# St. Johns Drama group ranks first

The St. Johns High School Theatre Department has done it again! Led by Robert L. Koger, in pursuit of an unprecedented third state championship in high school drama, the theatre department from St. Johns outdistanced 14 other finalists in Saturday's, February 16, competition at Michigan State University and won a third straight state championship.

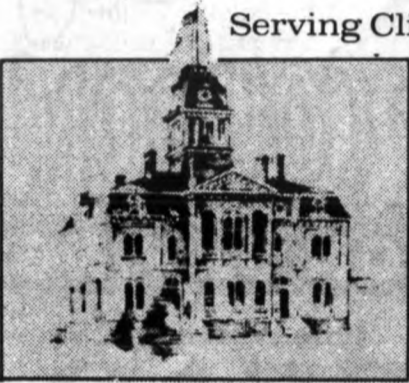
Held at Michigan State University's Fairchild Theatre, the competition featured fifteen schools from throughout the entire state. For their fourteenth year in a row, St. Johns High School was a state finalist. Not only was this their fourteenth consecutive year to qualify, but they were also defending their crown as the high school state theatre champion—a title they have held

for the past two years. For 1985, the St. Johns entry in the theatre competition was their cutting of the popular musical "Guys & Dolls." Some of the judges' comments regarding their show were as follows: Judge Joyce Ramsey of Michigan State University; "This show is hot! hot!! hot!!! Lush, rich—a box of delightful surprises! Visually and artistically tasteful and

entertaining. A professional effort!" Judge Marvin Sims of Eastern Michigan University; "The tempo and pacing is done well throughout the production. Mood is well established." Judge Linda Murley of Ferndale High School; "Men's chorus worked well. Great use of levels. Great level of energy! Nice spectacular!" With comments like these and a tremendous effort of one-hundred St. Johns

High School students, St. Johns successfully defended their state title. This is an accomplishment that this theatre group has now accomplished seven times in the last ten years. Not only did the Redwing dramatists win the state title, but they also walked away with many individual performance awards. Receiving awards of superior individual performance

(this is the top individual performance award) were: Colleen McCarthy for her role of Miss Adelaide; Jim Schultheiss for his role of Nicely-Nicely Johnson; Dave Harsh for his program design; and the entire cast of 28 for their ensemble in acting. ## Alternate bus routes may be necessary

The school district may decide that a plan using alternate bus routes might be necessary when extensive snowstorms hit the area. In a plan presented to the St. Johns Board of Education members Feb. 18, Gordon Vandemark, assistant superintendent, pointed out that the county road commission starts ploughing primary roads (those roads most heavily traveled) at 4 a.m. and that by day two after a storm parents could be responsible for getting children to certain pick-up points on the alternate bus routes.

"We've got to continue looking at alternatives to snow days," says Robert Craig, schoolboard president. "The students are losing some of the best education days in the school year." Leonard Puetz added that it's hard for teachers to keep all the students up-to-date when part of the class isn't there. Bus drivers have a hard time driving in the weather that has occurred in the past weeks. "Seventeen out of 22 buses got stuck, up to five times each, Feb. 11," said Gene Barnhart during the meeting.

To the Editor:

An open letter to supporters of Peoples Action League.

**TIME FOR REJOICING:**

It would appear so. One of our goals has been accomplished. That is, to close the hazardous waste landfill operated in Watertown Township by Granger Land Development Company. The Department of Natural Resources has denied the relicensing of 61 acres of the old site which in the past was taking hazardous waste. Proper closure plans are to be submitted within 30 days. We must have faith that proper monitoring and close scrutiny of the site will be done by the DNR.

The closure was a goal of the Peoples Action League when it was formed four years ago. Even though it has been a long time coming, the closure is no less a satisfying victory. All of the citizens who have supported our efforts should take pride

in this accomplishment, however, let's not close the book on the Granger Landfill prematurely.

We still have the long-term problem of disposal of the leachate from the hazardous waste site. In addition, there is still 26 acres of the old site which has a type II (solid waste) license and is not being used at the present time. An application for a hazardous waste license was filed in 1981 for this area.

The second goal of PAL was to prevent the licensing of a hazardous waste landfill without the process of a site review board.

As a member of the Watertown Township Board, I as well as most of our recently elected township officials have pledged to prevent toxic waste from being dumped in our township. With a total commitment by all of the people in this and our neighboring communities we shall accomplish this second goal.

You do make a difference.

**School approves several resolutions**

St. Johns Board of Education approved several resolutions at its regular meeting Feb. 18, including asbestos litigation and the Project Outreach survey.

