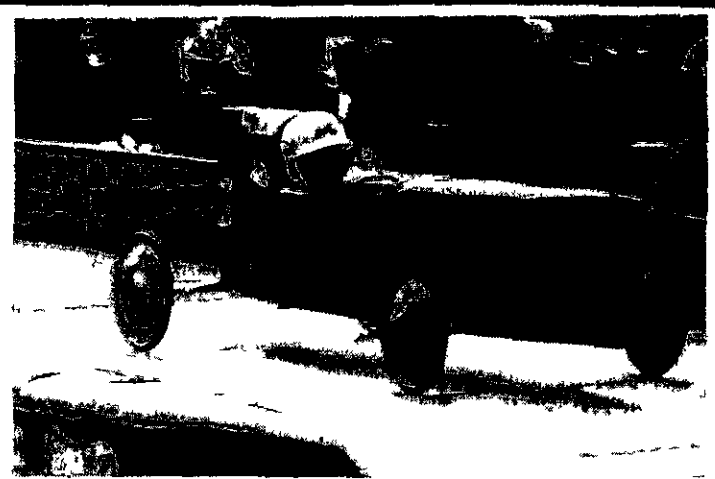

Firm studies possible US-27 location site

LANSING - An international engineering firm has been hired by the Dept of State Highways and Transportation to conduct a corridor and route location study for the proposed reconstruction of US-27 from Lansing to Ithaca, the State Highway Commission said Tuesday.

The firm of Wilbur Smith and Associates of Columbia SC, with offices in Lansing, will conduct the study, scheduled to take approximately 2 years.

It will involve the selection and detailed evaluation of all conceivable alternative routings for the 35 miles between the 2 cities.

The east-west study area will extend about 12 miles wide.

The study area includes DeWitt, Water-town, Riley, Olive, Bengal, Blenheim, Greenbush and Essex Townships in Clinton County, and Fulton, Washington, North Star and Newark Townships in Gratiot County.

Included in the study will be examination of present land uses, inventory of all homes,

farms and businesses in depth evaluation of the environmental impact, analysis of social and economic factors that may affect the routing and a survey of transportation service needs.

Other factors to be considered in determining route alternatives are community development plans, natural and historic land marks and neighborhood esthetics.

As the study progresses, a series of community informational workshops will be held to explain the study, its findings and to solicit viewpoints.

Public hearings also will be held to present corridor alternatives and proposed route alignments within the corridor.

Purpose of hiring a private consulting firm to conduct the study is to expedite the proposed reconstruction of US-27 north of Lansing.

Traffic survey Sunday

ST JOHNS - A traffic survey, in connection with a US-27 corridor and alignment study, will be conducted at the intersection of US-27 and M-21, Sunday, Aug 25 from 8 am until 8 pm.

The survey, conducted by Wilbur Smith and Associates, will furnish motorists with cards asking where the motorist is coming from and going to and the purpose of the trip.

The cards are addressed and posted.

Only those vehicles in the southbound lanes of US-27 will be asked to participate in the card survey.

Officials of the Dept of State Highways and Transportation say it will take less than 1 minute for motorists to fill out the card.

Wilbur Smith and Associates is the firm hired to conduct a study of possible routes for a new US-27 from Lansing to Ithaca.

Milliken names Gnodtke to head Clinton campaign

Governor William G. Milliken has announced the appointment of Bill Gnodtke of Bath as the Michigan campaign chairman for Clinton County.

Gnodtke, 35, is the Clinton County Republican finance chairman. He was on the steering committee of the Bath Citizens for Better Education Committee and is working on the Gunningtonville School restoration project.

"I am honored to be selected as the campaign chairman for Clinton County," Gnodtke said. "Governor Milliken's concern for honesty in government, as shown in his firm stand on

campaign reform, and his proven integrity in leadership has shown him to be the man most capable of making our state government responsive to the people. He has supported many programs which have been extremely beneficial to our country."

