



2020 MEDICATION DISPOSAL PROGRAMS

Protect your family, pets, the community and the environment by properly disposing of unwanted or expired medications through one of the programs noted below. Do not put medications “down the drain” or in the trash. They can end up in surface waters and negatively impact local ecosystems. The preferred disposal option is through special events which ensure safe disposal through incineration.

Saturday February 8th from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Community Center of the St. Jude Catholic Parish at 801 North Bridge Street in DeWitt. *Be sure to black out personal information but leave the drug name visible!*

Saturday March 7th from 10:00am to 2:00pm at the Bath Township Senior Center at 14480 Webster Road in Bath. *Be sure to black out personal information but leave the drug name visible!*

Saturday September 26th from 9:00am to 12:00pm at the Clinton Community Health Fair at Agro-Culture Liquid Fertilizer at 3055 M-21 in St Johns. *Be sure to black out personal information but leave the drug name visible!*

Saturday October 3rd from 8:00am to 1:00pm - at the Free for Fall Event – at the Granger Facility, driveway #5, located at 16980 Wood Road in Lansing. *Be sure to black out personal information but leave the drug name visible!*

Controlled medications may be dropped off at the Sheriff’s Office, Bath Township Police Office, DeWitt Charter Township Hall & St Johns Police Department, year round, during regular business hours. YEAR ROUND CONTROLLED MEDICATION COLLECTION

Help protect Michigan's water supply and avoid medications falling into the wrong hands – do not flush or pour your expired or unused medications down the drain!

Bring your expired, unused liquid, tablet or capsule controlled drugs to the Sheriff's Office, Bath Charter Township Police Department, Dewitt Charter Township Hall or the City of St Johns Police Department for proper disposal.

- ✓ Controlled substances only (Not sure? Ask your pharmacist.)
- ✓ NO inhalers, patches or injectables (sharps)
- ✓ NO empty containers
- ✓ NO leaking liquids
- ✓ ACCEPTABLE: tablets, liquids or capsules must be brought in their original bottle (please black out personal information) and placed into the secure collection bin.
