax. The new law states that generally the parent having custody of the child for the greater portion of the year is entitled to the deduction, provided that the child receives over one-half of his/her support from a combination of both parents. The parent entitled to the deduction may waive his/her rights in favor of the other parent. A written declaration to this effect

must be attached to the return of the parent claiming the deduction. This rule will go into effect in 1985. Pre-1985 decrees and agreements may be modified. If no modification is made, the deduction falls under prior law, which allows a non-custodial parent to claim the deduction if he/she provided at least \$600 in support over the year.

**MEDICAL EXPENSES OF CHILDREN OF DIVORCED OR SEPARATED PARENTS:** Starting next year, medical expense deductions can be made on either parent's return...the child is considered to be a dependent of each parent for this expense.

**PROPERTY TRANSFER BETWEEN DIVORCING SPOUSES:** It used to be that some spouses were

in for a big surprise when they received property in a divorce settlement. The transfer was at current value, and some spouses found they owed large capital gains taxes. The law now allows property transfer within one year of divorce to be treated as a gift from one spouse to another. Gifts between spouses result in neither income tax nor gift tax. Of course, if a property is subsequently sold, capital gains would have to be paid if the sales price exceeds the value at time of transfer. For answers to specific questions on these and other tax matters, consult a tax expert.

No. CFI-112.84

(Under authority of Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended)

### OPEN SEASONS AND CATCH LIMITS ON PIKE, WALLEYE, SAUGER AND MUSKELLUNGE

Under the authority of Section 4, Act 230, P.A. 1925, as amended, being 300.4 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, the Natural Resources Commission, at its December 6, 1984, meeting rescinded its October 8, 1982 order, No. CFI-112.82, Open Seasons and Catch Limits on Pike, Walleye, Sauger and Muskellunge, and ordered that the following order become effective January 1, 1985, and remain valid for a period of five years until March 31, 1990.

It shall be unlawful to take the following named species except within the open seasons and daily limits prescribed (statewide regulations apply unless otherwise restricted):

Statewide open seasons on all waters not otherwise closed to fishing shall be from May 15 through February on walleye, sauger, northern pike, and muskellunge (including tiger muskellunge). The daily catch limit shall be five singly or in combination for largemouth and smallmouth bass, walleye, sauger, and northern pike; one for muskellunge (including tiger muskellunge).

The above regulations apply statewide except that walleye and sauger may be taken at any time from the Detroit and St. Clair rivers, Lake St. Clair, and Lake Erie; and that muskellunge in Lake St. Clair, St. Clair and Detroit rivers may be taken only from the first Saturday in June through December 15 of each year. The daily catch on Lake St. Clair and the Detroit and St. Clair rivers shall be six singly or in combination for largemouth and smallmouth bass, walleye, sauger, and northern pike when the catch includes at least one walleye or sauger. Also, the daily catch on Lake Erie shall be 10 singly or in combination for largemouth and smallmouth bass, walleye, sauger, and northern pike when the catch includes at least five walleye or sauger.