DEWITT - A construction bid was accepted Monday night by the DeWitt City Council for 2 tennis courts, funded in part by

a Dept. of Natural Resources grant. Cost of the asphalt for the 2 courts is \$13,300, the amount of

the state grant. The city must contribute \$4000 to the project, either in cash or in-kind contributions, making the total budget for the project \$17,300.

Synopsis of the regular meeting of the DeWitt Township Board held on August 12, 1974 at the Township Hall, 780 E. Wieland Road, Lansing, Michigan.

Board members present: Emerson, Syverson, Pline, Corr and Kzeski. Board members absent: Angell and Purves.

The meeting was called to order by Supervisor Emerson at 8:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

The agenda and minutes were approved.

Public comments were on DeSanders rezoning request, Mr Black submitting a letter about his sewer, the tax appeal, the annexation of the Capital City Airport, a noise ordinance and King Arthur's Court sewer system and charges.

The Planning Commission minutes were read by Emerson. Voted to recommend DeSanders' rezoning request be denied because this does not conform to the land use plan and there was no information to justify the change. There was a discussion on the Fox Development and the land use plan. Voted to recommend approval of the request from Minarik for DE 441-A, 1 and 2 because this conforms to the land use plan. Adopted a resolution in-

dicating that the Township will pay 25% of the total cost for two crossing guards for Sheridan Road School. Adopted a resolution recommending the approval of the application from Eldon S. and Mary J. Bell for a new full year Class C license with dance permit.

The legal action on the sewer system was discussed. A letter will be written to the DPW and Bath Township regarding the resurfacing of the excess road into Walnut Estates. The necessary papers have been filed with the Court of Appeals on the 1974 factor. A committee was appointed to start working on a Water System Ordinance. An offer to purchase will be presented to the owners of the property that was approved at Annual meeting. The Building Needs Committee will meet to come up with a solution to the lack of space at the Township Hall. The Supervisor will check with Maurer and Parks about a ten or twelve inch well. The attorney was directed to look into what action has to be taken to get King Arthur's Court into the sewer system.

Search for plant materials to help save soil, water

Evaluation of new grasses, legumes, and woody plants which may have potential conservation value is a continual process in the Plant Materials Program. Recently the search for new and better plants has been broadening to include new emphasis on plants for stabilizing critical sediment source areas.

Because many kinds of plants - grasses, shrubs and trees - are needed to treat land to reduce soil erosion by wind and water, the Soil Conservation Service operates plant materials centers to develop plant materials for various conservation uses.

There are 20 plant materials centers in the nation. One of these, the Rose Lake Plant Materials Center, is located on the Rose Lake Wildlife Experiment Station near East Lansing.

To date, such plants as Emerald Crownvetch, 'Cardinal' autumn olive, and European black alder have moved into production and widespread conservation use. Others, such as 'Mackinaw' birdsfoot trefoil, 'Arnot' bristly locust, and 'Midwest' crabapple will soon be readily available for use in conservation programs.

Plant materials which appear promising for conservation uses are selected for evaluating in field plantings on lands of soil conservation district cooperators.

Field plantings, ranging from 150-200 in number are located throughout Michigan where problems occur and where final evaluation of fitness, use, and superiority of the plants can be made.

ORDINANCE NO. 269
AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT TRUCK TRAFFIC ON SCOTT ROAD, FROM THE SOUTH CITY LIMITS AT TOWNSEND ROAD TO MICHIGAN HIGHWAY M-21. THE CITY OF ST. JOHNS ORDAINS:

Section 1. That the City Commission of the City of St. Johns upon due application of interested residents, and upon the investigation of the St. Johns Police Department, and recommendations thereof, deem it advisable and in the interest of public safety, to prohibit truck traffic on Scott Road.

Section 2. The City Commission conclusively determines and ordains that truck traffic, except local deliveries, shall be prohibited on Scott Road between the South City Limits at Townsend Road and M-21, North and South.

Section 3. The City Commission further directs the installation of adequate signs, denoting the closing of Scott Road to truck traffic as herein set forth.

Section 4. This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days after its passage, or upon installation of the necessary signs, if said installation is subsequent to 20 days after passage of this ordinance.
