Awards given

About 600 parents, family members and friends filed into St. Johns High School auditorium Monday night to see students receive honors and awards amid popping flashbulbs and applause.

Capping the evening was announcement of the annual Rodney B. Wilson Scholarship award winners, 10 seniors who will receive \$750 per year for four years of college.

The recipients for 1983 are Estella Arias, Maureen Asher, Sandra Burkhardt, Lauryn Escher, Scott Furry, Eric Hufnagel, Ken Lounds, Bradley Massey, Sara Tetens and Barbara VeCasey.

Steve Gonzales was awarded the \$500 Binda Scholarship, and a variety of other scholarships and awards for outstanding achievement were presented by departments and groups to students in all high school grades.

"We have an unbelievable junior and senior class," High School Principal Bill Swears said. "Their grade point averages are extremely high. And when you consider the awards for drama, sports, music and other activities, you can see this has been a very, very successful group of students."

In all, school officials estimate a record \$225,000 was awarded in various scholarships and awards for student achievement Monday night.

Awards for athletics included the Brent Law Award to Scott Furry, the Earl Lancaster Award to Jamie Werbish, and the outstanding Senior Athlete Awards to Sue Pearsall and Steve Gonzales.

Gonzales also earned a scholarship to Alma College; Davenport College scholarships went to Kelly Bryde and Karen Wood; Central Michigan University grants to Cheryl Carroll, Jean Henning, Lisa Blundy and Kim Stoddard; Eastern Michigan University awards to Kim Brown, Patty Burkhardt, Sandy Burkhardt and Caren Rojas; Ferris State grants to Maureen Asher and Barb VeCasey; Grand Valley State awarded Kris Wagner; Lake Superior State, Ann Boyton; MSU grants went to Tracy Shutes, Jim Thelen and Deb Yallup; and UofM scholarships to Scott Furry and Nancy Thelen.

Three students share valedictorian honors for the St. Johns High School Class of 1983. Sharing the spotlight during June 5 commencement exercises will be Lauryn Escher, Nancy Thelen and Scott Furry.

Miss Escher, daughter of William J.D. and Loretta M. Escher of 506 S. Clinton Ave., was active in student council as junior and senior class representative, and participated in varsity tennis as team captain.

She performed in the symphonic band, orchestra and pit orchestra, and was the marching band's Band Sweetheart for the 1982 season. Miss Escher also attended Girls' State and was a member of the National Honor Society (NHS) for two years.

Miss Thelen, daughter of Betty Thelen of 104 S. Prospect, is a National Merit finalist and earned the prestigious Bently Scholarship to University of Michigan, one of two in the state.

A member of the NHS, she competed on the quiz bowl team, the freshman track team and the freshman basketball team. She also worked as a bagger at a local supermarket.

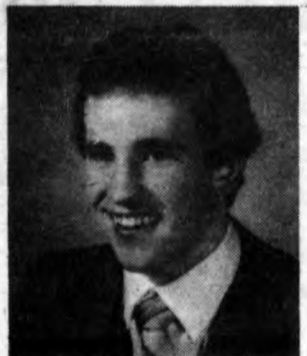

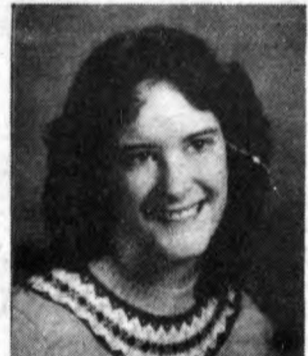

Owosso suspect faces charges

An Owosso man has been arrested by St. Johns Police and charged with indecent exposure.

Timothy Thomas Luplow, 25, of North Seymore Road, Owosso, was arraigned in 65th District Court May 23 and charged with one count of indecent exposure for an incident that allegedly occurred in downtown St. Johns on March 10.

Luplow pleaded not guilty and was released on a \$500 bond. A pre-trial hearing has been set for June 3.