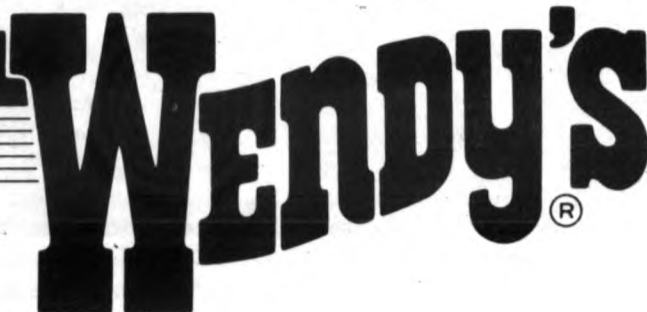
The resignation of Joe Gonzales was accepted and he was given a commendation plaque in honor of his 16 years of service to St. Johns public schools. He has accepted a position as administrative assistant in charge of personnel and public relations in the district office of all Bay City Schools.

Two representatives of the St. Johns High School Drama Club, Malia Koger and Dave Harsh, presented their first-place trophy and plaque to Robert Craig, schoolboard president. The drama club won the state drama tournament Feb. 16 with a shortened version of "Guys and Dolls". St. Johns is the only school in the history of the competition to win three consecutive years.

Earl Gabriel, superintendent of schools, announced that the St. Johns cheerleading squad qualified for the state competition in Alma, by winning the district competition Feb. 16. He also said that the basketball team is now in first place in the league after winning both games last weekend. And, the volleyball team won first place in the Clinton County Tournament, last weekend.

The board approved the payment of \$40-70 annually to attorney David Riewald of Thrun, Maatsch and Nordberg, to proceed with the asbestos class action suit against Manville Corporation. The vote was 6-1, with Gary Whitford dissenting.

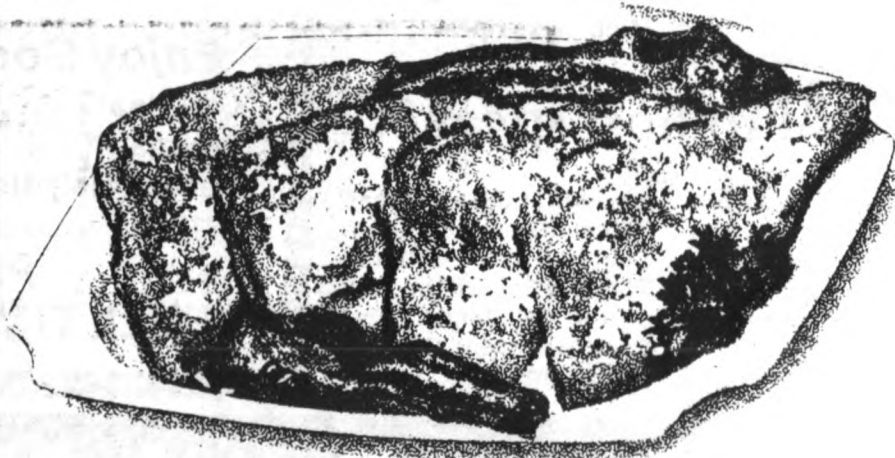
The board also agreed to proceed with the Project Outreach survey, which will cost the district \$1,500. The project is a community survey to determine how the public perceives their schools. The survey can also be used for long-range planning.