St. Johns Police also made an arrest for break-

ing and entering, and announced sentencing of the former owner of a local investment company.

In Bath, a police officer was assaulted and two men were arrested following a party on Peacock Road, reports said. In all, Clinton County Sheriff's Department records said 78 complaints resulted in 38 arrests during the week ending May 22. Among the complaints were:

• Dale Lee Roberts, 17, of 7851 Williams Rd., St. Johns, was arraigned in district court on charges of breaking and entering the

home of William Karber, 305 E. Park, St. Johns, on May 10. Bond was set at \$10,000, and a preliminary hearing was set for May 31, reports said.

• Nick Holloway, former owner of Holloway International Investment in St. Johns, was sentenced to three years in the custody of the attorney general by a federal judge in Grand Rapids May 17. Holloway was charged with interstate transportation of stolen property, and will begin serving his sentence at an undisclosed location June 6, reports said.

• A wild party got out of hand in Bath Township Saturday night, May 21, township police reported. Barry Allen Derke, 18, of 6540 Drumheller Rd., was arrested on charges of

operating a vehicle under the influence of liquor, and David Lee Carr, 21, of 5998 Martinez, Haslett, was charged with assaulting a police officer. Both were attending a party on Peacock Road, reports said.

When officer Jack Phillips responded to complaints of noise at the party and cars parked on private property, the officer was assaulted. Before backup help arrived, the top lights from the township squad car had been taken, along with the officer's hat with his badge attached, and beer was dumped on the driver's seat of the squad car, reports said. The officer received assistance from an unidentified person at the scene, and later from backup officers.

Another warrant was issued at the scene charging a minor with possession of alcohol, reports said.

• Bath Township Police also reported two break-ins during the week. The first occurred Thursday, May 19 at Vic & Eddie's Park Lake Tavern, 6289 Park Lake Rd. Taken was \$150 in cash.

The second was reported

Sunday, May 22, at 16969 Towar Ave., East Lansing.

• A Bath Township man was bitten by a dog as he rode his bicycle south on Culver Road, reports said. Richard Bronson, 60, of 15827 Culver, was bitten in the calf by a hound owned by Dale Farr of 15740 Culver, reports said. The dog was turned over to animal control authorities

Still looking

St. Johns Police say they're not too optimistic the abductor and rapist of a 16-year-old St. Johns girl will be found.

"There have been no further developments," Police Chief Lyle French said Tuesday. "We've checked out a lot of leads, but we have nothing to report."

The girl was abducted from a city street at 3:30 p.m. May 2, when a man in an older, dark-colored, four-door sedan pulled her into his auto. The car was described as "very rusty" around the wheel wells, and the abductor was 5'11" to 6', about 240 lbs., with a clean-shaven face, short dark hair and a mole on one cheek.

Police and Clinton County detectives are continuing their search for the car and the assailant, French said. "We've been checking a lot of cars, but there's been nothing to get excited about."

The victim was taken to a spot south of town, then returned to the site of her abduction a few blocks from the Clinton County Courthouse.

Rain, maybe; Rover, no

Man's best friend is often the mailman's worst enemy. But it's no joking matter to St. Johns Postmaster Dave Yallup.

Canines who can't wait to collect on delivery can cause problems to homeowners as well as letter carriers, Yallup says.

"Dog bites are a serious problem for letter carriers, a situation that oddly is looked upon with humor by many people," Yallup said.

"But there was nothing funny about it for the 5,700 letter carriers bitten by unrestrained dogs throughout the nation last year." Included was a

California mailman who died of blood poisoning after being bitten by a bulldog, Yallup said.

Pet owners who get a chuckle from telling Rover to "sic 'em" when the mailman comes could find out the joke's on them when they wind up in court, he warned. "We also provide counseling to carriers who are bitten and want to seek legal action against the dog owners."

Letter carriers can refuse to deliver mail to a house with an unrestrained dog, and delivery can be interrupted in an entire neighborhood where dogs run loose, Yallup added.