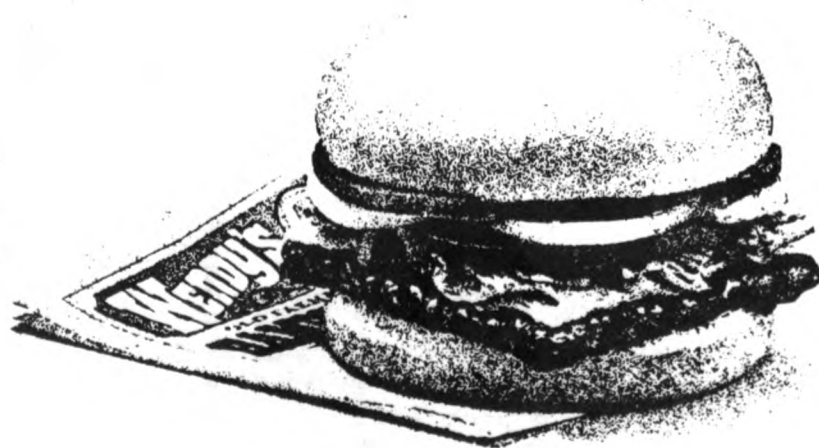

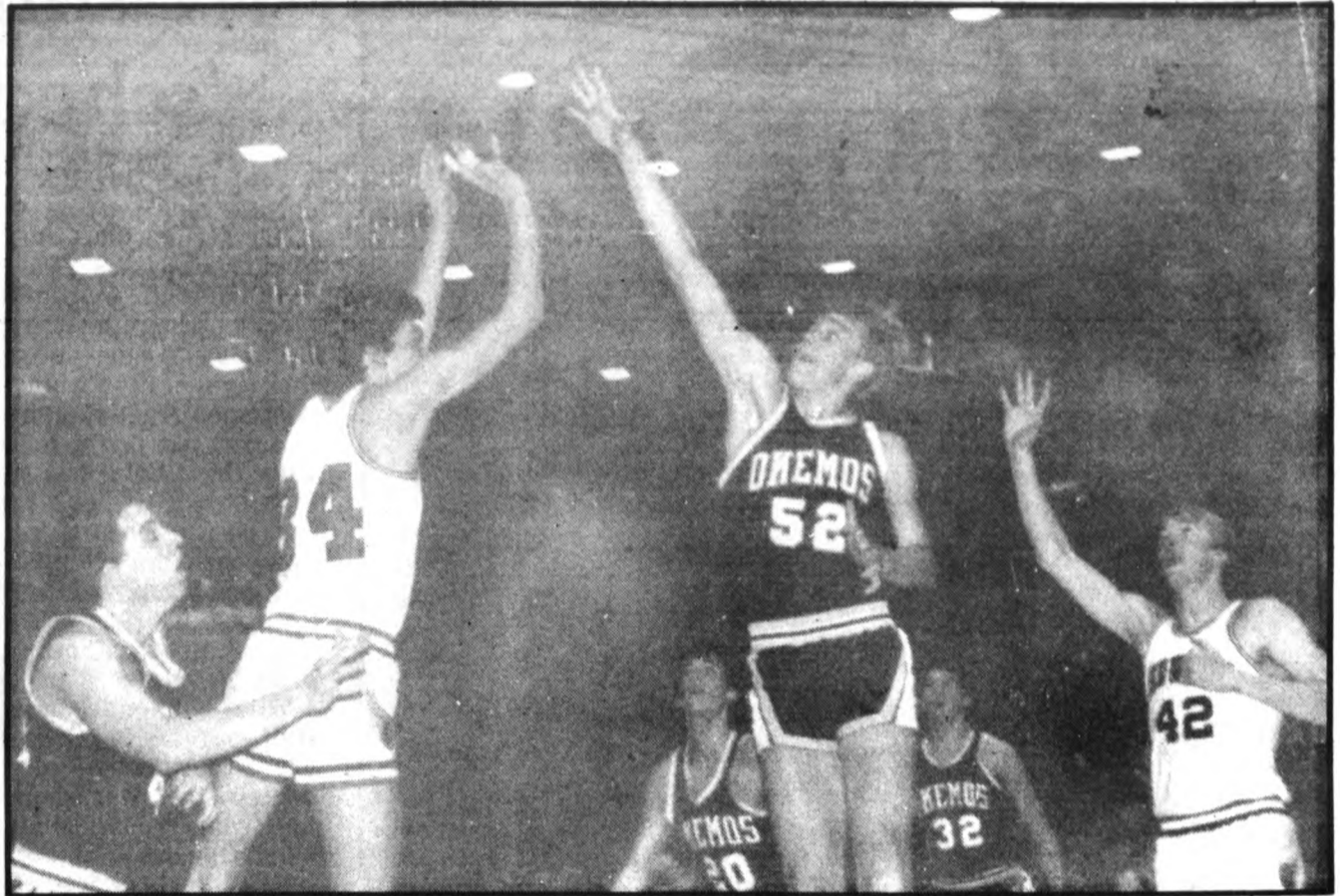

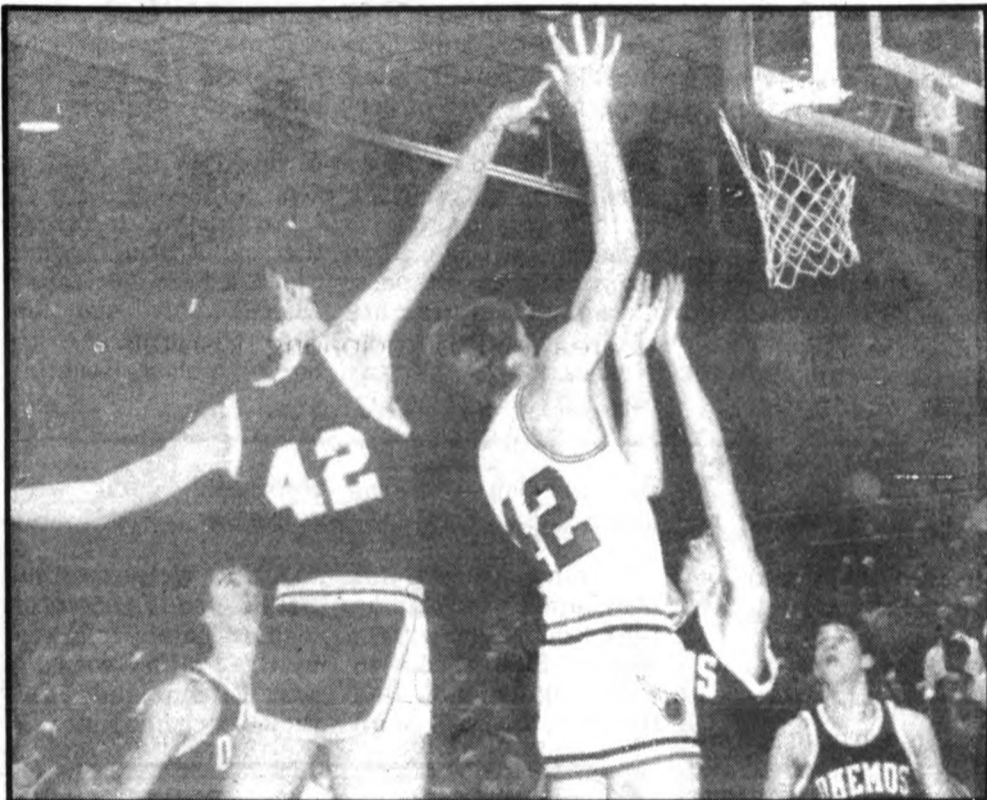
## Plaque presented by local Odd Fellow

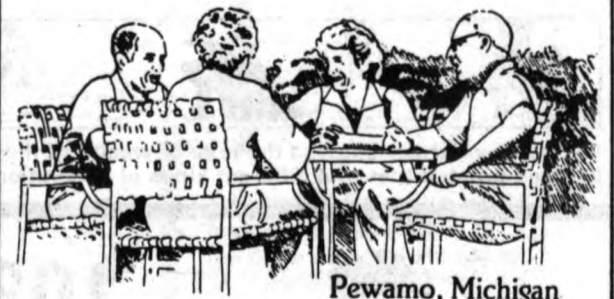

# Wheat crop may have suffered

Ice storms that blanketed southern Michigan New Year's Day may have damaged some of the winter wheat crop.

"Though it is too early to predict what may have happened, it is possible to determine how much damage may have been done by taking some samples of wheat that was covered with ice," says Larry Copeland, Michigan State University Cooperative Extension Service agronomist.

Remove whole plants from the field, thoroughly clean them and place them indoors to check for injury. The appearance of dark spots on a plant after it has been kept under a light for two days between 60 and 65 degrees F indicates the breakdown of plant protoplasm. The dark spots can be detected by carefully cutting the wheat plant crown open with a razor blade.

survive.

For a more definitive diagnosis, keep the plant under these conditions up to three weeks to make sure the new growth continues. If it does, winter injury is probably not fatal.

When repeated freezing and thawing occurs in the field and the crown tissue freezes, the wheat plant's ability to survive is weakened.

The sensitive region of the plant is in the crown area, which is just below the soil. Under very dry conditions, one extended freeze of several days at 5 degrees F will kill wheat. Under saturated soil conditions, temperatures would have to average between 10 and 15 degrees F during an extended freeze before the plant is killed.

Survival may also be threatened by sheet ice formation. Under such conditions, oxygen is not available to the plant and ethanol builds up as a result of anaerobic respiration.

The wheat plant can tolerate some ethanol buildup, but as low temperature fungi and then other fungi grow, the metabolism of both the fungi and the wheat plant creates concentrations of ethanol, cyanides, carbon dioxide and other gases which become toxic to the plant.

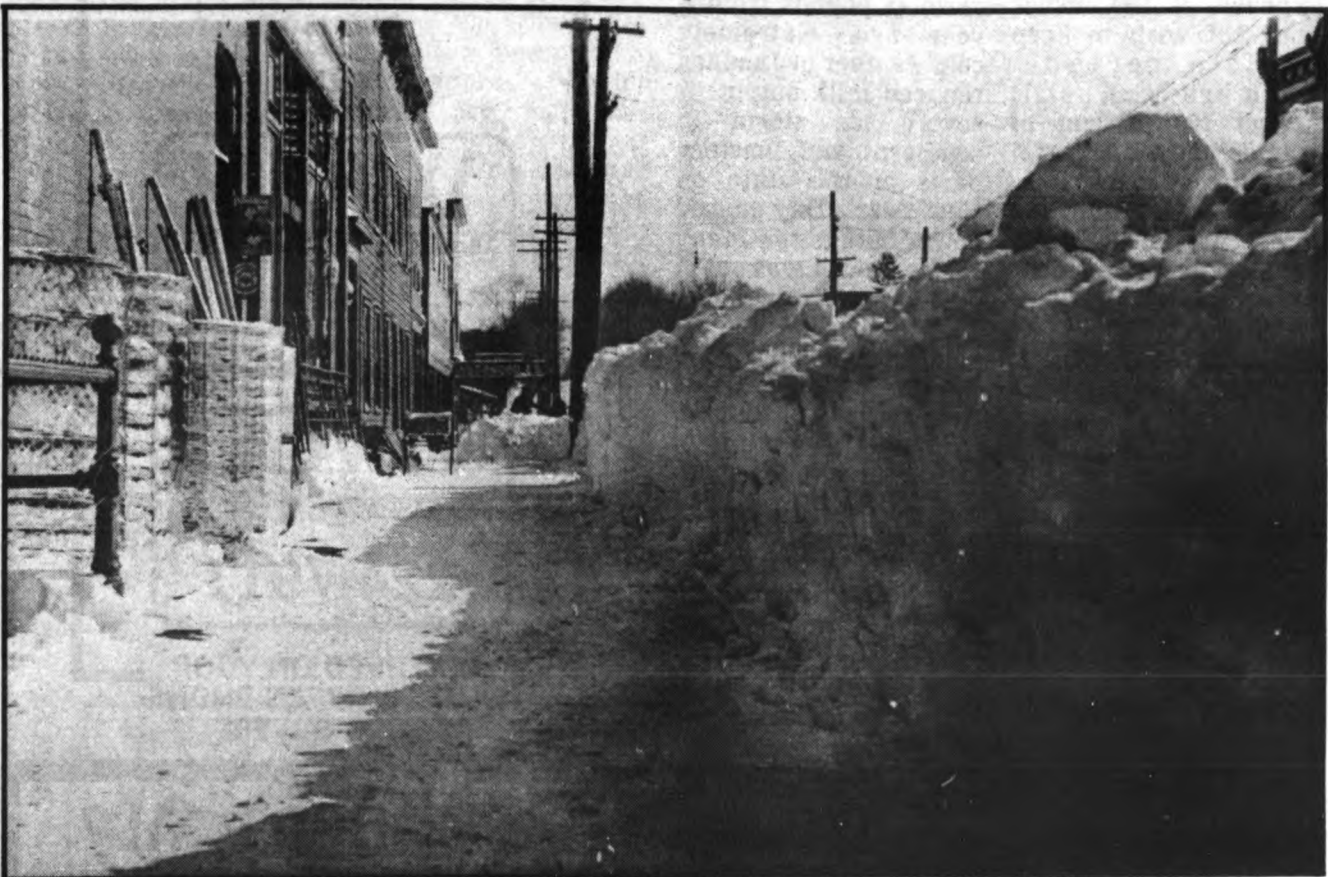

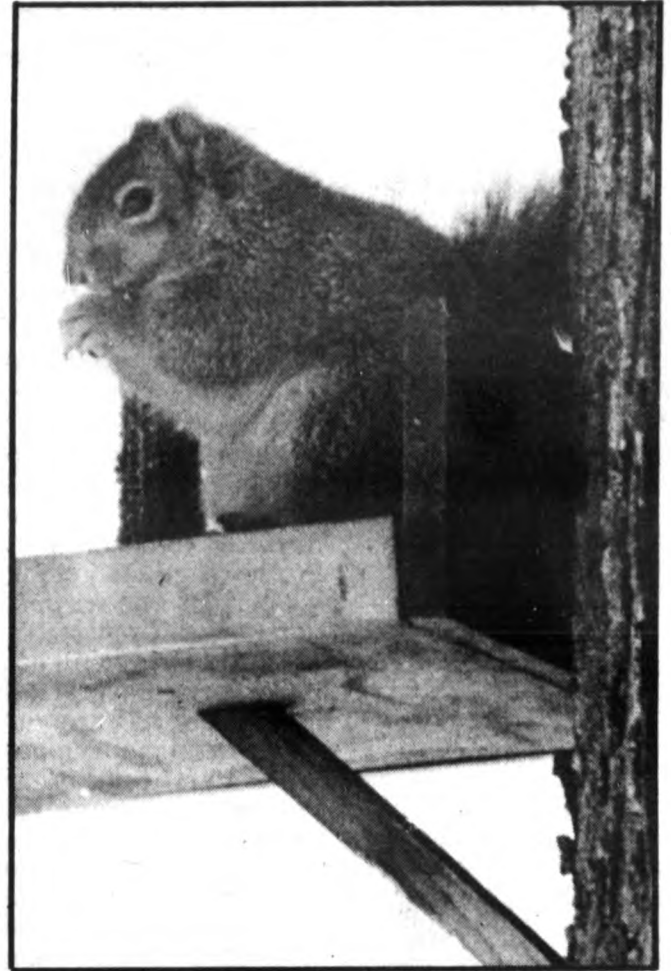

## Farm News

### Agricultural News

The Internal Revenue Service has made some changes in the interpretation of tax laws that will affect the way farmers will be allowed to make deductions in 1985.