"We constantly are alerting our carriers to the problem, but the real solution to dog bites is for the owners to help us. It's the old story of an ounce of prevention being worth a pound of cure," Yallup said.

Cards with a cartoon reminder and suggestions for dog owners with problem pets are distributed by letter carriers.

Dog owners should keep their pets away from the mailbox and other areas used for mail delivery. "If the pet is not kept behind a secure fence, then we suggest the owner restrain the dog with a leash or keep it inside during the usual hours of the carrier's delivery."

Chamber election

Six local residents were elected to serve on the St. Johns Area Chamber of Commerce board in an election held Thursday, May 19.

Mary Winegert, a Spartan Travel employee, defeated Mike Terpstra of Fishers Big Wheel, and

Jim Mead, owner of Mead's Office Supplies, defeated Don Rademacher of RSI Home Improvement in the only contested races.

Unopposed in the election were City Assessor Diane Edwards, Superintendent of Schools Earl Gabriel, St. Johns Reminder owner John Kennedy and Sandy Bisson of Bea's Chevrolet-Oldsmobile.

Chamber officials would not release vote totals.

Exercise course gets city's okay

A new exercise/walking trail will be opening up at the city park June 20, thanks to teamwork by the city and Clinton Memorial Hospital.

City commissioners gave the green light to their share of costs for the \$7,500 project Monday night by approving a \$3,500 contribution. Clinton Memorial will fund the remainder with a \$2,500 grant and \$1,500 contribution.

Labor to install equipment and markers will be provided by the Clinton Intermediate School District, and work will begin June 13, reports said.

The course is intended to help heart patients, the elderly and others get outdoor exercise, and includes 14 stops along the way, with exercise stations and games. Wood chip paths to each station will be provided.

In other business, city commissioners approved the 1983-84 budget, which calls for a slight increase in operating mills, offset by a decline in the debt retirement millage. The overall millage rate will remain the same, 13.32 mills, but fees for some city services will increase slightly.

Commissioners also:

- Approved the purchase of 25 new 50-foot lengths of fire hose for the fire department, at a cost of \$1,972.50.

- Raised fees and changed rules for filling private residential pools. Previously, the city had lost money providing the service, Clerk Rick Coletta said. The new fees will result in a charge of about \$105 for a 20,000-gallon pool, reports said, and should make the service break even. The city pool should open June 9, Coletta said.

- And approved a request for bids on installing equipment in the city's Well 11. A lawsuit is in the works against the designer and driller of the disappointing Well 10, and Well 11 is needed to provide water that was expected from earlier well construction, Coletta said. "We've had a couple of unfortunate experiences on Well 10 and Well 9, and we need the water," he said.

Tax discussed

DeWitt city council members discussed the merits of maintaining the city's 12-mill levy for the 1983 tax year Monday night at a "Truth in Taxation" public hearing.

Though city council members have established 12.25 mills as a maximum possible levy, city officials said they will not need to increase the levy to maintain city services, said Jim Spalding, administrative aide to the council.

Twelve mills last year yielded \$342,112 in property tax revenues. The same levy for 1983 would yield \$360,022, or a 5.2 percent increase, Spalding said.

In other action, council members voted to change the name of Rosevale Dr. to Riverview Dr.

Though no city official knows for sure, the street was part of DeWitt Township before it was annexed in 1965 and may have been named Rosevale when it was platted in 1963. Street signs have always said Riverview, but neither the state nor Clinton County ever had a record of that name, Spalding said.

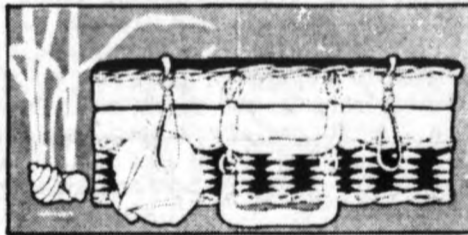

Freshman Becky Irrer, owner of the Clinton County's fastest mile and two mile times, did not run because of an inflammation in her hip.