"An IRS audit turned up some prime areas of tax abuse and income under-reporting," says Myron Kelsey, Extension farm management specialist at MSU. "The IRS will be watching those problem areas more carefully to catch people who are not reporting their income properly, which means stricter guidelines for everyone to follow."

The IRS found that individuals who receive payments from small businesses, such as farms, often under-report their earnings. To deter this practice, the government has requested businesses to file information returns (form 1099) on all payments made to another person, other than a corporation, that total \$600 or more. These include payments for rent, interest or services provided by a non-employee, such as a veterinarian or custom harvesting worker.

Information returns do not need to be filed for merchandise and freight payments, or for rental payments made to real estate agents. These reports must include the taxpayer identification number of the person receiving payment, but this is often

overlooked by the employer.

Farm managers can be fined \$50 for not providing the IRS with an information return. Kelsey suggests getting all persons who are paid for work not reportable on a W-2 form to fill out a W-9 form--Payer's Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification--to avoid any penalty. Another \$50 fine can be charged for failing to provide a copy of the information return to the individual being paid, Kelsey says. When the taxpayer identification number is not furnished or is incorrect, managers are required to pay only 80 percent of the payment to the individual. The 20 percent of the money is then paid to the government in the business' tax returns at the end of the year. This keeps people from cheating on their taxes by under-reporting their income.

Stricter salary deduction guidelines that have been instituted for 1985 could cause some confusion for farm families, Kelsey says. Families will not be allowed to deduct spouse's and children's farm salaries from the operation's income next year, unless a salary was paid at regular intervals during the year. Farm families can deduct their individual on-farm salaries in one lump sum this year. The IRS has disallowed that

practice, ruling that compensation for services must be made at the time they are rendered.

The IRS is also cracking down on substantiating farm vehicle expense deductions. A new rule stated that farmers needed to keep a detailed log of vehicle use to apply for tax deductions on that vehicle. The log needed to include date of use, name of user, number of miles used, and purpose of use.

The IRS has since softened their stance, saying a farmer can simply deduct 70 percent of an automobile's use and 80 percent of a truck's use as a business expense, if the owner does not wish to keep vehicle records. Farmers can still deduct 100 percent of tractor and other farm equipment expenses.

Other changes in the interpretation of tax laws are bound to occur during the coming year. Keeping abreast of these changes can save farmer's time and money.

### Dairy output seen falling

Milk production in Michigan during January totaled 435 million pounds, down 4 percent from a year earlier, according to the Federal/State Michigan Agricultural Reporting Service. Milk cow numbers, at 388,000 head, were down from last month and 12,000 below a year earlier. Milk output per cow averaged 1,120 pounds, down 15 pounds from a year ago. Extremely cold weather in January reduced milk output. A severe ice storm in southern and eastern parts of the state on New Year's Day caused power outages on many farms. Power was out in some areas from 1 to 7 days and the use of generators to milk cows was widespread. Some producers had to dump their milk as a result of the power outages.

Slaughter cow prices averaged \$37.00 per hundredweight (cwt.), up nearly \$1 from a year earlier. Production per cow averaged 1,038 pounds, 6 pounds above

a year earlier. Production per cow had been averaging below previous year levels. Milk cow numbers averaged 10.8 million head, 2 percent below a year earlier.

Dairy manufacturing plants in Michigan produced 2.9 million pounds of butter during December, down 47 percent from a year ago. American cheese production, at 1.8 million pounds, was off 10 percent from the previous year. Ice cream production totaled nearly 2.3 million gallons, up 1 percent from a year earlier. Michigan placed seventh nationally in ice cream production during December. Nationally, December production of most manufactured dairy products was below previous year levels. Production of ice milk and lowfat cottage cheese increased.

## Family Focus

Don't wait until spring to dig out the jogging suit and sneakers you pushed toward the back of the closet when you pulled out your winter coat and boots. Physical fitness is just as important in the winter as it is in the other seasons.

Indoors and outdoors, there are many activities to choose from to help keep you fit in the winter.

There are plenty of ways to exercise without going outdoors. Many communities have indoor athletic facilities for walking, jogging, running or swimming. Where these facilities are not available, or when you can't get to them, you can jump rope, ride a stationary bicycle, run in place, do aerobic dancing, perform stretching exercises (to make you more flexible) or do calisthenics.

Even walking up and down stairs is a good exercise. If you live near an indoor mall, walking briskly around the mall is an excellent way to exercise in the winter.

Aerobic dancing, racquetball and other sports can be performed

indoors. Ice skating is an activity you can do either indoors or outdoors.

If you like exercising outdoors, cold temperatures need not prevent you from doing so. Walking, jogging, cross country skiing and skating are some activities you can safely perform outdoors if you're properly dressed. In fact, many runners prefer to run outdoors rather than indoors in the winter.

Protect yourself by dressing warmly and being alert for signs for frostbite. Some symptoms of frostbite are numbness in the feet, hands or nose and paleness or white color of the skin. The frozen part of skin also become hard to the touch. Wear several layers of light clothing rather than one bulky layer. This way, clothes can "breathe" and allow perspiration to evaporate. "Wind suits" are especially good for wintertime jogging or running because they are lightweight, can be worn over regular sweatsuits and provide good wind resistance. They are

also usually water resistant and are less bulky than, for example, a down vest.

Always remember to wear a hat—much of your body heat is lost through your head. Mittens often are warmer than gloves because they allow the fingers to warm each other. Some runners prefer to wear socks as mittens.

An important thing to consider if you decide to run outdoors is the route you plan to take. Select jogging trails that are clean and used by other runners—those trails often have better footing than other paths. And beware of traffic hazards.

If you're already active, you may wish to modify your activities in the winter. For example, you may choose to swim instead of run in

the winter months.

To benefit from exercise, you must exercise hard enough and long enough. A standard guide to follow is to exercise three times a week for a minimum of 20 minutes each time, increasing your heart rate to 120 beats per minute, or doubling your resting heart rate. If you can't find the time to exercise three times a week, any exercise is better than none. Be sure to consult your doctor before starting any type of exercise program.

Winter exercising helps keep you in shape and offers other benefits, too. It's a great tension reliever and gives you a stress outlet, particularly if you spend long periods of time indoors.

## Potato stocks increase

Michigan potato growers, shippers and processors held a total of 5 million hundredweight (cwt.) of potatoes on February 1, 1985. This is an increase of 14 percent from a year ago but 7 percent below stocks on hand February 1, 1983, according to the Federal/State Michigan Agricultural Reporting Service. Disappearance for the 1984 crop from the start of harvest to February 1 totaled 7.5 million cwt., 39 percent above movement for the same period last season. Disappearance during the month of January totaled 1.5 million cwt. compared to one million cwt. a year ago. So far this season, 60 percent

of production has been removed from storage compared to 55 percent a year ago. Quality of potatoes coming out of storage is very good.

Nationally, potato stocks were estimated at 143 million cwt. in the 15 major storage states. This is up 3 percent from last year, but 5 percent short of two years ago. Stocks on hand represented 47 percent of fall production this year compared with 49 percent on hand a year ago at this time. Processing to February 1 totaled 70.8 million cwt., up 21 percent from a year earlier. Processing during January reached 12.0 million cwt., up 15 percent from last January.

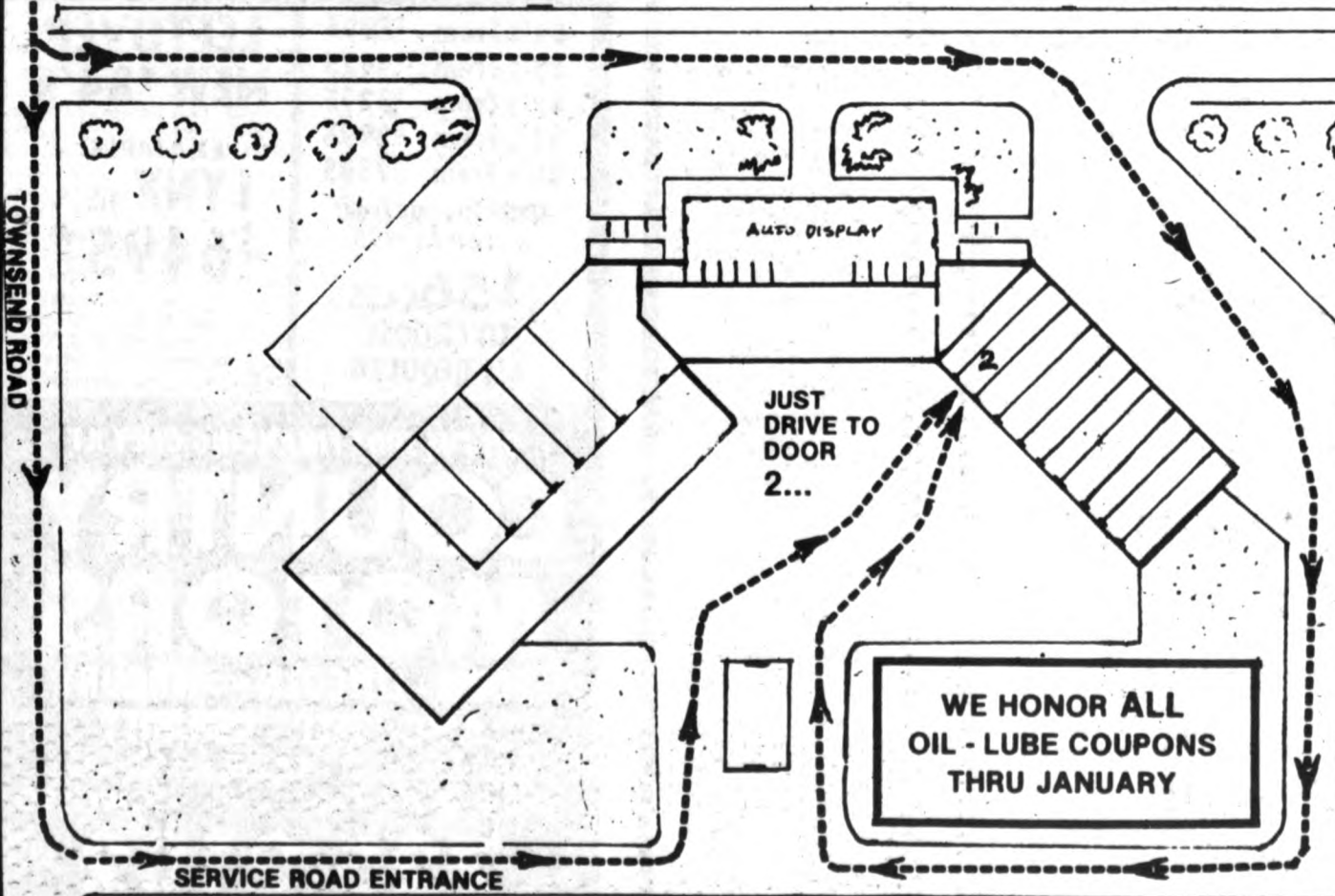

## Dry bean stocks diminish

Commercial elevators in Michigan held 2,825,000 hundredweight (cwt.) of dry beans in storage as of December 31, 1984. Dry bean stocks in elevators were 22 percent below last year's level. The quantity in elevators includes 2,550,000 cwt. of navy beans and 275,000 cwt. of all other classes com-

bined. An estimate of the quantity of dry beans held on farms is not included in this report, according to the Federal/State Michigan Agricultural Reporting Service. On December 31, 1983, commercial elevators held a total of 3,600,000 cwt. of dry beans in storage. Stocks on hand a year ago in-

cluded 3,400,000 cwt. of navy beans and 200,000 cwt. of all other classes combined.

Dry bean stocks are not included in the USDA Crop Reporting Board established system of grain stocks reports. Dry bean stocks data included in this report was tabulated from informa-

tion supplied by elevator operators on the Grain Dealers Daily Position Report filed monthly with the Michigan Department of Agriculture. Dry bean stocks reports will be issued twice a year and will reflect quantities held in commercial storages on December 31 and August 31. Stocks on hand as of August 31, 1985 will be released October 10, 1985.

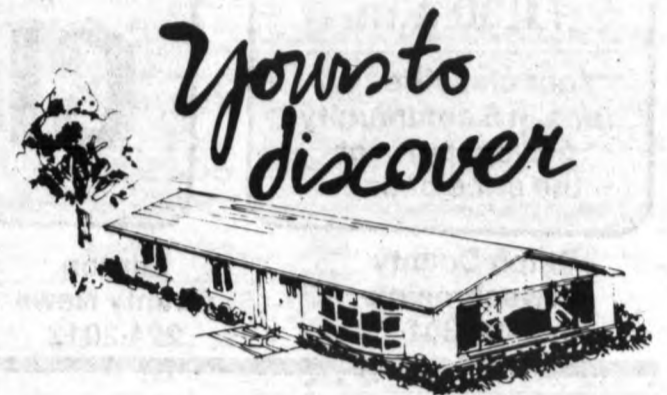

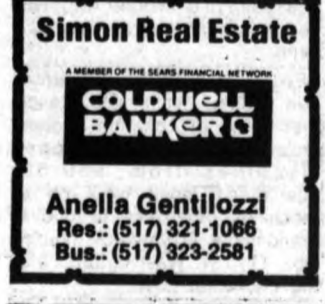

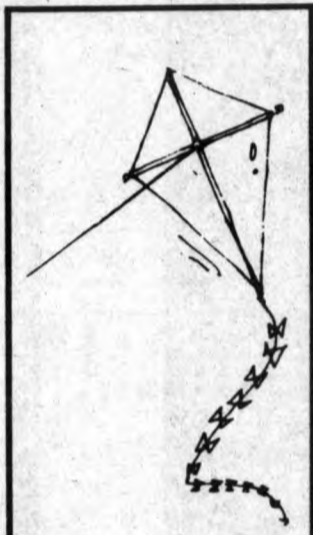
